Tyler Perry SICK OF Spike Lee and MADEA critics

Tyler Perry, who was front and centre for the recent premiere of his new film, "Madea's Big Happy Family" has a message for fans -- and for non-fans.

"You know I don't dwell in negativity," he says in a note that went up this week on his website. "I try and stay above it, but I wanted to say this to you. You and I both know that there are folks out there that work overtime trying to keep people from seeing my movies. Even though I don't say anything, it doesn't mean that I'm not aware of it. They say all kinds of things about the films, Madea and me. They call me everything, but a child of God. I even had someone tell me in a press conference that I don't have a 'white' following. We all know that is not true. Had they been on tour with me they would know White folks, Black folks, Asian folks, Latin folks, Navajo folks, and everyone in between was there laughing side-by-side, having a good time...

"But it's okay, you know why? Because I know that they don't get it! ... And to tell you the truth, it doesn't matter if they get it or not, as long as you do. I thank God for you every day. You know what you enjoy, you know what makes you laugh and gives you a bit of uplift after you've seen it. So come laugh with me this weekend with Madea."

Perry was a little more direct during a Tuesday press conference for the film, targeting noted African American filmmaker Spike Lee specifically. Lee said in 2009 that Perry's films "hearken back to Amos n' Andy" and conform to stereotypes.

"I'm so sick of hearing about damn Spike Lee," Perry said, reports Box Office Magazine. "Spike can go straight to hell! You can print that. I am sick of him talking about me, I am sick of him saying, 'this is a coon, this is a buffoon.' I am sick of him talking about black people going to see movies. This is what he said: 'you vote by what you see,' as if black people don't know what they want to see."



Added Perry, "I am sick of him -- he talked about Whoopi, he talked about Oprah, he talked about me, he talked about Clint Eastwood. Spike needs to shut the

In the timeline shown in the TV show "Sarah Connor Chronicles", we see a young Kyle watch as Skynet finally succeeds in launching missiles on April 21, 2011.

The film's director, James Cameron, told the TMZ website: "Kyle Reese said in the first film that it was only one possible future -- clearly, not the one we're in.

"Maybe Kyle, Sarah, John and the T-800 changed things enough to steer us away from that possible future." He added: "Now instead of nuclear war

we need to worry about global climate "And the machines taking over? With everybody going through their lives bent

over their Blackberrys all day long, you could even argue the machines have already won." Cameron's cinematic vision has, thankfully not been borne out, but could there be a final twist in his tale? To this day the UK's family of military satel-

lites is still called Skynet -- a name first coined in 1969 when the first one was built in the US. A spokesman for Astrium, the company which builds them, said the name preceded the film and was probably a coincidence. But he added it was just possible the director could have read something about the UK
