### Hanoi offers rice line

Signs deal with Bangladesh to help ensure food security

UNB, Dhaka

Vietnam is willing to provide Bangladesh with long-term supply of rice to ensure food security in the country, Prime Minister Nguyen Tan Dung said in Hanoi on Monday.

The Vietnamese premier made the assurance when he received Bangladesh's Food and Disaster Management Minister Dr Abdur Razzaque, who is on a visit to Vietnam.

He also said Vietnam's consistent pol-

icy is to promote ties with Bangladesh in various areas, particularly in economic relations, trade and investment, according to a Vietnam News Agency.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh and Vietnam signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on Monday in Hanoi to ensure food security of the two countries and rice trade.

## Dhaka, Colombo to boost trade


