

Sec 144 at Sunamganj as rival BNP men call separate rallies

Sunamganj district administration yesterday imposed Section 144 in the town for 12 hours from 8:00am as a tense situation was prevailing there centring separate programme of two factions of BNP district unit while two rival groups of the party's Moulvibazar unit held separate programmes in the district town the same day.

In line with the party programme demanding midterm national election and protesting price hike of essentials, a faction of Sunamganj BNP called a rally at the local stadium while the other at the traffic point area, according to our staff correspondent.

The two factions—one led by Aspia and Dr Rafique Chowdhury and the other by former lawmakers Nasir Uddin Chowdhury and KolimUddin Ahmed Milon—on Sunday held separate rallies on the said venues and announced yesterday's programmes that also included handing over of memos to the deputy commissioner at the same time.

At Sunday's rally, Aspia and Rafique Chowdhury-led group also demanded immediate dissolution of the district committee, which was announced by the central committee on April 27.

BNP central committee announced the new district committee with former whip of the Jatiya

Sangsad Fazlul Haque Aspia and former lawmaker Kolim Uddin Ahmed Milon as president and general secretary.

The announced angered the Aspia followers as a good number of activists belonging to their rival faction had been inducted into the committee.

Our Moulvibazar correspondent reported that two rival groups of BNP Moulvibazar district unit yesterday held rallies and procession in the town separately demanding midterm national election and protesting price hike of essentials.

Begum Khleda Robbani group of the district unit held its rally in front of Moulvibazar pourasava office while M Naser Rahman group at

minibus stand at Shah Mostafa Road.

The rally in front of the pourasava office was addressed, among others by, district unit general secretary Begum Khleda Robbani, Mayor of Moulvibazar Pourasava Fayzul Karim Mayun, Mosharrar Hussain Badsha and Moazzem Hussain. The faction also took out a procession in the town to press home the demands.

Chaired by M Naser Rahman, son of late finance minister M Saifur Rahman, the rally at the minibus terminal was addressed by central BNP leader Ruhul Amin Chowdhury as the chief guest. Leaders and activists belonging to the factions also brought out a procession in the town.

UNION PARISHAD ELECTION

Supporters of candidate beat man dead for not joining procession

Supporters of a chairman candidate in the upcoming union parishad election on Sunday afternoon beat a man dead as he refused to join their procession in favour of the candidate.

The incident took place at Aknondobaria village under Moharajpur union in Sadar upazila of the district.

The hapless man was identified as Naimul Haque, 55, of the same village.

Police and locals said, some supporters of Abdus Salam, a chairman candidate of Moharajpur union, asked Naimul to take part in the procession that was going to file nomination papers in the morning.

As Naimul refused to entertain their request, the angry supporters of Salam

accused Naimul of non-cooperation after filling nomination at around 4:30pm.

At on stage of altercation, they beat up Naimul mercilessly killing him on the spot.

Police recovered the body and sent it to Sadar hospital morgue for autopsy.

Sohagi Begum, wife of Naimul, filed a murder case with Chapainawabganj Sadar police station accusing Abdus Salam and seven others.

Away in Khagrachhari, 15 people filed nominations for chairman posts, 57 for member posts and 23 for women's reserved seats on Thursday for the upcoming election at three union parishads under Lakshmichhari upazila, reports our correspondent.

According to district election office sources, two candidates submitted nominations for the post of chairman in Barmachhari union parishad, 10 for the posts of member and 5 for the posts of women's reserved seats.

In Lakshmichhari union parishad, 10 candidates submitted nominations for the post of chairman, 25 for the posts of member and 11 for posts of women's reserved seats.

In Dullatali union parishad, three candidates submitted nominations for the post of chairman, 22 for the posts of member and 7 for posts of women's reserved seats.

Khagrachhari district election officer Md. Nurul Hassan said, May 15, 2011 has been fixed for the withdrawal of nomination papers while the election will be held on June 1, 2011.

Husband stabbed to death in Gaibandha

Two women commit 'suicide' in Satkhira

A young woman stabbed her husband to death in Gaibandha on Sunday while two housewives allegedly committed suicide in Satkhira on Sunday and Friday.

A man was stabbed to death allegedly by his wife following a family feud at Chak Barul village in Sadar upazila of Gaibandha on Sunday night, reports UNB.

The deceased was identified as Aminul Islam, 27, son of Alimuddin of the village.

Police and family sources said, Aminul used to quarrel with his wife Minara Begum on flimsy grounds since long. On the fateful night, he rebuked her over a trifling matter.

Later, at dead of night Minara stabbed sleeping Aminul indiscriminately, leaving him dead on the spot.

On information, police recovered the body yesterday morning and sent it to hospital morgue for autopsy.

Police arrested Minara. A case was filed.

In Satkhira, two housewives, being unable to bear the torture by their husbands anymore, allegedly committed suicide by taking poison on Sunday and Friday.

The victims were identified as Nurunnahar Begum, 25, wife of Nazrul Islam of village Ekra and Taslima Khatun, 25, wife of Rabiul Islam of village Khaspur in Kalaroa upazila.

Nurunnahar Begum's father Ibrahim Moral of Tala upazila said his daughter was married to Nazrul Islam about 8 years back. Soon after the marriage, Nazrul started to torture her for dowry off and on, he said.

He tortured her on Saturday evening which led to her death the next day, he said.

Police said Nurunnahar took poison at night being unable to bear the torture.

In the other incident, Taslima Khatun allegedly committed suicide by taking poison due to torture by her husband at village Mahmudpur on Friday night.

Taslima, daughter of Moslem Gazi of village Mahmudpur in the same upazila, was married with Shawkat Ali about three years ago.

Recently, Shawkat demanded Tk 50,000 dowry from the victim's father but Moslem Gani could not pay the amount.

On Friday morning, Shawkat beat the hapless woman mercilessly with bamboo stick leaving her injured seriously. Later, she took poison to get rid of torture for good, police said.

Villagers took Taslima to Kalaroa upazila health complex in critical condition where she died at about 10pm on the day.

Saudi expat murdered

A Bangladeshi expatriate in Saudi Arabia was murdered by unknown assailants at Chalkbarul village in Gaibandha Sadar upazila early yesterday.

Police said, an armed gang entered the room of Aminul Islam, 35, late at night and slit his throat in sleep.

Police could not ascertain the motive behind the murder.

Family sources said, Aminul came home from Saudi Arabia a few days ago and was supposed to leave for his workplace after two months.

His wife Minara Begum could not say anything although she was sleeping in the same room with her 8-year-old daughter.

Police, however, picked up four people including wife, mother and two brothers of the victim for interrogation.
