Bahrain FM calls on PM

UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina discussed the issues of human resources export and employment of Bangladeshis in Bahrain with Bahrain's Foreign Minister Shaikh Khaled Bin Ahmed Bin Mohamed Al Khalifa at her office yesterday.

Bilateral issues including trade and commerce between the two countries were also discussed as Shaikh Khaled paid a courtesy call on the PM. Some 140,000 Bangladeshis are now employed in Bahrain.

BNP to resist 'controversial' acts: Moudud

BNP leader Moudud Ahmed yesterday warned that they will resist any government bid to do anything controversial in the name of constitution amendment to serve the ruling Awami League's interest.

The country has no constitution now, as nobody knows under which constitution it now runs, said the BNP standing committee member and former law minister.

Moudud was speaking at a memorial meeting in the city to mark the 4th death anniversary of former BNP secretary general KM Obaidur Rahman.

Standing committee member of the party Nazrul Islam Khan and Vice Chairman Shah Moazzem Hossain also spoke at the meeting organised by Obaidur Rahman Smriti Parishad. TM Giasuddin was in the chair.

Meanwhile, BNP Senior Joint Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir yesterday alleged that the present government has so far killed about 5,000 opposition political activists.

He made the allegation at a discussion in the city in observance of the Independence Day, organised by Jatiyatabadi Krishak Dal.

ECO-friendly brick kilns to come

The government, under a five-year project, aims to introduce a new technology in the country's brick making industry to reduce environmental pollution and make energy consumption efficient.

Speakers said this at the project's inception workshop organised by the project's sponsor UNDP Bangladesh at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in the city yesterday.

The project aims at replacing the 150-year-old energy-intensive conventional brick with an energy-efficient and smokeless technology named Hybrid-Hoffman Kiln.

Styled by Improving Kiln Efficiency in the Brick Making Industry (IKEBMI), the \$ 3 million project will be a climate change mitigation step in Bangladesh to prevent emission of greenhouse gases, deforestation and land degradation caused by the traditional brick fields, said Stefan Priesner, UNDP Bangladesh resident representative.

IKEBMI Project Manager Khondoker Neaz Rahman said nearly 5,000 conventional fixedchimney brick kilns across the country emit an estimated 6.4 million tonnes of Carbon Dioxide annually. "Firewood constitutes one-third of the total fuel consumed in the industry, significantly causing deforestation and land degradation," he said.

22 Bangladeshis in The two-day polling of Supreme Court Bar Libyan jail freed DIPLOMATIC CORRESPONDENT

Twenty-two Bangladeshi nationals, detained in Twaisha Jail a Libyan detention centre, entered a Tunisian camp after their release yesterday, said a foreign ministry press release.

This is the first time Bangladeshi detainees were freed since deadly fighting began in the North African country. There is no official figure about the number of Bangladeshis still in detention camps in Libya.

The press release further said some 131 Bangladeshi nationals, including two families with their children, crossed over to Tunisia on March 30.

Around 801 Bangladeshi nationals are currently awaiting repatriation at Ras Jdir border point of Tunisia.

In order to repatriate the new arrivals, the foreign ministry said the Bangladesh government in coordination with International Organization for Migration (IOM) in taking necessary measures. Bangladesh Biman is providing extra flights to bring them back.

Meanwhile there was zero inflow of Bangladeshi nationals at Al Salloum border point in Egypt yesterday. The foreign ministry's consular team was asked to stay put at this point to facilitate repatriation arrangements of any Bangladeshi national crossing over into Egypt.

One Bangladeshi national still remains missing in Hania of Crete in Greece.

Building code to be enforced strictly

Says minister

The government will bring all the new buildings across the country under Bangladesh National Building Code (BNBC) to minimise the fatalities of earthquake.

"We will take required steps so that the authorities strictly follow the building code both in urban and rural areas", said Food and Disaster Management Minister Abdur Razzaque.

"It will reduce the causalities of natural disaster especially earthquake," he said while addressing as the chief guest a seminar at Osmani Memorial Auditorium in the city.

Titled "Disaster preparation at every house saves lives and livelihood," it was organised by Disaster Management Bureau (DMB) to mark the National Disaster Preparation Day 2011. Razzaque said his ministry has already identified the

city's 70,000 buildings that need to be retrofitted to make those structures tolerant to moderate earthquakes. He stressed the need for initiating pre-calamity prepara-

tion to minimise the causalities of natural havoc that constantly hits the country. The minister also announced to construct more cyclone

centres across the country.

About price hike of rice, he said, "I cannot avoid my responsibility of this failure. But the country people did not face Monga during my term of office." On the government's disaster mitigation steps, he said the

ministry has trained 62,000 volunteers and provided them with equipment of Tk70 crore to minimise the causalities.

University Grants Commission (UGC) Chairman Prof Nazrul Islam presented the keynote paper. Disaster Management and Relief Division (DMRD) Acting

Secretary M Aslam Alam chaired the seminar addressed by National Disaster Management Advisory Committee Chairman MA Kashem, among others. Covers of two books titled "Standing Orders on Disasters'

and "National Plan for Disaster Management 2010-2015' were unveiled in the function.

The minister also distributed award among the winners of children art competition on natural disaster.

adjourned the trial proceeding till 9:00am of April 11. A total of 73 people including 57 army officers were killed during the mutiny at the BDR headquarters on February 25-26 in 2009.

CG system

Says Jurist Mahmudul STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Eminent Jurist Mahmudul Islam yesterday told the Supreme Court (SC) that martial law would be imposed in the country due to existing situation and mentality of politicians if the caretaker government system is cancelled.

The system was introduced for the interest of democracy and holding free and fair elections, he said.

Mahmudul was placing submission as amicus curiae (friend of court) during hearing of an appeal filed against a High Court verdict that declared valid the 13th amendment to the constitution allowing elections under the caretaker government.

A seven-member bench of the Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice ABM Khairul Haque held the hearing for 7th day and will resume on April 3. Mahmudul said republi-

can character of the state was not damaged due to the 13th amendment.

Elected representatives do not run the country during the caretaker regime in the interest of democracy and free and fair elections, he said.

Documentary on Yunus to be screened in US

Martial law to be imposed 1,432 Bangladeshi in absence of peacekeepers honoured

The United Nations has honoured 1,432 Bangladeshi peacekeepers for their dedicated service to peace in Liberia.

Top UN envoy in Liberia, Ellen Margrethe Loj hailed the outstanding role of Bangladeshi peacekeepers who are courageously playing role in dealing with the security and humanitarian challenges arising from the deteriorating political situation in Ivory Coast.

The soldiers from Bangladesh have risen to every challenge they have faced since arriving in Liberia, the UN envoy said while honouring the peacekeepers with medals at a function in Liberia's central city of Gbarnga.

"Bangladeshi soldiers are assisting Liberian authorities in managing border security and dealing with the influx of Ivorian refugees," she pointed out, noting that the peacekeepers from Bangladesh have, since the political deadlock in Ivory Coast, increased their patrols along the Liberia-Ivory Coast border, in addition to taking on extra tasks aimed at addressing the needs of the refugees.

Highlighting the humanitarian spirit of the Bangladeshi peacekeepers, the SRSG described the Bangladeshi as "very accommodating and not known to turn down any request," saying they have brought a "truly human face to peacekeeping."

The Bangladeshi Peacekeepers have undertaken a wide range of humanitarian activities including the introduction of new technologies to local farmers, equipping young people with vocational skills, and rehabilitating roads and
