Faster rail runs out of steam

*3 major projects for quick
Dhaka-Ctg communications
gather dust for years*

Three important projects launched four to five years ago to make Dhaka-Chittagong train link faster and more comfortable have so far made little headway.

The projects include upgrading the 196-kilometre single track of the 320-kilometre route to double track, rehabilitating the existing tracks, improving signalling system and modernising the stations.

Trains on the country's most important route have to regularly wait at different stations for other trains to pass due to the single-line track, delaying the journey by about two hours.

The single track is also a reason for frequent accidents. When an accident occurs, rescue operation is seriously hampered as relief train cannot reach the scene for not having another track.

Fourteen passenger trains run between Dhaka and Chittagong every day, while a large number of freight trains also use the route.

At the current pace of work, experts say the projects would require many more years to be completed.

TONGI-BHAIRAB BAZAR DOUBLE-LINE

The 64-kilometre single track is the most important as the Dhaka-bound trains from Chittagong and Sylhet run on it. A project was taken in mid-2007 to upgrade it to

BCL men clash at DU

*70 injured as arms, bombs,
sharp weapons used*

Armed with firearms, home-made bombs and sharp weapons, two factions of Bangladesh Chhatra League swooped on another faction at Haji Muhammad Mohsin Hall in Dhaka University yesterday, leaving around 70 people injured.

Around 10 shots were fired and over five bombs exploded inside the dorm compound during the hour-long clash that started around 4:30pm over establishing supremacy.

The factions of Chhatra League hall unit President Mohammad Ali and General Secretary Mohiuddin jointly attacked the faction of hall unit Organising Secretary Mohiuddin Mahi spreading panic amongst hundreds of students inside the dormitory and halls
