#### 3 bodies recovered from river

UNB, Munshiganj  
Bodies of three unidentified young men were recovered from Dhaleswari River near Munshiganj launch terminal yesterday morning. Police said local people found the bodies floating in mid river at around 11 am and informed them. Later, police recovered the bodies and sent those to hospital morgue for autopsy. Police suspected that the young men might have been killed in boat capsizing during nor'wester.

#### Students clash with bus staff

At least 30 people were injured yesterday noon as students of Patuakhali Science and Technology University (PSTU) clashed with bus staffs. The incident took place after a bus staff assaulted Saiful, a student of computer science and engineering for refusing to pay increased bus fare. Hearing this, many PSTU students put up barricade on Patuakhali-Baufal via Dumki road from 1.00am to 3.00pm. The agitated students vandalised a Patuakhali-bound passenger bus. The students and bus staff locked in clash and the situation worsened around 2.00pm when policemen assaulted some PSTU teachers who were trying to calm the agitating students.

#### 26 arrested from border

Bangladesh Border Guard (BGB) personnel arrested 26 people including 7 women and two children from Baro Achra and Sadipur border at Benapole while they were entering Bangladesh illegally from India early yesterday. BGB nayek subedar Liakat Ali at Benapole check post said, acting on a tip off, they raided Baro Achra and Sadipur and arrested them. The arrestees are Alpana Begum, 18, Shahida Khatun, 17, Rafiza Begum, 18, Kabita Begum, 20, Rahima Khatun, 16, Fatema Begum, 21, Hasina Khatun, 19, Yasin Sarder, 25, Miran Sheikh, 30, Rafiq Sheikh, 35, Rassel Mondal, 38, Aga Khan, 40, Habib Sheikh, 35, Humayun, 5, Kabir, 8, Mithul Sheikh, 29, Golam Hossain, 37, Rabbani, 30, Selim Hossain, 36, Abdul Halim, 28, Faruq Hossain, 27, Aatur Rahman, 33, Khawaja Mollah, 28, Shafiqul Alam, 24, Habibur, 34, and Shariful Islam, 29. The arrestees hailed from different areas of Jessore, Khulna, Barisal and Narail districts. All were later handed over to Benapole port police.

#### Two electrocuted in Khulna

Two people were electrocuted in separate incidents in Boira area of the city and Paikgachha upazila Friday night. The deceased were identified as Humayun Kabir, 40, son of Gofur Mollah of the city's Agrani Bank colony area and Shahidul Islam, 35, of Satkhira district. Police said Humayun came in contact with a live electric wire while working at an under construction building in bank colony area at about 7pm. He was rushed to Khulna Medical College Hospital where he died at around 8pm. In another incident Shahidul Islam got electric shock while repairing an electric wire at Kapilbuni village in Paikgachha upazila. He died on way to a local hospital.

#### 9 Nilphamari gamblers jailed

A mobile court here sentenced nine men to one month jail each for gambling at a club at Babur Hat bazaar in Dimla upazila town on Friday night. Some locals brought the matter to the notice of the upazila nirbahi officer (UNO) of Dimla and requested him to take action. Responding to their request, Dimla UNO with a contingent of police, raided the club office at midnight and arrested nine gamblers from the spot. Later at a mobile court, the UNO, also executive magistrate Mizanur Rahman handed down the punishment.

#### 4 jailed for smuggling

A special tribunal in Chuadanga on Monday afternoon sentenced four people to six months rigorous imprisonment (RI) for smuggling diesel. They were also fined Tk 3,000 each, in default, to suffer more six months in jail. The convicts are Faridul Islam, Adam Ali, Wahiduzzaman and Abdul Rashid of Thakurpur in Damurhuda upazila. According to prosecution, a team of the then BDR on December 28, 2005, raided Osmanpur-Sadabari border point on information that a group were smuggling diesel to India. The BDR recovered 360 litre diesel and arrested four people.

## 2 housewives killed for dowry, another rescued after hours of torture

Two housewives were murdered for dowry on Friday and Tuesday while another was rescued on Friday after 14 hours of torture allegedly by husbands and in-laws.  
A housewife was tortured to death allegedly by her husband and in-laws at Mirzapur village in Chowgachha upazila of Jessore on Friday night.  
The deceased was identified as Selina Khatun, 20, wife of Kamruzzaman of the village, reports UNB.  
Police and local sources said Kamruzzaman married Selina, daughter of Sarat Ali, of the neighboring village a year ago. Soon after the marriage, Kamruzzaman and his family members started torturing Selina demanding dowry money.  
On the fateful night, Kamruzzaman and his brother Alauddin following a quarrel over the issue, beat up Selina mercilessly leaving her dead on the spot.  
At one stage they poured poison into Selina's mouth to prove that she had committed suicide.  
In Nilphamari, another housewife was murdered allegedly by her husband for dowry at Para village in Domar upazila early Tuesday.  
The deceased was identified as Putul, 25, wife of Dulal Hossain of the village.  
Police quoting locals said Dulal married Putul, daughter of Jasim Uddin of Bhagini village in Debiganj upazila of Panchagarh district nine

years back. Dulal took Tk 73,000 as dowry.  
Soon after the marriage Dulal and his family members started torturing her for more money and a bicycle.  
On the fateful night he picked up a quarrel with her over the issue. At one stage he beat up her mercilessly and strangled her to death.  
Later, Dulal hanged the body of Putul from a tree adjacent to his house to prove that she had committed suicide.  
In Kurigram, a housewife was rescued after 14 hours of brutal torture perpetrated on her allegedly by her husband and in-laws at Nijai Khamar village in Ulipur upazila early Friday.  
The victim was identified as Shahnaz Parvin, 30, wife of Abu Saeed, 35, of the village.  
Local people said Abu Sayeed, son of Hafez Mia married Shahnaz Parvin, daughter of Alhaz Solaiman Mia of Doldolia village of the upazila in 2000. Since then her in-laws used to torture her on flimsy grounds, they said.  
Neighbours said, on Thursday noon, her in-laws picked up a quarrel with Shahnaz over a trifling matter and after brutal torture tied her up with a rope in her room.  
Hearing the shrill cry of Shahnaz, locals rushed in but they were refrained from entering the house.  
Meanwhile, the twin daughters of Shahnaz escaped from the scene and informed their maternal uncle about the incident who at once informed the police.  
Police rescued Shahnaz at 2am Friday and admitted her to Ulipur health complex.

## JCD leader hacked to death

A Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) leader has been hacked to death in Bera upazila of the district.  
Police yesterday recovered his decomposed body from Kazirhat bailey bridge point of the Jamuna River.  
The deceased was identified as Shafikul Islam Shafique, 32, son of Hossain Biswas, of Nandanpur village in Santhia upazila. He was organising secretary of Santhia upazila unit Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), sources said.  
"Shafique was the organising secretary of JCD Santhia upazila unit. He was recently expelled temporarily from the party," Hasanur Rahman Rony, organising secretary of the district unit JCD said. We heard that Shafique went missing a few days ago, Rony added.  
Contacted, police said no complaint was filed with Santhia police station in connection with his missing.  
"We have heard the news of his missing but we did not get any complaint. The vic-

tim's family did not inform the police." SM Bazlur Rashid, officer-in-charge of Santhia police station said.  
Although Shafique is an accused in four cases but he is not a listed criminal as per police record, the OC added.

## KILLING OF JUBO DAL LEADER BIPUL

# Kurigram BNP to enforce half-day hartal today

Kurigram district unit of BNP will enforce a half-day hartal in the town today demanding arrest and exemplary punishment of the killers of Jubo Dal leader Kamal Ahmed Bipul.  
A gang of five allegedly led by town Tarun League convener Mashud and Jubo League activist Shahin swooped on Kamal Ahmed Bipul, 32, vice-president of Jubo Dal Kurigram Sadar upazila unit, in Power House area at around 3:00pm on Thursday.  
They beat him up and hit on the head with iron rod. Locals rescued Bipul and took him to Kurigram Sadar Hospital. As Bipul's condition deteriorated, he was shifted to Rangpur Medical College and Hospital (RMCH) at around 6:00pm and then referred to Dhaka Medical

College and Hospital (DMCH) where he died on Friday morning.  
Locals said the attack was a sequel to a conflict between Bipul and the Jubo League and Tarun League men over control of Khalilganj area in the town.  
Hearing the news, local leaders and activists of BNP and its associate bodies took out a procession in the town at around 8:00am on Friday and blocked Kurigram-Dhaka highway.  
The road blockade was withdrawn at around 3:30 after lawmaker from Kurigram-2 constituency and General Secretary of Awami League district unit Md Jafar Ali, Deputy Commissioner Md Habibur Rahman and Police Superintendent Md Mahbubur Rahman visited the victim's

house and assured the bereaved family of taking the killers to book.  
District BNP Joint Secretary Sohel Hosnin Kaikobad said Bipul came under attack by Jubo League and Tarun League activists while he was going to his in a rickshaw at 3.00pm on Thursday.  
The first namaj-e-janaza for Kamal Ahmed Bipul was held on the premises of district BNP office at 9:00am yesterday. After the second namaj-e-janaza at Khalilganj High School ground near his house at around 11:30am, he was buried at Kurigram central graveyard.  
Bipul's brother Reaz Uddin Ahmed yesterday filed a case with Kurigram Police Station against five Tarun League and Jubo League men. They are Masud (1), Shahin, Masud (2), Rustam and Babu.

## 'Allocate more funds for Rajshahi city'

Hundreds of people formed a human chain in the city yesterday demanding special allocation of funds in the upcoming budget for development of Rajshahi city and welfare of the city dwellers.  
They demanded allocation of funds for implementation of North Rajshahi Irrigation Project (NRIP), construction of the Ganges Barrage, development of healthcare facilities, supply of natural gas, introduction of town service buses and a cricket test venue in Rajshahi.  
Organised by Rajshahi Rakkha Sangram Parishad (RRSP) at Shaheb Bazar zero point, Mayor AHM Khairuzaman Liton and lawmaker Fazle Hossain Badsha also joined the human chain and expressed their solidarity with the demands.  
Addressing a rally at the venue, Mayor AHM Khairuzaman Liton stressed the need for implementation of NRIP. He said the project work should start immediately as desertification process is going on in Rajshahi due to excessive use of ground water.  
Lawmaker Fazle Hossain Badsha demanded reopening of all mills and factories that were closed during BNP-Jamaat rule, leaving hundreds of people jobless. He also demanded introduction of an intensive care unit at Rajshahi Medical College and Hospital.  
Freedom fighter Dr Abdul Mannan, teacher Taslima Hossain, councillor Belal Ahmed, district unit Mohila Parishad General Secretary Kalpona Roy and RRSP Generals Secretary Jamat Khan also spoke at the rally with RRSP President Liakat Ali in the chair.
