Boy found dead

Police yesterday recovered a body of a teenage boy from an abandoned plot at Hazaribagh in the capital.

Police recovered the body of Md Shumon, 15, son of Mintu Miah, a rickshaw puller, of Jhauchar of Hazaribagh at about 7:00pm.

Shumon had been missing since Wednesday noon, said his father Mintu Miah.

Rafiqul Islam, OC of the police station, said locals informed police of the matter. They also claimed that they saw two of the victim's friends moving suspiciously near the plot on Wednesday night.

19 workers freed on 15-day confinement

A brickfield owner yesterday released 19 workers after keeping them in confinement for 15 days in a small dark house at Paindong in Fatikchhari upazila, Chittagong.

Sensing a drive by Rapid Action Battalion (Rab), Azizul Haque Chowdhury, owner of Aziz Modern Brickfield, freed the workers and instantly fled the area.

Sources said Azizul appointed the 19 workers in his brickfield for six months on October 16 (Kartik 1) and promised to pay them Tk 15 lakh on contract.

But Aziz gave only Tk 9.80 lakh and kept them confined on April 26 as the contact period expired and the workers started claiming the overdue.

The labourers, including two child workers, were forced to work in the day and to stay in a small dark house in the night.

Sariful Islam, a confined worker, managed to escape the captivity on April 28 and informed Human Rights Foundation (HRF) of his fellows.

On information from HRF, a team of Rab-7 went to the brickfield at Paindong in Fatikchhari yesterday to raid it.

Maj Ashfaq, who led the team, said the workers left the brickfield before their drive.

"No one can confine any man," said Ashfaq. "Our drives will continue against such kind of violation of human rights."

Shariful filed a case accusing four persons including Azizul, the brickfield owner, its manager Alam and another two with Fatikchhari Police Station in this connection.

Contacted, the brickfield owner Azizul denied the allegation and said he made full payment to the workers.

Campaign for saving Dhaka rivers starts today

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) starts public awareness campaign in and around the city today to save four rivers spending Tk 50 lakh.

At the backdrop of severe pollution in the rivers and rampant encroachment, members of the civil society and mass media are demanding the government to save the rivers.

The campaign is a part of the government initiative to save the four rivers around the capital -- the Buriganga, Shitalakha, Balu and Turag -- from wholesale grabbing and severe industrial and household pollution.

The National River Tasks Force that the present government restructured after taking the office decided to launch the campaign among the city dwellers for saving rivers.

"It is not possible to clean the river in a day or two. But we believe if we continue our efforts of saving the rivers, someday the rivers will get their life back," said Shipping Minister Shahjahan Khan, at a press conference at BIWTA auditorium in the city.

Sanzida Khanam, MP, the convener of the

river campaign sub committee and Abdul Malek, chairman of BIWTA and secretary general of the sub-committee, were present at the press conference.

BIWTA, the implementation agency of the campaign, has selected 16 strategic points along the river banks where a professional theater teams will perform street theaters from today.

The month long campaign will also include public exhibition of documentary on rivers, folk song, public announcement by loud speakers as well as beating drums.

The strategic points are Sadarghat Terminal, Kamrangir Char, Kamalbagh, Gabtoli, Ashulia, Tongi river area, Demra, Kanchpur, Narayanganj, Mirkadim river area, Fatullah Launch Ghat, Shayambazar, Shayampur, Aganagar, Shuvadaya and Kholamura.

Under the campaign, BIWTA also will arrange talk show on rivers, telecasting fillers, and documentary on televisions, sticking posters, stickers, screen banners, festoons, stand festoons, and disseminating messages through billboards.

They will also invite NGOs to organise human chains, rallies and street processions urging to save the rivers.

'71 war heroes want justice before death
