the government and Prof Yunus has severely disgraced dignity and sovereignty of Bangladesh, said the statement where 58 personalities signed. The statement is beyond diplomatic norms, it added. Different opinions and debates are present among vari-

ous quarters in society regarding steps taken by the government and Grameen Bank to resolve the issue. "Different internal efforts are active to resolve the crisis," the statement

The signatories think it is a moral responsibility of any self-dignified Bangladeshi to protest such attack on the dignity of Bangladesh and opined that Dr Yunus should also protest Blake's comment.

It is very important for the concerned political forces, in the interest of the country's independence and sovereignty, to come out from the culture of maintaining a submissive relation with a foreign force, it added.

HC asks SC register for pending case list

The High Court yesterday directed the Supreme Court registrar to submit a list of its pending criminal cases, for which paper books are yet to be prepared for hearing appeals, to it within eight weeks.

A paper book, which contains all relevant documents and information of a case including its first information report, charge sheet, statements of witnesses, and judgement of trial court, is necessary for the HC to hear and dispose of appeal against the trial court verdict on it.

In response to a writ petition, the HC also issued a rule upon the authorities to explain within four weeks why they should not be directed to set up a separate printing press to prepare the paper books of its pending criminal cases for ensuring justice by their quick dispos-

The HC bench of Justice Mohammad Anwarul Haque and Justice Akram Hossain Manju issued the rule following the petition filed as public interest litigation by Human Rights and Peace for Bangladesh.

The organisation yesterday filed the petition seeking directives from the HC on the authorities to set up a separate printing press for printing all the documents of SC including the paper books of criminal cases.

Petitioner's counsel Manzill Murshid told The Daily Star that since the SC authorities now prepare the paper books by the Bangladesh Government Press, they have to take much time for this job, and therefore delays take place in disposing the cases and justice in hampered.

Secretaries to the ministries of law, justice and parliamentary affairs, establishment, and finance, SC registrar and director general and controller of BG Press were made respondents to the rule.

Child drowns in bucket of water at Khilgaon

A two and a half year old child drowned in a bucket of water at his Khilgaon residence in the city yesterday.

The child Mitul Hossain Zisan was rushed to a local clinic and then shifted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where doctors declared him dead around 3:00pm.

His mother Mukti Begum, resident of Bhuiya Para of Goran, said she filled a bucket of water in the bathroom to wash clothes and went to prepare food in the kitchen.

"I last saw Zisan playing in our bedroom before getting busy with cooking but could not find him after I finished," she said, adding that soon she found Zishan's body

upside down in the bucket. Zishan's father Delwar Hossain, owner of a tailor shop at Goran Bazar, was not present in the house, she added.
