# Rainfall rise brings relief

Irrigation gets more electricity

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

A rise in rainfall has given the farmers a respite from their dependence on electricity and diesel-based irrigation, allowing people to get more power supply.

The level of load-shedding dropped to 500 megawatt early last week from more than 1,200 MW in early and mid-March, according to Power Development Board (PDB).

This was possible because of an increase in power generation and a decrease in demand, thanks to the rise in rainfall last month.

The monthly average-actual rainfall rose to 44.3 millimetres in March this year from 24.4 millimetres of the same month last year due to sporadic nor'westers and thunder-showers in different parts of the country, according to Bangladesh Meteorological Department (BMD) statistics.

However, the amount of monsoon rain was 17 percent below the expected normal average rainfall last month.
