Elderly woman hacked to death

An elderly woman was hacked to death in her apartment at Banani in the city yesterday evening.

The body of victim Nasrin Akhter, 55, wife of US expatriate Tasul Islam Sams Chowdhury, was recovered from her bedroom on the second floor of the house around 7:00pm, police said. She used to live with her domestic help Liza, who is absconding since the incident, police added.

Babu killing: None held yet

Police could not yet nab any of the three accused of Jan-E-Alam Babu murder case filed with Panchlaish Police Station in the port city.

SI Sazzad Karim Khan, also the investigation officer of the case, told The Daily Star that they are conducting drives in different areas to nab the killers.

"The criminals perhaps have fled from Chittagong," said Sazzad.

Babu was killed allegedly by his friends at Rahman Nagar in the port city on Saturday midnight.

Babu's father Abul Hashem of Valua Bazar at Nangalcoat in Comilla, filed a murder case accusing Resaiyat Ahmed Joy, Atikur Rahman and Md Asif at 3:00am on Sunday.

Victim Rokhsana Begum, 45, was the wife of Ataur Rahman at West Shewrapara in Mirpur.

OC Kazi Wazed Ali quoting killer Habib Mughal, 28, said he hit his mother on the head with a brick while she was asleep in the evening.

Habib then locked her room on the first floor and surrendered to police, the OC said, adding that Habib told them that he killed her as her cooking always made him

The OC said they detained Habib and sent a police team and they found the body lying on the bed.

Talk about constitution in JS: Nasim

Senior Awami League leader and former home minister Mohammad Nasim yesterday called upon the opposition party to talk about the constitutional amendment by joining the Jatiya Sangsad.

"There are scopes for expressing opinions by the opposition about the constitutional amendment in parliament if they have anything to say about this,' he told a discussion at Dhaka Reporters Unity here.

Awami Olama League arranged the discussion on the occasion of the second death anniversary of eminent nuclear scientist Dr M Wazed Mian.

About BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's demand of resignation of the government, Nasim said, "The government has not failed, rather you have failed to make constructive criticism and also perform responsibilities as the leader of the opposition in parliament."

The former home minister added: "If you are a responsible person, join the Jatiya Sangsad and discuss the constitutional amendment. Otherwise, you should resign from the post of the leader of the opposition instead of demanding resignation of the government."

He called upon the government to take initiatives to restore confidence of the investors in the stock market.

Nasim termed Wazed Mia as unassuming and devoted and a man without greed. "He did not exercise his power although he was very close to the power," he said.

With Olama League President Iliyas Hossain Bin Helali in the chair, the discussion was also addressed by Dhaka City AL General Secretary Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury Maya.

Ctg JSD demands new constitution

Acting Huji chief admits attack on CPB rally

Acting chief of banned Harkatul Jihad Al Islami (Huji) along with his accomplices carried out bomb attacks on a CPB rally at Paltan on January 20, 2001, told an investigation officer (IO) yesterday at a Dhaka court.

Criminal Investigation Department Inspector Mrinal Kanti Saha, also IO of the case, said this after producing the leader Abdul Hannan Sabbir before the court of Metropolitan Magistrate Keshob Roy Chowdhury while praying for a ten-day remand.

His (Sabbir) five-day remand, granted on May 3, ended on Sunday.

In the prayer, the IO said another Huji leader in a confessional statement given earlier said Sabbir played an active role in executing the attack on the rally. So, he needs to be remanded to find out whereabouts of the other attackers.

After the hearing, the court granted a five-

day remand.

Sabbir was shown arrested in the CPB blast case on April 28 for his alleged involvement with the bomb blasts that killed five persons and injured around 50 others.

Rapid Action Battalion on April 25 arrested two Huji members, including Sabbir, from a hideout at Keraniganj. Earlier, 18 people including Sabbir, were

shown arrested for their alleged involvement with the incidents. CPB President Manzurul Ahsan Khan

filed the case with Motijheel Police Station

following the attack saying a group of antistate conspirators made the attack. Police arrested 12 people at that time but CID submitted the final report on December 17, 2003 as correct, impartial and reliable

the charges against the arrestees. Later, the home ministry ordered reinvestigation into the matter following an application submitted by the CID.

Youth arrested with

A youth was caught red handed in front of Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) yesterday noon while illegally carrying drugs worth Tk 12,000 out of the hospital's medicine store in connivance with hospital staff.

On primary interrogation, the arrestee Mohammad Torun, 22, said the store pharmacist Mojibur Rahman and a DMCH class four employee Khelafat Ali paid him Tk 100 everyday to take drugs from DMCH to their assigned destination. On information, an Ansar team at DMCH nabbed Torun

in front of the outdoor department while riding out on a motorcycle. Officer-in-Charge Rezaul Karim of Shahbagh Police Station, quoting the arrestee, said the youth resides in

Lalbagh area and was carrying out the act for the last seven days. DMCH authorities filed a case against Mohammad Torun in this connection and a five-member committee was formed

led by Deputy Director Dr Mohammad Jasimuddin, which would submit a report in three days. DMCH Director Brig Gen Shahidul Haque Mallick told The

Daily Star that they suspended Mozibur and Khelafat temporarily and they have been absconding since the incident.

EC warns against influencing UP polls

The Election Commission (EC) has cautioned against exerting influence in upcoming union parishad (UP) elections, saying legal action would be taken if anybody is found influencing the polls. Election Commissioner Sakhawat Hossain told reporters

that allegations have been received that election officers in some areas have been harassed and threatened by the supporters of some influential persons. The EC will take legal action against them. He further said that aspirants in some areas are barred to

submit nomination paper. "It's a non-party local government election where any eligible person can contest it. To bar contesting the poll is a great offence." He expressed dissatisfaction that MPs in some areas are

involved in such offensive activities. Polling in those areas may be withheld, he warned. Asked whether the EC is satisfied over the existing law and

order situation, the election commissioner said no big incidents have been occurred relating to UP election. Hossain hoped the UP polls in the second phase would be free, fair, and neutral. "We expect the cooperation and support

from country's political parties." According to the schedule of second phase, he said polling will be held in some 3,813 union parishads between May 31 and July 5 across the country.

Ayesha Akter, mother of the daily Independent's senior sports reporter Anwar Ullah, breathed her last at the city's Birdem hospital yesterday.


She was 75, says a press release. She was suffering from diabetes for long.
