members in connection with the shooting.

Sources said the three-member probe team from Dhaka led by Mezbahuddin, additional director general (Director Training) of Rab, recorded statements of 11 witnesses, including the victim's mother, brother and uncle.

Contacted, the SP yesterday said as far as he knows the case is yet to be recorded.

Sub-inspector Halim, now the acting OC of Rajapur Police Station, said the case will be recorded when the OC retires.

Meanwhile on Monday, police went to the spot and recorded statement of witnesses investigating the two cases filed by Rab against Limon.

Khalilur Rahman, Barisal district coordinator of Bangladesh Legal Aid Services Trust, said if the acting OC does not compile with the court order he [acting OC] would be

liable for contempt of court.

The superintendent of police (SP) in Jhalakathi Md Shamsuddin and the officer-in-charge (OC) of Rajapur Police Station Tofazzel Hossain, however, went on leave from yesterday.

Contacted, the SP yesterday said as far as he knows the case is yet to be recorded.

Meanwhile, in a press briefing at the home ministry yesterday, State Minister for Shamsul Haque Tuku said five probe bodies are working on the shooting incident. They are Rab headquarters, Jhalakathi Rab, a magistrate and two investigators.

Asked about formation of a probe committee by the home ministry, he reiterated that the ministry would form the committee if necessary. He urged reporters to visit the spot and find out what actually happened.

He however declined to comment further in this

regard.

On March 23, Limon was shot in the left leg allegedly by Rab personnel while he was bringing cattle home around 4:30pm. On March 27, his leg was amputated from the thigh due to tissue damage caused by excessive bleeding and delay in treatment.

In the night of the shooting, Rab issued a press release saying a team of Rab-8 went to Chittaur to arrest convicted criminal Morshed. Limon was one of Morshed's cohorts and the Rab personnel found him wounded. They also recovered some firearms, ammunition and sharp weapons from him, claimed the press release.

DG Rab Muklesur Rahman on Monday said Limon was accidentally hit by a bullet during a shootout between Rab and criminals. Limon is not a criminal, the DG added.

**Carbon trading can bring \$80m to Bangladesh**

Bangladesh can earn US\$ 80 million annually through selling carbon as carbon credit in the international market by using modern technology in brickfields surrounding Dhaka city, said a World Bank official.

Carbon Finance Coordinator of the World Bank, South Asia Region Michel JL Pommier informed it to Industries Minister Dilip Barua during a meeting at Shilpabhaban in the city yesterday. Former secretary and environmental consultant Syed Tanvir Hossain was also present.

If the opportunity of carbon trading can be spread throughout the country, Bangladesh can earn huge carbon credit. The total carbon emission from the brickfields in Dhaka is 8 million ton.

Issues related to environmental pollution by the brickfields, shifting the brickfields to environment-friendly place, utilisation of modern technology, reducing carbon emission and World Bank's support in carbon trading were discussed in the meeting.

The prosecutor said accused No. 31 and former BNP lawmaker Nasiruddin Ahmed Pinto encouraged the mutineers to attend the February 24 secret meeting.

Speaking after the match, Bangladesh batsman Shahriar Nafees said that the Tigers would have to forget about Watson's innings as it was a once-in-a-lifetime effort. Changes to the team are likely, with batsman Rokibul Hasan possibly having to make way for allrounder Alok Kapali. "Assistance from such a leading personality encouraged the accused a lot to commit the crimes," Kajol told the court and appealed to frame charges against Pinto under different sections including sections 303 and 109 of the Penal Code.

"Political leaders often organise processions. Does it fall under sections 303 and 109 of the Penal Code?" the court asked the prosecutor. The prosecutor was also asked whether the accused made a statement under section 164 of the Criminal

Procedure Code.

Judge Mohammad Zohurul Haque asked Towhid whether he heard the charges against him. Towhid claimed to be innocent and said the charges against him are false.

Earlier, Kajol said DAD Towhid led the mutiny, looting of arms and ammunition from the armoury, and attacks on army officers deputed to the then BDR that led to deaths of 74 people including 57 officers.

Towhid was also charged with leading the dumping of the bodies of officers and a team of mutineers to the official residence of the prime minister and hotel Ambala for negotiations.

The prosecutor told the court Towhid himself directed some mutineers to kill major Asad. He also declared himself as the director general of BDR and under his leadership the mutineers broke into the officers' residences to loot valuables.

Kajol said Towhid has made a confessional statement and there are enough pieces of evidence against him.

Judge Mohammad Zohurul Haque asked Towhid whether he heard the charges against him. Towhid claimed to be innocent and said the charges against him are false.

Some defence lawyers appealed to the court to record the statement of the accused after they submitted their arguments on the charges and the court agreed to it.

The prosecutor also told the court former BDR member Torab Ali knew about the conspiracy of the carnage a day before the mutiny but did not warn the authorities about it.

As the court asked him whether there is any service rule that a former member has to inform the authorities about such information, the prosecutor said it was his responsibility as a human being.

As many as 827 accused including 23 civilians were hauled before the court yesterday. Of the total 850 accused, two are dead and 21 have been absconding.
