

### Monira gets World's Children's Prize

Monira Rahman, executive director of Acid Survivors Foundation (ASF), has received the World's Children's Prize 2011 for her fearless struggle for the surviving acid victims.

Monira was presented the award by 50 children from 15 countries and Swedish Queen Silvia at a ceremony at Gripsholm Castle in Mariefred, Sweden yesterday.

Also awarded the prize this year are Cecilia Flores-Oebanda of the Philippines and Murhabazi Namegabe of Congo, who worked to stop child trafficking and sex slavery.

The prize money, which stands at \$100,000 this year, is used to help some of the world's most vulnerable children to ensure better life for them. The World's Children's

Prize founded in 2000 in Sweden is a unique educational programme for children, promoting a more humane world.

Aung San Suu Kyi has been announced as the new patron of the World's Children's Prize. Other patrons include Nelson Mandela, Queen Silvia, and Graca Machel.

# 1st Physics Olympiad today

The first-ever national Physics Olympiad of the country will be held at Oxford International School (OIS) in the city today.

Over 300 students from around 40 schools and colleges across the country participate in the Olympiad jointly organised by OIS and The Daily Star.

The Olympiad aims at bringing out the students' hidden talents in physics, said

OIS Principal GM Nizam Uddin to a press conference at the school yesterday.

The competition will also provide them a platform from where they can develop the science education of the country, he added.

Nizam said western countries have achieved remarkable developments for

their practice of and expertise in science. In Bangladesh, similar strides for practice of science should start from the grass-

roots level such as in schools, he stressed. Earlier, Mahamodul Haque, a teacher of the school, made a power-point presenta-

tion on the Oxford-The Daily Star National Physics Olympiad 2011.

Haque said participants, divided into high school and college groups, will have to answer a number of tricky and interesting questions on physics.

Top 10 scorers will be awarded gold medals, six silver medals, and two bronze medals.

The 10 gold medallists will be specially coached by Bangladesh Physical Society (BPS) President Prof Ali Asgar before they take part in the 42nd International Physics Olympiad to be held in Thailand this July.

This is the first time Bangladesh will participate in International Physics Olympiad since its beginning in Warsaw, Poland in 1967.

State Minister for Science and ICT, Yeafesh Osman, is expected to address the opening ceremony of the Olympiad as the chief guest today.

M Shamsher Ali, president of Bangladesh Academy of Sciences; Prof M Kaykobad of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (Buet); Dr Muhammad Zafar Iqbal of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology; Mahfuz Anam, editor and publisher of The Daily Star; would attend the ceremony.

# Armed conflict main global obstacle

Armed conflict across the world is the major obstacle to establishing education for all, said Education For All, a global monitoring report of United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (Unesco), launched yesterday.

Bangladesh holds the tenth position in the report's list of 21 developing countries, which spend more on military budgets than on primary education.

The report also reasoned Chittagong Hill Tracts region lagging behind in education indicators due to armed conflict and being a heavily militarised area.

Primary and Mass Education Minister Afsarul Ameen launched the report at a function organised by Unesco at Islamic Development Bank in the city.

The report, published since 2002, assesses the achievement of different countries

regarding ensuring education for all. This year's topic was "The Hidden Crisis: Armed conflict and education".


Presenting a keynote paper based on the report, Habibur Rahman, director (Education) of Save the Children, USA, said half of the number of Bangladeshi children enrolled in class one reach class five.

Though enrolment increased in past ten years, about 6.3 million adolescents are out of schools in Bangladesh, said Habib, quoting the report.

A key message of the report says approach to education with a business mindset undermines any prospect of achieving education for all and Millennium Development Goals and many governments need to increase education financing.

Unesco representative in Dhaka Derek Elias chaired the function, moderated by Rasheda K Choudhury, executive director of Campaign for Popular Education.
