65-yr retirement age for varsity teachers hailed

Vice chancellors of different universities expressed their gratitude to Prime Minister (PM) Sheikh Hasina following her announcement to extend retirement age of teachers at all public universities to 65 years.

The Association of Universities of Bangladesh yesterday congratulated the PM during a meeting at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU) with Prof Pran Gopal Datta, vice chancellor (VC) of BSMMU, in the chair.

University of Dhaka VC Prof AAMS Arefin Siddiqui; Shahjalal University of Science and Technology VC Prof Dr Mohammad Saleh Uddin; Jagannath University VC Prof Dr Mesbahuddin Ahmed; Khulna University of Engineering and Technology VC Prof Dr Muhammad Alamgir; Jessore Science and Technology University Prof Dr Abdus Sattar; and Bangladesh Textile University Prof Dr Nitai Chandra Shutrathdar were also present.

Prof Dr Mohammad Abdul Mannan Akand, VC of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Agricultural University, also thanked the PM.

The PM on Sunday announced that the retirement age of 65 would be applicable for teachers of all 34 public universities of the country.

CU trees being cut down

Chittagong University (CU) began cutting down trees in Shah Amanat Park adjacent to CU Shah Amanat Hall yesterday alleging that the trees are “hampering necessary ventilation” of the hall and blocking sunlight.

Campus sources said CU authority called an auction on March 31 to sell ten tamarisk trees adjacent to the hall.

One local Hazi Ismail bought these trees worth of Tk 167,000 and began to cut them down, they said.

A few students expressed anger over the matter saying that the park’s beauty would be greatly hampered.

Teachers continue fast unto death for MPO

A group of teachers who were not awarded monthly pay order (MPO) facility continued their fast unto death for the second day yesterday in front of Jatiya Press Club in the city, pressing their demand for the facility.

Some 200 teachers of non-government schools, colleges and madrasas gathered in front of Directorate of Secondary and Higher Education (DSHE) and began the programme on Sunday.

Later, they were forced to move and gathered in front of Jatiya Press Club, they said.

They alleged that around 1,500 teachers have been left out after the government entitled 1,612 non-government educational institutions the facility last year.

Blood-stained body of girl found in hotel

Dakkhin Khan Police broke into a room of a residential hotel at Ashkhona and recovered the blood-stained body of an eight-year-old girl from inside it yesterday.

Police said, they recovered the body of the unidentified girl after the authorities of Setu Residential Hotel informed that the room was locked from inside.

Police broke open the lock of the room and found the body of the girl lying on the bed. They sent the body to Dhaka Medical College morgue for autopsy.

Police said the hotel authorities told them that around 11:00pm on Sunday, a youth gave his name in the hotel register as Raihan and the girl's name as Rumi. The youth told the hotel authorities that they were siblings and they came from Sunamganj.

The youth said they came to a relative at Dakkhin Khan but he lost the address of the house and was taking accommodation in the hotel.

Sometime during the day yesterday, the youth left the room. The hotel staff looking through the window of the room saw that the body of the girl was lying on the bed and they informed police of the matter, police said.

BORDER KILLINGS

PM asks for stronger dialogue with India

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked the foreign and home ministries as well as Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) to raise the border killing issue with India more strongly.

"The government should deal with the issue more strongly to stop the border killings," a cabinet minister quoted the prime minister as telling her colleagues at the weekly cabinet meeting held at the Secretariat.

LGRD Minister Syed Ashrafur Islam brought the border killing issue to discussion when Foreign Minister Dipu Moni placed a report on the participation of the Bangladeshi delegation in the 33rd Saarc Council of Ministers.

Hasina asked the foreign minister and State Minister for Home Shamsul Hoque Tuku to take necessary steps so that both Bangladesh and Indian governments take sincere effort to stop the

border killings.

The prime minister directed them so that the matter comes up prominently in the discussion during the upcoming visit of Indian prime minister to Bangladesh.

Innocent and unarmed Bangladeshi citizens are being killed in indiscriminate firings and also in torture by Border Security Forces (BSF) of India on the borders regularly.

The BSF allegedly killed 907 unarmed Bangladeshis between 1 January 2000 and 31 March 2011, Odhikar, a human rights body based in Dhaka, says in its latest report.

Bangladesh has long been asking India to stop firings at unarmed Bangladeshis by BSF. India also gave commitments repeatedly to stop border killings in different meetings, including the home secretary meetings and conferences of director generals

RID PHARMA CASE

Plea to place proofs before court

Special Public Prosecutor Mahmud Hossain Jahangir yesterday appealed to the court for directing the complainant to produce before it on May 15 the evidence seized in connection with the Rid Pharma case.

The case was filed against managing director of Rid Pharmaceuticals Ltd and four other officials on charges of adulterating paracetamol syrup that caused deaths of 28 children in 2009.

In yesterday's petition, Jahangir said the drug administration, during the occurrence of incidents, seized alamsats from Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Shishu Hospital and several other places, which are very essential for proving the charges brought against the accused.

Judge Mohammad Abdul Majid of the Drug Court granted the prosecution petition directing Mohammad Shafiqul Islam, drug superintendent, to produce all the alamsats seized from different places on the scheduled date.

Rid Pharma managing director Mizanur Rahman and his wife Sheuly Rahman, one of the directors of the company, who were earlier granted bails from different courts, were present during yesterday's hearing.

The three other accused -- Abdul Gani, another director of the company, and two pharmacists Mahbulul Islam and Enamul Haque -- are absconding.

Earlier on March 9, the same court framed charges against the five accused for manufacturing adulterated syrup.

On August 10 of 2009, Shafiqul Islam filed the case accusing the five of the company for using toxic diethylene glycol in manufacturing paracetamol syrup that caused deaths of 28 children the same year.

4 die in Ctg road crashes

2 buses torched in protest

Four people, including two garment employees, were killed and eight others injured in two road accidents here yesterday.

Witnesses said a speeding bus carrying workers of Golden Height Garment of Sun Men Group ploughed into a company of garment workers at old Sonali Bank intersection around 8:00am, leaving two of them dead on the spot and five others injured.

The dead are Shilpi Barua, 22, of Desh Garments Limited and Shibu Das, 35, a sweeper of Azim Group. The injured persons were rushed to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH).

Incensed, garment workers set two buses ablaze, including the one that caused the accident and damaged a fire fighting vehicle which reached the scene to extinguish fire.

Law enforcers later brought the situation under control.

In another accident, Two people were killed and three other injured as a bus hit a CNG-run three-wheeler at Banigram of Banshkhal upazila yesterday.

Akkas Uddin, 45, of Razakhal in Chakaria upazila and his six-year-old daughter Laki Sultana died instantly.

Bangladeshi youth killed in London

A gang of assailants stabbed to death a Bangladeshi youth in East London on Friday late night, according to a delayed report received here yesterday.

London Metropolitan Police arrested two suspected assailants but their identity could not be ascertained.

The deceased was identified as Kawser Hussain, 24, an employee of Dockland at east London and son of Azizur Rahman of Chandarpur village of Beanibazar upazila of Sylhet district.

He used to live along with his wife at Chowly Street in east London.

Friends and family sources said Kawser, along with his wife was going to his elder sister's house by a car at 11:00pm on Friday.

He got down from the car and walked towards his elder sister's house, leaving behind his wife in the vehicle.

All on a sudden, a gang of white youths attacked him with sharp weapons and stabbed him indiscriminately, leaving him dead on the spot. His awe-stricken wife, who watched the murder from the car, raised a hue and cry but nobody came to her husband's rescue.

Assault on devotees of Lalon protested

Two organisations yesterday strongly protested and condemned the attack on 28 devotees of mystic legend Lalon and forced shaving of their long hair and moustaches at Char Ramnagar in Pangsha upazila, Rajbari on April 5.

Bangladesh Sangeet Sangathan Somonnoy Porishad and Karmojibi Nari in separate statements also demanded immediate arrest and punishment to the people responsible for the offence.

Karmojibi Nari president Shirin Akhter and general secretary Sharmin Kabir in a joint statement said Lalon songs are a powerful element of Bangalee culture and forcibly shaving off long hair and moustaches of Lalon's devotees is a real threat from fundamentalists.

The fundamentalists in a planned way made similar attacks on Lalon devotees several times in the past, said Biswajit Roy, general secretary of Bangladesh Sangeet Sangathan Somonnoy Parishad.

He expressed solidarity to the activists of the cultural movement of Pangsha and demanded quick arrest of people who harassed the Lalon devotees.

NEGLIGENCE OF DUTY

Wasa Eng suspended
