## DMP ban on rallies at Muktangon

The Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) yesterday imposed ban on holding meeting and carrying sticks, explosives and firearms in the city's Paltan, Motijheel, Baitul Mukarram, Ramna and adjacent areas from this morning.

DMP Commissioner Benazir Ahmed in a press release said he imposed the ban as three organisations -- Shariyah Ain Bastobayon Committee, Sarbodalo Islami Oikya Parishad and Islamic Front -- called rallies at Muktangon and at the same time.

The DMP commissioner said he imposed the ban from the possibilities of the deterioration of law and order situation causing public insecurity.

Sources said the three organisations have called the rallies at Muktangon on the issue of Women Development Policy.

## 118 bags of OMS rice seized

Law enforcers in separate drives seized around 118 bags of rice meant for open market sales (OMS) from Moulvibazar and Noakhali districts yesterday.

Police raided a warehouse of rice trader Moynul Bari at Nosirganj bazaar under Kulaura upazila and seized 60 bags of rice (each bag containing 50kg rice), reports our Moulvibazar correspondent.

Following a tip-off, Md Kabir, upazila food officer, in association with a police team carried out the raid.

Azizul Islam, sub-inspector of Kulaura Police Station, led the drive. Police sealed off the warehouse.

Sixty rice bags bearing the government's seal for OMS was found at the depot, SI said.

A case has been filed in this connection, said Kamrul Hasan, officer-in-charge of the police station.

Our Noakhali correspondent adds, Companiganj police raided a shop of an OMS dealer at Bashurhat Hospital road and seized 58 bags of OMS rice from a van.

The rice was being taken for sell on the black market, police said.

## Cambodia, Thailand urged to end hostilities

Indonesia, the current chair of Asean, has called for immediate cessation of hostilities between Cambodia and Thailand.

In a statement issued by the Indonesian embassy in Dhaka yesterday, Indonesian government urged the two sides to continue to resolve their differences through peaceful means as has been reflected in addressing the border dispute between the two countries.

It said the foreign minister of Indonesia is in communication with his Cambodian and Thailand counterparts to address this latest development.

## 'Try killers of Aminul'

A human chain was formed in front of Jatiya Press Club in the city yesterday demanding immediate exemplary punishment to the killers of Aminul Haque, a businessman of Rajshahi.

Chapainawabganj Zila Samiti, Dhaka formed the human chain also protesting the brutal killing of Aminul. On April 13, police recovered his decomposed body, cut into nine pieces, from a house at Alupatty in Rajshahi city three days into his abduction.

President of the association Eng Mahtab Uddin and General Secretary Eng Nurul Islam, among others, spoke at the programme, said a press release.

Later, the association submitted a memorandum to the home minister.

## Call for comprehensive plan of action to resist stalking

Speakers at a workshop yesterday stressed the need for formulation of a comprehensive plan of action to resist stalking.

They said massive programmes should be taken from the grassroots level to national level to combat stalking and sexual harassment that has turned into a social disease, they said.

The Department of Women Affairs (DWA) organised the workshop at its auditorium in the city.

Speaking as the chief guest, Ministry of Women and Children's Affairs acting secretary Tariq-ul-Islam said it is not possible to fight against stalking by his ministry alone, coordinated efforts of different ministries concerned are required in this regard.

"The government is determined to ensure security for the girls and needs cooperation from the people and NGOs to reach the goal," he said.

DWA Director General Ashraf Hossain emphasise building a social resistance against stalking and called for formation of anti-stalking committee at all the educational institutions and localities.

DEATH OF GIRL  
Rampura OC, 13 others sued

A human rights organisation filed a case against Saidur Rahman, officer-in-charge (OC) of Rampura Police Station along with 13 others for diverting a case of murder after rape.

Nurul Islam Chowdhury, coordinator of Human Resource-A Health Foundation filed the case against the accused under the Fourth Special Tribunal for Prevention of Women and Children Repression of Dhaka, on Monday.

The other accused include Sub-Inspector Joynal, Assistant Sub-Inspector Shyamal Chandra Dhar as well as the owner, manager and employees of Hotel Miraz at Malibagh in the city.

Judge (in-charge) Nur Mohammad Jahangir Sarkar of the tribunal recorded the statement of the complainant and directed the Dhaka Metropolitan Police Commissioner to submit a report within seven days after investigation into the matter.

On March 15, Sumi Akhter, a 16-year-old girl from West Sheorapara was held at the hotel by force and raped, Nurul Islam stated in the complaint. Later, she was thrown off the six-storey building, which resulted in her death.

The police was informed, soon after she was held at the hotel, but they did not take any steps to rescue the victim, out of sheer negligence, Nurul Islam said.

Following her death, they also took no legal action against the ones involved with the incident. When Sumi's father went to file a case, they refused to register it.

Meanwhile, Rampura police filed an unnatural death case in this connection to create diversion from the actual incident, the complainant said.

According to the police, Sumi jumped off the six-storey hotel during a raid by the law enforcers.

## Govt isolated from people

Says Khaleda

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia last night said the government has become isolated from the people, as it failed to do anything for the country in the last two and a half years.

"In the present critical situation of the country, a pro-people government should be formed through a midterm election that we have been demanding to save the country," she said addressing the newly elected office bearers of Manikganj District Bar Association at her Gulshan office in the capital.

The popularity of the government has declined to zero, as it has completely failed to run the country. "The government is busy to loot and file cases against the opposition. They have no headache for the development of the country."

She alleged the prime minister's office is now controlling the judiciary.

BNP Standing Committee Member Rafiqul Islam Mian and Acting Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, among others, were present.

## ROLE OF DIPLOMATS IN 1971

## Asma Kibria dismayed by non-recognition

Asma Kibria, wife of former finance minister Shah AMS Kibria, has expressed dismay for not recognising the contributions of some of the diplomats for their service to the country during the Liberation War of Bangladesh.

Responding to observance of the "Foreign Office Day" on April 23 and awarding to a number of diplomats, who declared their allegiance to the Mujibnagar government on April 18 in 1971, she said that contributions of some of those diplomats such as her husband Kibria together with Enayet Karim defected in Washington D.C from the Pakistan Embassy were not recognised by the foreign ministry.

In a letter to Foreign Secretary Mijarul Quayes on April 24, Asma Kibria said after the liberation her husband (Kibria) served as director general and then secretary of the foreign ministry and developed its organisational structure and ensured official recognition for the country and met the diplomatic challenges of a generally hostile international environment.

"You yourself must be aware that Kibria is regarded as one of the people who laid the foundation for the modern foreign ministry."

Asma Kibria said in her letter and added that Enayet Karim also served as the foreign secretary with great distinction before he died in 1974.

It is ironic that the contributions of both these men were forgotten by the Awami League government, she added.

When contacted, a senior official of the foreign ministry told The Daily Star that the name of late Shah Kibria is very much in the list of the 25 awardees. "He (Kibria) is one of the prominent figures of the foreign service and the foreign ministry has not forgotten his name. Even his crest was ready, but on April 23 we awarded only 18 persons and rest of the awardees will be awarded soon," he added.

On April 18 in 1971, then the deputy high commissioner in Kolkata M Hossain Ali along with its 65 officials and staff declared their allegiance to the Mujibnagar government by hoisting its red-green national flag atop the mission. It was followed in other missions when Bengali officials defected service from Pakistan.

## Oust govt movement from May 9

Announce BNP leaders

BNP leaders at a rally in the city yesterday announced that they would launch an oust government movement on May 9.

Earlier, BNP announced the day for a protest rally demanding midterm election.

"Tens of thousands of people will attend the rally on May 9 which will be the start of the movement to oust the government. We won't return to the house without being successful," said party's acting Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir.

He was addressing a rally at Muktangon in the city as part of party's programme protesting price hike of essentials. Party's district units also submitted memorandum to deputy commissioners across the country.

According to the previous announcement, the party will stage countrywide demonstration on May 9 demanding midterm election.

Mirza Alamgir said the government has 'cheated' the people in the name of bringing changes in the constitution to implement their own interest which won't be acceptable to the countrymen.

He said the government has completely failed to check the price hike of essentials, first pledge in their election manifesto. "Ministers, criminals and extortionists are leading a luxurious life while the people are suffering."

Khander Mosarrab Hossain, Altaf Hossain Chowdhury, Zainul Abdin Farroque and Amanullah Aman also spoke at the rally with Alamgir in the chair.

## Jurists debate suo moto

Former attorney general Mahmudul Islam yesterday said according to the country's charter the High Court cannot issue any suo moto rule, a statement that constitution expert Dr M Zahir opposed.

The two placed their observations as amici curiae (friends of court) before the Supreme Court Appellate Division during the hearing of an appeal against an HC verdict that had declared fatwa (religious ruling) illegal.

The HC can issue any rule nisi under Article 102 of the constitution only on receiving an application filed by any aggrieved person, Mahmudul Islam said, adding that issuing suo moto rule by the HC without application is unconstitutional.

The issue whether the HC has jurisdiction to issue suo moto rule should be settled first. And on this point, the SC had granted the leave-to-appeal petition against the HC judgment, said Mahmudul.

On the other hand, M Zahir opined that the HC can issue any suo moto rule over anything related to constitutional rights of citizens.

The constitutional obligations imposed upon the judges and the SC, the third schedule of the constitution (oath of judges), judicial customs and long established principles allow the HC division to issue suo moto rules, he said.
