## JS special body readies proposal

#### Constitution amendment move hailed

The parliamentary special committee on constitution amendment yesterday agreed to propose limiting the caretaker government's tenure to a maximum of 90 days.

The committee at a meeting at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban discussed in detail the caretaker government system, and felt that it should not continue for an indefinite period.

But it did not want to take any stance against the caretaker system in view of the current political situation, several members of the House body told journalists later.

In its report to be placed in parliament, the committee however might recommend that the system should not continue after two or three more parliamentary elections. It will however not recommend any constitutional amendment in this regard.

"The provisions of the caretaker government system will remain as they are, except that concerning its tenure. We will

## Japan on 'maximum alert'

Radioactive water halts repair work at Fukushima plant; plutonium found in soil sample

AFP, Sendai

Japan said yesterday it is on "maximum alert" over a crippled nuclear plant where highly radioactive water has halted repair work and plutonium has been found in the soil.

The earthquake and tsunami that ravaged Japan's northeast coast and left about 28,000 dead or missing also knocked out reactor cooling systems at the Fukushima plant, which has leaked radiation into the air and sea.

Prime Minister Naoto Kan conceded the situation at the coastal atomic power station remained "unpredictable" and pledged his government would "tackle the problem while in a state of maximum alert".

In a stop-gap measure to contain the crisis at the plant, crews have poured thousands of tons of water onto reactors where fuel rods are thought to have partially melted, and topped up pools for spent fuel rods.

#### DMP now denies making roads offlimits


