PM to lay foundation of Asian University for Women Apr 26

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will formally lay the foundation of Asian University for Women (AUW) on its Chittagong campus on April 26.

The Asian University for Women is being built to groom women as skilled and innovative professionals, service-oriented leaders in the businesses and communities in which they will work and live, and promoters of inter-cultural understanding and sustainable human and economic development in Asia and throughout the world.

Apart from laying the foundation in the morning, Hasina will attend several other programmes at the university.

During her visit to the port city, she will also inaugurate the new building of Chittagong Divisional Passport and Visa office. Hasina will have opinion-exchange meetings with senior leaders of Chittagong unit of Awami League and high government officials at the Circuit House.

Boy run over by train

A six-year-old boy sustained critical injuries after being run over by a train at Khilgaon in the city yesterday.

The minor, while crossing the railway lines at Khilgaon along with his grandfather, fell on the tracks and met with the running train around 11:00am.

The boy, Mehedi Hasan Asif, was the only son of a buying-house businessman Mohammad Sumon of Bagicha.

Asif was returning home from Bangladesh Ideal School in Khilgaon where he studied in class-1.

"Asif returned home everyday holding my hands. But today, he ran forward leaving me behind," said his 55-year-old grandfather Mohammad Mamun.

"Everything happened within a moment and I had to witness the tragic incident, but I could not do anything to save Asif," he added.

Witnesses said a train had just passed when Asif ran forward and did not see another train on an adjacent track approach. He fell down on the tracks and stood up but the train ran over the lower portion of his body, severing one leg, they added.

Asif was first rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) and then shifted to Pongu Hospital. Considering his critical condition, he was later shifted to Japan-Bangladesh Friendship Hospital in Dhamondi.

Asif has been taken to the operation theater from Intensive Care Unit, doctors said last night, adding that his remaining leg might have to be amputated.



Cardinal Tauran due in city
April 25

Cardinal Jean-Louis Tauran, head of the Pope's Commission of Inter-religious Dialogue in Rome, will arrive in Bangladesh on April 25 on a five-day visit.

During his visit, the cardinal would meet President Zillur Rahman, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Khaleda Zia, says a press release signed by Rev Fr Kamal Corraya from Archbishop's House, Dhaka.

During his stay, he would deliver his speech on building relationships and brotherhood and peace among different religious communities.

He will attend a seminar organised by Department of World Religion of Dhaka University in the campus on April 26.

On April 27, he will deliver his keynote speech in a conference on Inter-religious Dialogue at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre where Foreign Minister Dipu Moni will be present as the chief guest.

The cardinal joined the Council for Public Affairs of the Church in Vatican in 1983 and represented the Holy See at the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe for many years.

30 statues seized,
2 held at airport

Customs officials seized 30 statues including six made of touchstone and arrested two Bangkok-bound passengers at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport in the city yesterday.

The rest of the statues were made of metal and terracotta, airport sources said.

However, the archeological value and age of those statues could not be known immediately, they said.

Most of the statues were replica of Hindu god and goddess, they added.

Arrestees Abdul Jalil, 55, of Comilla and his companion Mohammad Islam, 45, of Feni were scheduled to fly to Bangkok by a Thai Airways flight at 1:30pm.

Assistant Commissioner Shahjahan Kabir of airport customs said, on information, they took the two men and their two luggages out of the scheduled aircraft for checking.

They recovered the statues from the luggage, he said.

With experts help, it was detected that six of the idols were made of touchstones weighing around 15 kg worth around Tk 3 crore, said Kabir. Of the six, three were idols of Hindu god Ganesh, he added.

Earlier in December 2007, two 1,500-year-old terracotta Vishnu statues of National Museum, bound for an exhibition at Guimet Museum in Paris, were stolen from Zia International Airport.
