Surgery beckons Mashrafe again

Pace spearhead Mashrafe Bin Mortaza will fly to Australia next Saturday for another surgery on his right knee.

The "Narail Express" made his return to international cricket in the home series against Australia last month after injuring his right knee in December last year but never looked hundred percent fit during the three-match series.

"I felt that it's better to do the operation to prolong my career. Young (Dr. David Young) will first assess the depth of the injury and after that he will give his decision," said Mashrafe, who was reportedly under pressure to play the series against Australia, yesterday.

"I have no other choice but to go for another surgery if I want to prolong my cricket career. Another operation means I will be sidelined for at least another six to seven months or more," added frustrated Mashrafe.

"I'm not sure about my future. Let's see what happen," he said.

Dr Young last performed surgery on Mashrafe in August 2009 after the fast

bowler hurt his right knee during the first Test against the West Indies at St. Vincent a month earlier.

It will be the third operation on the right knee of Mashrafe who has battled numerous injuries throughout his career. The latest injury happened while taking

a run for Abahani, his club, against BKSP, in a Dhaka Premier Division League match in December last year, shattering his World Cup dreams.

Mashrafe took time to opt for another surgery as he was confident about his fitness but his last appearance against Australia made it clear that he has no other choice.

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) physician Dr. Debashish Chowdhury informed that it will take time for Mashrafe to regain full fitness this time. According to his timeline, the country's leading paceman has hardly any chance to make his international return this year.

"Normally it takes four to six months to fully recover from this kind of injury after operation but for Mashrafe the case is altogether a different one because the knee was operated on earlier. I think it will take time, at least seven to eight months," informed Debashish.

Siddikur's sorry final day



Skipper Tendulkar and Rayudu each made 51 as Mumbai scored 159-5 before stopping Punjab at 136-8 for their sixth victory in eight matches of the Twenty20 tournament. Mumbai now lead the 10-team league table with 12 points.

Australian Shaun Marsh top-scored with a 47-ball 61 for Punjab, who suffered their fourth defeat in seven games. He put on 72 for the second wicket with Paul Valthaty, who contributed a 38-ball 33.

Pacemen Lasith Malinga and Munaf Patel, and off-spinner Harbhajan Singh bagged two wickets apiece for Mumbai. Tendulkar and Rayudu earlier propped up the innings

after Mumbai had lost South African Davy Jacobs (10) in the third over, adding 95 for the second wicket. Rayudu, who hit seamer Praveen Kumar for two fours and

a six in the same over, was the first to reach half-century with a boundary off leg-spinner Piyush Chawla. He fell in the same over while attempting another big

shot, caught superbly by Dinesh Karthik at deep mid-wicket after hitting one six and eight fours in his 37-ball knock. Tendulkar, who hit left-arm spinner Bhargav Bhatt over

deep square-leg for the first six of the innings, also fell soon after completing his half-century. He cracked one six and three fours in his 45-ball knock.

RAMSEY DOWNS MAN UTD

Title race down to the wire

Arsenal's Aaron Ramsey blew the Premier League title race wide open as his second-half goal clinched a 1-0 win over leaders Manchester United

on Sunday.

A victory at the Emirates Stadium would have put United within touching distance of a record 19th league title, but Sir Alex Ferguson's side gave a strangely subdued display and Chelsea can now climb above them into first place if they win next Sunday's

crunch clash at Old Trafford. Second-placed Chelsea trail United by just three points and a win in Manchester would leave them favourites to retain the title with only two games to play after next weekend.

United, who have now failed to win at any of their top-six rivals this season, paid the price for their lethargy when Ramsey struck in the 56th minute.

After starting the weekend firmly in control of the title race, United are in severe danger of surrendering the initiative to a resurgent Chelsea, who have won eight of their last

nine league games. With Cesc Fabregas sidelined by a thigh injury suffered in training on Saturday,

Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger brought Ramsey into the youngest starting eleven of any Premier League club this season.

Wenger's side should have had a penalty mid-way through the first half when Nemanja Vidic clearly used his hand to deflect Theo Walcott's cross away from Robin van Persie as the Dutchman prepared to head towards goal.

However, neither referee Chris Foy nor his linesman Andy Garratt spotted the Serbia defender's blatant offence.

Arsenal took the lead when Ramsey scored his first Gunners goal since January 2010. Van Persie twisted and turned in the penalty

area before cutting back to Ramsey, who sidefooted a first-time shot past Edwin van der Sar. United's Michael Owen could have won a

penalty when he was tackled by Gael Clichy, but Arsenal deservedly held on for their first victory over United since November 2008, a result which keeps alive their own slender title hopes.

Van Persie felt Arsenal should have had a penalty for the Vidic incident and he told Sky Sports: "It was a clear penalty and in my opinion a straight red.

"If United should have had a penalty then it's 1-1 on that one but in the end I think we played better today. "We wanted it more. They played just on the

counter-attackso in the end I think a fair result.
