

The parliamentary special committee on constitutional amendment has agreed in principle to limit the president's power to declare a state of emergency and promulgate ordinances under caretaker governments.

osition for making it mandatory for the president to reconvene a just dissolved parliament and take its consent for declaring a state of emergency under an interim regime.


