

NILPHAMARI GOVERNMENT COLLEGE 5 BCL activists expelled for Monday's vandalism

Nilphamari Government College authorities yesterday expelled five activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) from the college on charge of vandalising the venue of a function arranged on the occasion of the 150th birth anniversary of Poet Rabindranath Tagore on the campus on Monday. The authorities took the decision in an emergency meeting with Principal Laila Arjumand Banu in the char. The expelled are

Satyendranath Roy, Ratan, Khokon, Ullash and Shaheb. Campus sources said the college authorities arranged the function in the afternoon and asked BCL activist Asaduzzaman Apple, also the convener of Rongdhanu Sangskritik Gosthi, to conduct the function. As Asad was conducting the function, BCL activists belonging to a faction led by Nilphamari district unit general secretary Naem Islam Jibon raised slogans against Asad, also a supporter of their rival faction led by district unit president

Deepok Chakraborty. They vandalised the venue, set fire to a banner and swooped on their rivals who also made a counter attack. During chase and counter chase between the two BCL groups, students, teachers and the invited guests were seen running helter-skelter. Being informed, police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control. Later, the college authorities held the function under police protection. No one was arrested in connection with the incident as of

filing of this report at 5:00pm yesterday. Contacted, Principal Laila Arjumand Banu said the college authorities have taken stern action against the five students as they led the attack on the function. A four-member committee, headed by Vice-Principal Didarul Islam, has been formed to investigate the incident, the principal added. Additional police have been deployed on the campus to avert any further incident.

Bid to 'grab' school's playground protested

Students of Gaibandha Government Boys High School yesterday boycotted classes protesting alleged grabbing of school playground. They also paraded the main roads of Gaibandha town and staged a sit-in on the disputed playground. The school authorities said, during the tenure of the school's non-government administration in 1960, the then assistant teacher Hafizur Rahman was sacked from job on charge of corrupt practice. The teacher filed a case rejecting dismissal and later got verdict from lower court to take outstanding salaries by selling the school's 73 decimal landed property through auction. Accordingly, Hafizur Rahman also attended the auction and got the ownership of the property against his outstanding salaries of Tk 5,850. The case is still pending with the Supreme Court for final judgement. Meanwhile, a section of influential people have been trying to grab the land. The school playground is the property of government, none can take control of it forcibly, said Shahana Begum, Headmaster of the school. A case is still pending with Supreme Court, so steps will be taken against any bid to grab the school property, said Md. Shahidul Islam, deputy commissioner Gaibandha.

Three get life for killing

Additional district and sessions judge Ekramul Haque Chowdhury yesterday sentenced three people to life term imprisonment for killing a teenage boy. He also fined each of them Tk 30 thousand, in default, to suffer one year more in jail. The convicts are Ujjal, son of Muslim Uddin, Shuan, son of Thaher Mia and Bappi, son of late Tara Mia of Borunka village under Mohongonj upazila in the district.

According to the case in brief, on January 10 in 2008, the three strangled their friend Chand Mia, 18, son of late Siddik Mia of the same village and threw his body into a nearby canal. Siraj Mia, elder brother of Chand Mia, filed a murder case against the three with Mohongonj police station. After investigation, police submitted charge sheet against them. The judge, after examining the witnesses and evidence, found them guilty and pronounced the verdict yesterday.

Party rivals mercilessly beat up BNP leader

Sent to Dhaka from Barisal in critical condition

Intra-party rivals seriously injured Nazrul Islam Rajon, central BNP assistant organising secretary for Barisal division, at Charkawa ferry terminal in Barisal city on Monday night. Nazrul Islam Rajon, also former secretary of Barisal district BNP, came under attack at about 10:00pm when he was accompanying central BNP leaders Air Vice Marshal Altaf Hossain Chowdhury, Brig Gen ASM Hannan Shah, former lawmaker Nazimuddin Alam and others, police and witnesses said. They were returning in a motorcade after an organisational tour in Bhola. BNP leaders and activists who witnessed the incident said Kamrul Islam Ratan, Maksud Alam Mamun, Ariful Islam Munna, Firoz Ahmed Kalu and other activists of local rival faction of BNP dragged Rajon out of his car and mercilessly beat and hacked him on the ferry. After treatment at Barisal Sher-e-Bangla Medical College Hospital (SBMCH) for injuries to head, chest, eye, leg and hand, Rajon was referred to Dhaka early Tuesday as his condition deteriorated, said Dr Zahirul Islam Manik of Surgery unit-3 of SBMCH. Rajon has been admitted to Square Hospital in Dhaka and his condition is not yet out of danger, said Rajon's elder brother Principal Abdur Rashid Khan. When Rajon was brought to the SBMCH, he told reporters in a feeble voice that some local Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal and Jubo Dal men led by Jubo Dal leader Kamrul Islam

Ratan made the attack on him. Ratan, however, denied his involvement with the attack. Central Jubo Dal leader Momen Shikder, who witnessed the incident, said the attackers are men of local BNP lawmaker Mojibur Rahman Sarwar, also city BNP convener and central BNP organising secretary and former mayor of Barisal City Corporation. Rajon's brother Principal Abdur Rashid Khan, also a leader of local Awami League, and Ahsan Habib Kamal, central BNP fishery secretary and former city BNP president, claimed that activists attacked Rajon following instruction from BNP lawmaker Mojibur Rahman Sarwar. When contacted, lawmaker Sarwar said, "I do not believe in terrorism. I demand punishment of the attackers on Rajon." Rival BNP men also beat Rustam Mollik, president of Barisal Sadar upazila unit of BNP, at Barisal Circuit House premises in presence of BNP central leaders at about 11:00pm. Rajon's brother Md Shajahan Khan yesterday lodged a case against BNP lawmaker Mojibur Rahman Sarwar and 11 other leaders and activists of BNP and its front organisations in connection with the incident, said Zahangir Hossain, officer in charge of Barisal Kotwali model police station. They include Kamrul Islam Ratan, Firoz Khan Kalu, Masud Hasan Mamun, Mashiur Rahman Manju, Munna and Zahid. Police arrested Jubo Dal activist Chhoto Zahid in this connection, said Sub Inspector Nusrat of the police station.

Teacher jailed for 46yrs for kidnap, rape of schoolgirl

A court here on Monday sentenced a school-teacher to 46 years rigorous imprisonment for kidnapping and raping a schoolgirl. Court sources said ASM Zahirul Islam, judge of Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal of Jessore, announced the verdict in a crowded courtroom in presence of the convict. The convict is Dipankar Biswas of Altapole Secondary School. According to the prosecution story, Biswas kidnapped a student of class X of the same school and raped her on January 26, 2006. Victim's father Abdus Sattar filed a case in this connection with Keshabpur PS on January 28 accusing five people including Dipankar Biswas as the main accused. Police submitted charge-sheet before the

court after investigation and the court after examining witnesses and relevant documents pronounced the verdict. In Sherpur, a man was sentenced to life term imprisonment on Monday for killing his wife following a family feud in 2005, reports UNB. The convict was identified as Alam Hossain alias Harun, 30, son of Fazar Ali of Nabingar area of the district town. The court also fined the convict Tk 20,000 in default, to suffer two years more RI. According to prosecution, Harun picked up a quarrel with his wife Roksana, 26, over a family matter on April 15, 2005 at night. At one stage, Harun strangled his wife. Victim's sister filed a murder case with Sadar police in this connection. After examining the record and witnesses additional district and sessions judge Nitai Chandra Saha pronounced the verdict.

400 sacks of OMS rice seized in 2 districts

Police seized over 400 sacks of rice meant for Open Market Sale (OMS) programme in Gaibandha and Nilphamari districts on Monday. In Gaibandha, Sundarganj police in a drive on Monday recovered 350 sacks of rice allocated under Open Market Sale (OMS) from a truck in the town. Police arrested driver Jahedul Islam and helper Al-Amin in this connection and also seized the truck, reports our correspondent. Mostafizur Rahman, OC of Sundarganj police station said, on a tip-off a police contingent raided the rice mill of one Abul Mannan in the municipal area and detained the truck loaded with 350 sacks of government rice under OMS programme. The helper of truck confessed to police that the rice was bound for Satkhira district for illegal sale there. In Nilphamari, police arrested a rice trader along with 55 sacks of Open Market Sale (OMS) rice in Shakhmachha area of the city on Monday evening. The arrestee was identified as Nurul Islam. Police said, acting on secret information, police seized the rice from the warehouse of Nurul Islam. The rice was hoarded for sale on black market, he said.

ASSAULT ON HOSPITAL IN-CHARGE Doctors lock upazila health complex

Sadullapur Upazila Health Complex remained shut for four hours from 10:00am on Monday as doctors locked all units, protesting assault on hospital in charge Dr Akhter Alam by one of their colleagues. Sources said Dr Shafiul Alam of the hospital had an altercation with hospital in charge Dr Akhter Alam over duty roster on Sunday. He prepared a roster on Monday, came to Akhter Alam and asked him to sign. As Akhter refused to sign the roster, Safiul along with his another colleague, Dr Kaniz Fatema, assaulted him, sources added. Protesting the incident, four other doctors of the health complex locked the main gate, x-ray room, emergency and outdoor units and pathology department. Seeing the health complex shut, several hundred patients and their relatives staged protest on the hospital premises demanding actions against the doctors responsible for the incident. At around 2:00pm,

Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Ariful Haq went to the health complex and unlocked the rooms of all units with the help of law enforcers.

Contacted, Civil Surgeon Rafiqul Islam said they will investigate the matter and take actions against the offenders.

Dr Shafiul Alama and Dr Kaniz Fatema were yesterday transferred to Khansama Upazila Health Complex in Dinajpur.
