Barisal City Corporation (BCC) Mayor Advocate Shawkat Hossain Hiron inaugurated the programme.


Barisal city will get a photo and art gallery soon, assured the mayor in his speech, while thanking the organiser for arranging the



Liberation War Museum has arranged a weeklong programme at its premises in Shegunbagicha, Dhaka to celebrate the 40th anniversary of Independence. The weeklong programme began on March 22 and will continue till tomorrow. On March 25, the programme featured a discussion, recitation and rendition of songs.

Cultural personality and trustee of the museum, Sara Zaker, gave the welcome speech at the programme. The discussion featured opinions of young individuals on genocide and trial of war criminals. Gazi Sangeeta Farzana, a student of law, Dhaka University and Sayeed Masud Reza, Assistant Professor, Department of Law, Stamford University spoke on the topic.
