

Jamaat-e-Islami Ameer Motiur Rahman Nizami yesterday admitted that genocide and mass rape took place during the Liberation War but denied his involvement in such heinous activities.

The Jamaat chief however claimed he "had to be involved" with Al-Badr and Al-Shams, auxiliary forces of Pakistani occu-

pation army, in the face of death threats. Nizami made the statement during a

daylong interrogation by the investigation

agency probing the war crimes at a "Safe Home" in Dhanmondi in the capital.

The investigation agency said they would again appeal to the International Crimes Tribunal for permission to quiz Nizami for what they said he did not give a clear picture about his role in 1971.
