Promised climate funds sought

Bangladesh has sought urgent bilateral climate change fund disbursement from the developed countries and development partners as the United Nations Global Green Fund, pledged for the vulnerable countries, shows no sign of disbursement shortly.

Bangladesh is treated as one of the major claimants of the green fund, which was created in Cancun Climate Change Conference last year.

"It is yet to decide how they would disburse the money from the UN climate change fund. But being the most affected country in the world we need to act now to face the change. So, we have sought assistant from the development partners on bilateral basis," said Dr Hasan Mahmud, state minister for the Ministry of Environment and Forests.

The meeting was held at the state guesthouse Padma in the city. Some 16 envoys or their representatives including from US, Germany, Denmark, Japan, South Korea, European Union and officials of development partners including from World Bank, UNDP, USAID, DFID, SIDA, attended the meeting.

Razzaque also said open market sale (OMS) of rice has brought stability in rice market, referring to the current price of the food grain.

The minister came to Chittagong to visit the under-construction godowns and the OMS service here. He said the government will construct 91 godowns with Tk 218 crore in

Chittagong within this year. Of them 77 godowns, each with 1,000 tonnes storage capacity, would be set up at Halishahar and the rest 14, each with 500tonnes capacity, at Dewanhat, he added.

Ahmad Hossain Chowdhury, director general of the department, and Deputy Commissioner (DC) Fayez Ahmed also spoke at the meeting.

Fresh BNP agitation programmes May 9

BNP yesterday said it will announce fresh agitation programmes on May 9 in protest at the existing gas, electricity and water crises and the price hike of essentials. As per its previous decision, the party will

stage demonstrations on that day across the country demanding a midterm election. At a press conference at the party's cen-

tral office in the city's Nayapaltan, Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, party acting secretary general, said "We will declare fresh agitation progammes demanding the resignation of the government if it fails to resolve the crises in public life."

The conference was organised to announce the decisions taken on Saturday during a daylong meeting of the National Executive Committee of the main opposi-

Replying to a query, the BNP leader said Chairperson Khaleda Zia will declare in time the party's stance regarding the invitation by


the parliamentary special committee on constitutional amendments.

Mirza Alamgir unveiled a 26-point demand including reduction of prices of essentials and release of arrested party leaders at the conference. He said the opposition is worried about the government's failure and negligence in discharging its duties.

The executive committee on Saturday discussed the organisational affairs, he mentioned. Full-fledged committees of 43 district units have been formed and another 10 committees will be formed soon. Rest of the committees will be formed before the next executive committee meeting.

The meeting congratulated Khaleda Zia on her nominating Mirza Alamgir as acting secretary general and criticised the government for harassing Nobel laureate Prof Muhammad Yunus.

Saturday's meeting was arranged in line with the party constitution according to which the executive committee must hold a meeting once in every six months.

Helal and Ali were admitted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) in critical condition. Others took primary treatment at the university medical cen-

Police said Helal was beaten up by the helper and driver of Tari, an engine-run passenger carrier, following an altercation over fare at Nandirhat around 10:30pm.

As fellows of Helal reached there, the transport workers beat them up too along with locals. Police of university outpost rescued the students and picked up the helper Md Rafique and the driver Abul

Kalam.

Diagnostic centre ransacked in Ctg

Students of Chittagong Medical College (CMC) vandalised a private diagnostic centre over a squabble in Panchlaish area of Chittagong city Saturday night.

Transport movement from in front of the medical college to Chalkbazar remained suspended for over 12 hours, as the students blocked the road around 12:00am Saturday.

Police and diagnostic centre sources said two CMC students, who went to Chevron Diagnostic Centre for some tests around 9:30pm, tried to violate queue.

An altercation ensued as the attendants of other patients protested the violation. At one stage, Chevron staff tied and beat up the two students who were released after being identified as students of CMC.

An attending doctor of the diagnostic centre, seeking anonymity, said several agitating youths arrived at the centre after the two students contacted their fellows.

As Panchlaish police reached the spot, the agitators asked Officer-in-charge (OC) Nobojyoti Khisha to hand over the Chevron staff responsible for their "harassment".

Denied, the students along with some "outsiders' vandalised three floors of the diagnostic centre and damaged computers and other equipment. After the vandalism, the youths put blockade on the road at midnight demanding punishment to the Chevron staff.

The blockade was lifted around 12:00pm yesterday after a two-hour long meeting between CMC students and Chevron authorities.

The anonymous doctor alleged police remained silent during the vandalism. Asked, OC Nobojyoti said a few policemen accompanied him during the violence, and

they just tried to save the staff. "We took control of the situation after more policemen joined us." Panchlaish police picked up three staff -- Abul Hossain, Suman (1) and Suman (2) -- after the medical college stu-

dents filed a case with the police station early Sunday.
