

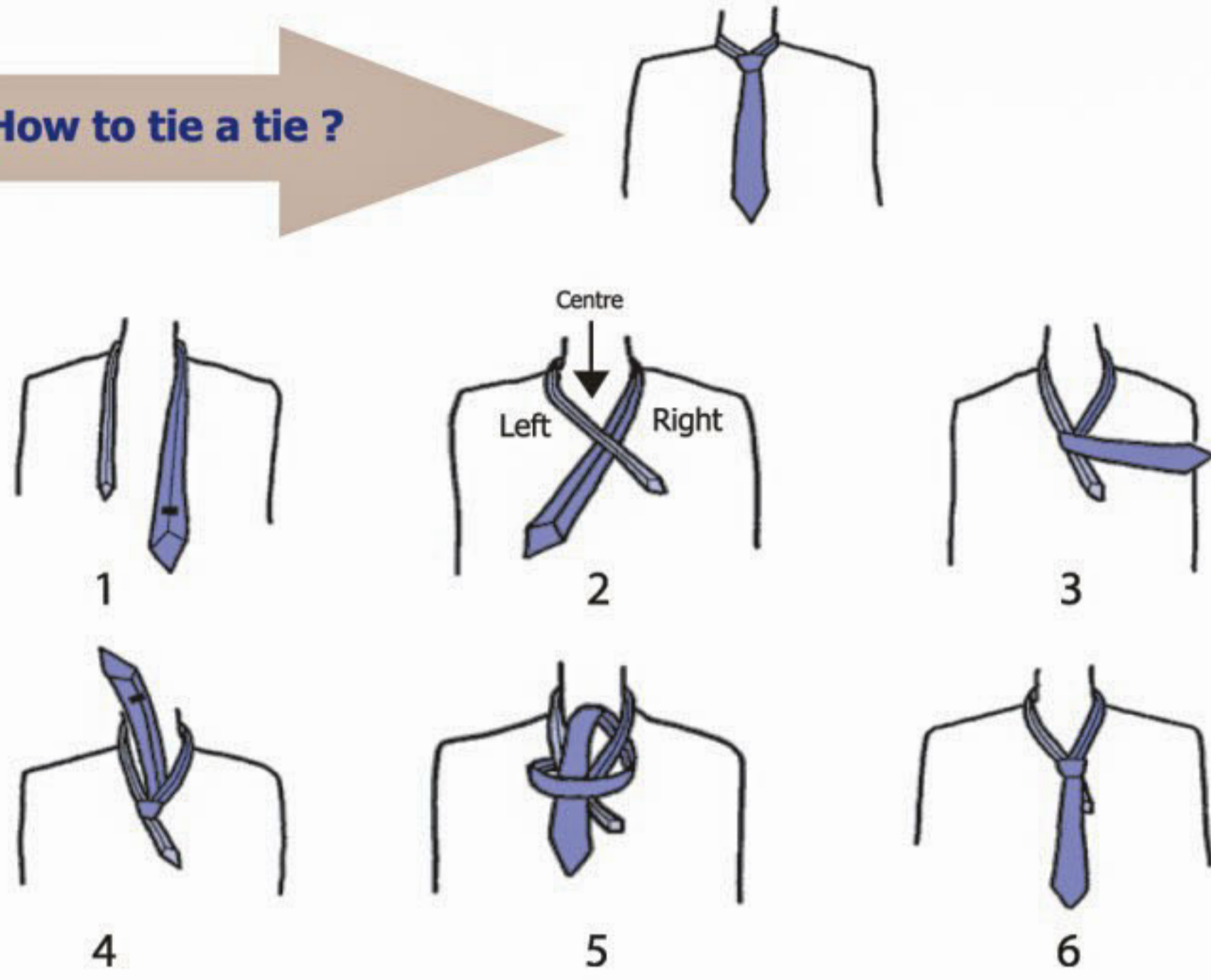

Giving instructions!

Dear Learners, here are some examples on how we can practice giving instructions.

A. How to tie a tie?



1. At the beginning, put the wide end of the tie on your right shoulder and the narrow end on your left. Note that the tie should be inside out.
2. Cross the narrow end over the wide end. Now three parts are formed (**Left, Right and Centre**).
3. Bring the wide end over the narrow end from the Left part to the Right part.
4. Bring the wide end under the narrow end of the tie to the Centre part.
5. Bring the wide end down and pass the loop in front. Ensure that the knot is tightened.
6. Use one hand to pull the narrow end down gently and use the other hand to move the knot up until it reaches the centre of the collar.

B. Here is a recipe. Notice how the instructions are given.

Spicy Tomato Chutney

Method of preparation:

- Wash and chop tomatoes.
- Remove stem, wash and roughly chop green chillies.
- Peel and roughly chop the garlic.
- Grind coriander seeds, cumin seeds and turmeric into fine paste using a stone grinder.

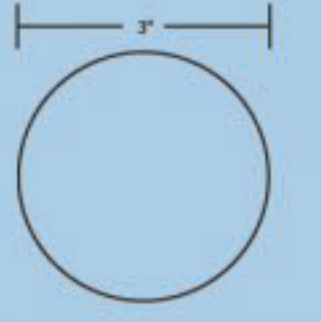


- Heat oil in a pan on low flame, add ground spices and fry for few minutes.
- When spices are aromatic and thoroughly fried, stir in chopped tomato, turmeric powder and salt.
- Cook covered till tomato is very soft.
- Uncover and cook till tomato chutney reaches the desired consistency.
- Serve the spicy tomato chutney.

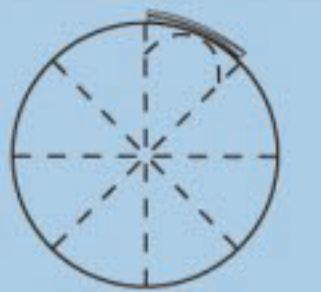

C. How can we make a paper flower?

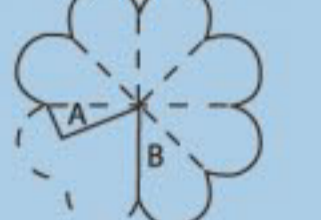
Fold the circle of paper in half, then again into quarters and one final time, into eighths. Firmly press all creases to ensure they are sharp and straight.



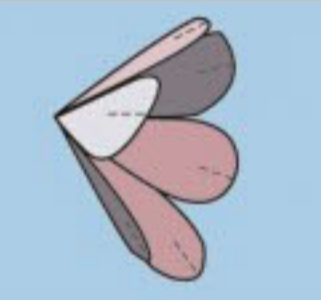
Fold into a tight hold. Trim the edges as indicated by the dotted lines in the illustration. Unfold the paper circle and lay it flat.



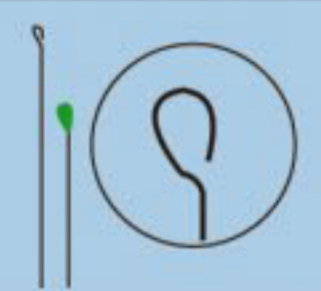
Use a scissor, trim as indicated, being careful to leave a small flap (A). Glue A to B using paper glue. Hold until dry.



Once the glue has dried, re-bend all of the creases and pinch the tips of the petals as indicated by the dotted lines. It will add shape and texture to the blossom.



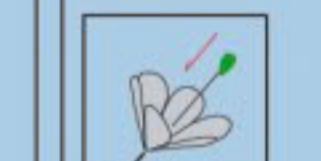
Take a piece of floral wire 10-16" long and make a needle-nose plier. Now form a small loop (approx. 1/4") in one end as indicated in the picture.



Wrap the loop with a small length of green floral tape to form the pistil of the flower.



Gently thread the wire through the centre of a completed paper blossom.



D. Column A contains six instructions, column B has a list of objects and places where we may find them. Match column A and B.

Column A

1. Put the marker upside down when color is light.
2. Only wash in 40° C soapy water.
3. Use block letters only.
4. Handle with care.
5. Collect your pass at the entrance.
6. Make sure that you are well familiar with the possible side effects before beginning to use it.

- f. On fragile/ breakable objects

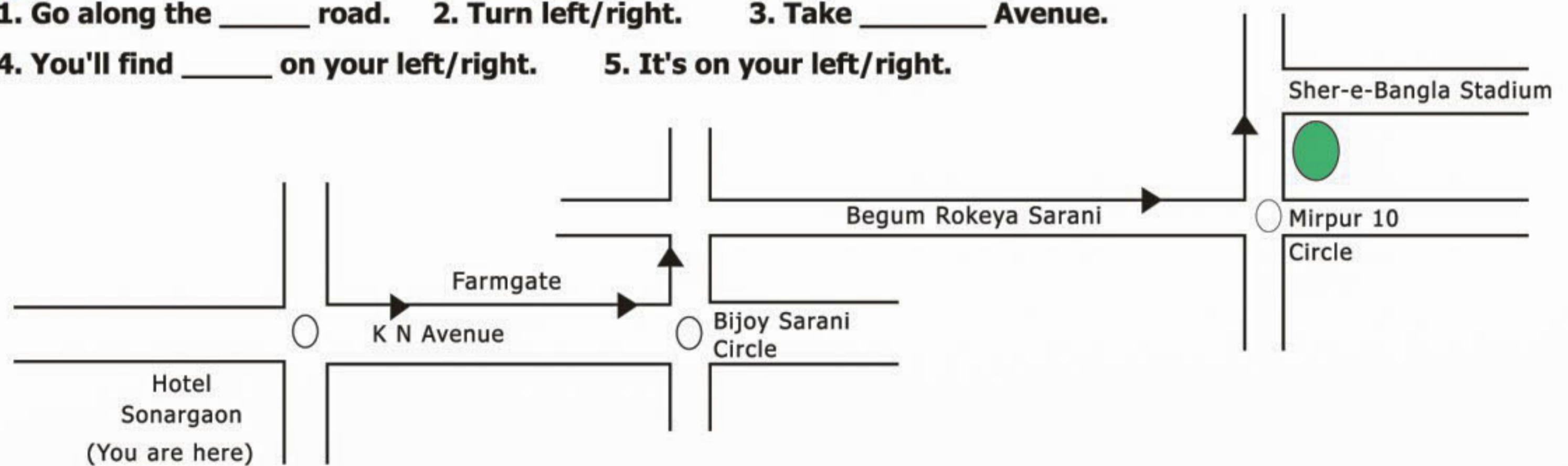
E. Super hints

- Clean your windows with wet newspaper if you want them really shining.
- Brush your teeth occasionally with salt to keep them bright.
- To test if an egg is fresh, submerge it in a bowl of water. If the egg floats, it is rotten.
- To get rid of itch from mosquito bite, apply soap to the area.
- Potatoes will take food stains off your fingers. Just slice and rub raw potato on the stains and rinse with water.
- Don't panic if your curry is too salty. Cut raw potatoes and put them in the curry. Once they are cooked and have absorbed the salt, your curry is saved.

- Crease : An untidy fold/ line that is made in cloth or paper.
- Trim : To make something neater, smaller.
- Flap : Flat piece of paper, cloth.
- Submerge : To go under the surface of water.
- Loop : Ring, round.
- Stain : Dirty marks on something.
- Rinse : To wash something with clean water only, not using soap.
