

## Khaleda flies to London today

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia leaves Dhaka for London this morning en route to the US on a two-week visit. This will be her first trip to the UK and the US after the 2008 election debacle.

She will meet her elder son and BNP's Senior Vice Chairman Tarique Rahman, who is undergoing medical treatment in London since September 2008, party leaders said.

They hoped a number of high profile meetings will be held between Khaleda and top-level officials of both countries.

After a week's stay in London, she will take off for the US on May 21 and is expected to return home on May 29.

BNP Vice-chairman Shamser Mobin Chowdhury, chairperson's Advisers Osman Farruk, Sabihuddin Ahmed and Abdul Awal Mintoo, journalist Shafiq Rehman, among others, will accompany her during the visit.

## No rule to appoint CJ based on seniority

Awami League (AL) Presidium Member Obaidul Quader yesterday said there is no provision in the service rules of the Supreme Court regarding appointment of Chief Justice based on seniority.

He also dismissed BNP's allegation that rules were violated in appointing the Chief Justice and accused the main opposition of propagandizing against the government over the issue.

"It's not right that laws or rules were violated in appointing the new Chief Justice. Without reading the service rules of the Supreme Court, BNP leaders are making misleading statements over the issue," said the AL policymaker while speaking at a discussion at Dhaka Reporters' Unity.

The PM and her entourage members will take off in the morning for Doha enroute to Geneva, foreign ministry sources told the news agency yesterday.

During her four-day visit, the PM will address WMO's high level segment on May 16 and address the assembly on May 17.

The WMO congress, a specialised UN agency, will discuss issues on weather, climate change, water, environment, natural hazards and gender.

## Youth held for making video on rape

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab-7) yesterday arrested a youth from his house at Masterpara in Halishahar of the port city for blackmailing a housewife.

Upon arrest Sajib Debnath, 25, son of late Sudhangshu Debnath, was handed over to Halishahar police for further legal action.

Sources said Sajib made a relationship with a woman in 2007 while she used to bring and take her daughter to and from an art school in Halishahar area.

Sajib was a teacher at the school.

He used to go to her house often in absence of her husband. On December 2009, Sajib raped the woman and videotaped it.

The culprit threatened the woman that he would upload it on the Internet if she did not pay him money.

So far Sajib had realised Tk 2.5 lakh in several instalments from the victim and putting pressure on her to pay more money.

As her husband learned the matter, he made a complaint to Rab-7 headquarters.

A team of Rab-7 led by its Commanding Officer (CO) Lt Col Abu Hena Md Mostafa Kamal raided Sajib's residence and made the arrest yesterday.

ASP Nurul Huda of Rab-7 said Sajib confessed his crime in primary interrogation. The husband of the woman filed a case.

## 350 tolas of gold jewellery stolen from shop

On the occasion, a memorial meeting will be held at the Liberation War Museum in the city at 5:00pm today, says a press release.

He passed away on this day in 1998.

Shawkat Osman fought against communalism, extremism and anti-liberation forces during his lifetime.

He was born in Hugli of West Bengal in India. He had enriched the Bangla literature with his write-ups, which cover a number of segments of literature.

## BSC ship set to sail

Banglar Urmi, a cargo vessel of Bangladesh Shipping Corporation (BSC) lying idle for 27 months, is set to sail on Monday after being repaired for five months under management of Army Welfare Trust.

BSC chartered its two ships -- Banglar Urmi and Banglar Gourav -- each around 13,000 deadweight tonnage, to the trust five months ago through a five-year contract of US \$ 500 per day for each under Bareboat Charter.

Under the charter, the trust would bear all voyage related costs, including vessel fuel, port dues, operations, maintenance, appointing crews and insurance.

After signing a Memorandum of Understanding, the trust began repairing the vessels, aided by BSC engineering department, using local technology to make them fit for sailing. The trust would use the ships to transport goods produced by its different factories, said sources.

Major General Abu Belal Muhammad Shafiqul Huq, chairman of Management Committee of Army Welfare Trust, visited Banglar Urmi anchored at River Mooring No-10 in Patenga of Chittagong yesterday to oversee repair works.

The trust Managing Director Brig Gen Arif Ahmed Chowdhury and BSC Managing Director Commodore Moksumul Kader accompanied him.

Arif, talking to reporters, said repairing the two ships would cost less than the presumed Tk 15 crore due to use of local technology and Banglar Gourav would likely go into operation at the end of June.

Moksumul said BSC was not able to "provide" such a big amount to repair the ships.
