

20 mutineers sentenced to jail in C'nawabganj

Twenty jawans of 39 Battalion of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) were yesterday sentenced to prison terms ranging from six months to six years for their involvement in the February 2009 mutiny at the battalion headquarters in Chapainawabganj.

The special court-12 headed by Rajshahi Sector Commander Col Ehia Azam Khan also fined the convicts Tk 100 each. Two other members of the court are Lt Col Khalid Hossain and Lt Commander (BN) Touhidul Islam.

The court acquitted a jawan as charges brought against him could not

be proved.

Of the mutineers, two were jailed for six years, four for three years, two for two years and six months, two for two years, five for one year and six months, two for one year and one was jailed for five years, one for four years, and the other for six months.

During the trial, six of the 21 jawans confessed to their involvement in the mutiny at the battalion headquarters on February 26, 2009 and begged for mercy while the rest claimed innocence.

Ahsanul Haque, the then officer-in-charge (OC) of Sadar Police Station, filed a mutiny case with the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court against 21

jawans on May 18, 2009.

Following the case, the accused were arrested and produced in the court that sent them to jail.

In the case statement, the complainant alleged that the jawans took control of the battalion, expressing solidarity with the mutineers of BGB headquarters at Pilkhana in the capital.

They revolted against their officers, looted firearms and ammunition from armoury and fired blank shots.

The special court framed charges against the rebels on March 20 and completed recording depositions of 25 prosecution witnesses in the case on March 22.

ILLEGAL CONSTRUCTION AT MAHASTHANGARH Mazar committee men besiege law enforcers

A police team was surrounded by the supporters of Shariful Islam Jinnah, a member of Mahasthangarh Mazar Development Committee, when the law enforcers went there on Monday to stop construction of structures at the reserved archaeological site in violation of a recent High Court order.

Receiving information

that Abdul Hannan, an inhabitant of Mahasthangarh reserved area, has started construction of structures on a land at the site, Shibganj police led by Officer-in-Charge Abu Mokaddem Ali set out for the area at noon.

When they reached there, Jinnah's supporters, including Hannan, surrounded the policemen and kept them confined to the area for one and a half hours.

They released the policemen at the instruction of Jinnah at around 1:30pm.

Admitting to the incident, Jinnah said some locals were constructing structures on the land as it belongs to them.

Locals have already constructed several structures on some lands in the reserved area, claiming those as their own.

A general diary (GD) was lodged with Shibganj Police Station.

3 commit 'suicide' in Satkhira

Three people including a newly married youth and a teenage boy allegedly committed suicide in the district yesterday morning and the previous night.

The victims were identified as Haren Kumar Mondal, 26, son of Arun Kumar Mondal of Khalia village in Assassuni upazila, Parul Akhtar, 24, wife of Abu Taher of Rambhadrapur village and Nazmul Hossain, 14, son of Nazrul Islam of Sultanpur village in Kalaroa upazila.

Quoting local people police said, Haren Kumar Mondal who got married about three months ago took poison in a bush near his house at about 10:00 am yesterday and died on the spot. Family feud is the cause of his suicide, police said.

Following a family feud, Parul Akhtar took poison at her house at about 8:00 pm on Monday.

She was rushed to Satkhira Sadar Hospital where she died after sometime.

In the other incident, Nazmul Hossain had been demanding a mobile phone from his father.

As his father refused to meet his demand, Nazmul took poison at about 09:30 pm on Monday.

Local people took him to a local clinic where he died.

Debendra Nath Roy, 68, who came from Baro Nachina village under Dinhat PS of Cooch Behar district of West Bengal in India said, a large number of devotees came from India to celebrate the historical fair.

"We have been attending the fair for the last twenty years. We feel great after bathing in the water of Sindurmoti pond," said one of them.

Besides Hindus, Muslims of the region also come to the fair for enjoying the festival. They exchange greetings with their neighbours and purchase different items from the fair.

Shariful Islam, 40, said, "We come to the fair because we enjoy it. Besides, we can meet and greet our Hindu friends during the festival."

Cocktail, bomb making materials found at Ruet

Police recovered a cocktail and cocktail making materials from a lonely corner of Shaheed Selim Hall of Rajshahi University of Engineering Technology (Ruet) yesterday.

Cleaners of Ruet found the bombs near the toilet beside a room on the first floor of the hall at around 11am and informed police, said sub inspector Selim Reza of Motihar police station.

The bomb making materials include six empty cans, 100 gram white powder and small pieces of pebble, said police.

Kushtia teacher held on charge of torturing domestic help

Police arrested a lecturer of Physics at Kushtia Government Girls' College on charge of torturing a 6-year-old domestic help on Monday night.

Judge of Women and Children Repression Prevention Court sent Firoz to jail yesterday. The hapless girl is now undergoing treatment at Kushtia General Hospital.

According to police, Salma Khatun, 6, daughter of Saheb Ali of Bhangura in Pabna district had been working at the house of Foriz for last one year.

Firoz and his wife Farzana Sharmin, a teacher of Kushtia Government Girls' School, often tortured Salma over various issues.

On Monday, Firoz mercilessly beat up the girl with a wooden stick over a trifle matter.

Hearing the cry of the girl, neighbours informed police.

A team from Sadar police station rushed to the spot, rescued the girl at about 3:30pm and arrested Firoz.

A number of neighbours told police the tale of continuous torture on the girl by the couple.

Sub-Inspector Obaidur Rahman of Kushtia Sadar police station filed a case against Firoz and his wife Farzana under Women and Children Repression Prevention Act.

Robiul Islam, owner of the house where the couple lived said, he also had requested them (couple) not to torture the girl.

Police however, did not arrest Farzana Sharmin.

"She (Farzana) has a three-year-old baby. We did not arrest her on the spot on humanitarian ground," said officer-in-charge (OC) of Kushtia Sadar police station.

"But we will arrest her soon after arranging a caretaker for Farzana's baby", the OC said.
