Danger overhead

Authorities remain silent despite HC order to remove risky, illegal hoardings

Billboards in the capital have started collapsing with the approach of the storm season while authorities are sitting on a High Court order for removing risky hoardings.

Around 90 percent billboards on roofs and 75 percent on roads in Dhaka are illegal.

Deaths and damage of property due to fall of poorly mounted billboards has been a regular phenomenon particularly during the storm season. For instance, a giant billboard collapsed on manpower. Mirpur Road near Dhanmondi Road-8 during the storm in the early hours Wednesday.

An HC bench on April 29 last

year revoked an earlier stay on demolishing hazardous rooftop billboards and asked the Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) and the Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) to knock down all illegal billboards.

However, Rajuk has not removed a single rooftop billboard since while DCC removes a scanty number on an irregular once-a-week basis.

Rajuk Chairman Md Nurul Huda said they could not initiate the removal process due to lack of

"We will take measures once our request for more manpower is approved," he said.

Some still missing; sunken launch salvaged

e-textbook for students

PM launches tomorrow govt website with 106 books

The government is going to launch a website with digital versions of textbooks for primary and secondary students to give them free access to textbooks online.

At least 106 textbooks of primary and secondary levels have been converted to e-books, electronic version of textbooks, published by the National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB) and

uploaded on www.ebook.gov.bd with the technical assistance of Access to Information (A2I) of Prime Minister's Office (PMO).

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is expected to launch the website at the PMO tomorrow.

Students can log on to the website and flip through the ebooks just like the printed ones. Besides, they can also download any page they want.

The e-books have options to zoom in on pages and bookmark any of those, said A2I programme officials. Anyone can download the contents for free and read those also on mobile phones, they said.

The students, who take the primary terminal and secondary examinations abroad, will benefit greatly from it as they will be able to download textbooks from the website.



Murder for money

Rajshahi Medical College student held for Blames law enforcers killing friend; dumped body recovered 18 days after murder

A bone-chilling story about how two would-be doctors murdered their friend has been revealed 18 days after the killing in Rajshahi Medical College.



Rapid Action Battalion personnel and police recovered the decomposed body of Mahbub Alam Russel, 24, behind a bush near Charu Mama's canteen in the medical college. Russel had been a student of the economics department of Rajshahi Government College and he had an elec-

tronic appliance business. Rab arrested one of the suspected mur-



RMC, at his relative's house in Tarash of Sirajganj early yesterday. He confessed the killing to law enforcers and led them to where he and his cohort

had hid Russel's body.

During the recovery of the body around 4:00pm yesterday, law enforcers produced Joy before journalists and the incredible and gruesome story of the murder was told.

INDO-BANGLA BORDER 80pc survey done to end disputes

Bangladesh and India have completed 80 percent of the joint survey along their international border as part of the efforts to resolve the longstanding boundary dispute within this year.

As a first step, the two countries are expected to complete identification of adversely-held enclaves within a month, a senior Indian official, who requested anonymity, said.
