

2 schoolboys killed after abduction

Police in Faridpur and Netrakona recovered decomposed bodies of two allegedly abducted schoolboys yesterday and the day before.

Modhukhali police in Faridpur yesterday recovered the decomposed body of Faisal, 11, from a septic tank behind the Dumain union health and family welfare centre under the upazila after one month of abduction.

Faisal was a student of class four at Dumain Govt Primary School in Modhukhali and son of the freedom fighter Sheikh Abdus Sattar of Dumain village, reports our correspondent.

Syed Mohsinul Haque, officer in-charge of Modhukhali police station said, a team recov-

ered the body of Faisal from a septic tank. The body was found inside a sack. Faisal was killed after abduction and later dropped into the septic tank by the criminals, the OC said.

Family source sad, Faisal was abducted on 15 April from a playground adjacent to his house. A case was filed with Modhukhali police station the next day. Later police held two suspects Jahangir Alam Palash and Murad and sent them to jail.

In last one month, locals formed several human chains, staged token hunger strike, held processions demanding rescue of Faisal, but to no effect.

In Netrakona, police recovered the decomposed body of schoolboy Mahfujur Rahman Himel, 14, from Kuarpur village under Kalmakanda upazila on Saturday, seven days into his abduction.

Himel was son of Mahbubur Rahman of

Kuarpur village, reports our correspondent.

Police and local people said two unknown criminals, riding a motorbike reached in front of Himel's house at around 6.30pm on May 7 and picked the boy from there.

Himel's father Mahbubur Rahman filed a general diary (GD) with Kalmakanda police station the same night.

Locals found the decomposed body of Himel in a paddy field of the village at around 12.30pm and informed the police. Police recovered the body and sent it to local hospital for autopsy.

Contacted, officer-in-charge (OC) of Kalmakanda police station Khan Humayun Kabir said they will unearth the clue to the murder as early as possible.

Jubo League activist killed in Sylhet

Criminals killed an activist of Awami Jubo League, youth front of the ruling Awami League (AL) in the city's Islampur area on Saturday night.

The dead was identified as Abdul Mannan, 32, son of Abdul Quadir of Falguni residential area.

Family sources said at about 7:00 pm, Mannan went out of the house and at about 10:30 pm they received a phone call. It said that Mannan's body was lying at an under-construction house near Islampur bazaar.

On information, police and Rab officials went to the area. They recovered the body that bore several marks of stab wounds on his chest.

The deceased was accused in a number of criminal cases including that of robbery, locals and police said. Recently his relation with one of his close aides went sour, they said.

However, Mannan's father hinted that the murder might have taken place over the upcoming union parishad (UP) election as Mannan's maternal uncle was contesting the polls.

University student hacked to death in Manikganj

A university student was hacked to death at Ramonpur village in Sadar upazila on Saturday night.

Victim Imran Hossain was a student of LLB of Savar Gono Biswabidyaloy and son of Habibur Rahman, a school teacher of the village.

Police and family sources said, Imran was called out of his house by his friend Selim, 28, son of Noab Ali of the village at around 9:00 pm.

Later Imran was found in a critically injured condition beside a bridge, only 100 yards away from his house, at around 9:30 pm.

He was rushed to Manikganj Sadar Hospital where the on-duty doctor referred him to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital. But Imran died on

the way to Dhaka at around 11:30 pm, they said.

The body was taken to Manikganj Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsy.

Victim's father Habibur Rahman yesterday filed a murder case with Manikganj police station accusing Babu, Selim and some unidentified others.

In the case, he stated that a youth complained

to him about six months ago that Imran had the habit of smoking. When Imran came to know this he went to the house of Babu and engaged in a quarrel with him.

After the incident, Babu threatened to kill Imran, the statement said adding that Babu planned and hired Selim and others to kill his son.

Sub-inspector of Manikganj Sadar police station, also investigating officer (IO) of the case Kamal Hossain said the criminals hit on Imran's head with sharp weapons making him unconscious within seconds. Previous enmity might be the reason behind the killing, the IO said.

Police said, they arrested Selim for quizzing and trying to nab Babu.

LIMON MISHRA MURDER IN DINAJPUR 'Killers' move freely under the nose of law enforcers

The accused in Limon Mishra murder case are moving freely under the nose of the law enforcers and putting pressure on the victim's family to withdraw the case.

A gang of stalkers stabbed Limon Mishra, 28, of Baragurgola area in Dinajpur town in front of Lily Square at around 7:00pm on May 4 as he protested teasing of his wife Indu Banerjee, a third year management student of Dinajpur Government College, on her way to the college earlier on the day.

Limon was rushed to Dinajpur Medical College and Hospital where he succumbed to his injuries at around 10:30pm.

Limon's father Phani Mishra filed a case with Dinajpur Police Station

against eight people the same night and one of the accused named Sumon Sarker, 23, son of Montu Sarker of Rajbari area in the town, was arrested in the early hours of May 5.

Other accused in the case are Rubel Rahman, 26, Ajoy Shil, 24, Tanmoy Goswami, 23, Bakul, 26, Rajan, 24, Sumon Prosad, 22, and Subir, 21.

Victim's family and locals alleged that the accused are still at large and joining

different programmes in the town. Of them, Rubel Rahman, joint convener of the newly formed district unit of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), was seen in a procession in the town on Wednesday last, they said.

Lawmaker Iqbalur Rahim, Deputy Commissioner Md Jamal Uddin Ahmed Police Superintendent Md Mostafizur Rahman and senior ruling party political leaders visited Limon's house on May 5 and expressed their sympathy for the bereaved family.

Although they assured the victim's family of bringing the culprits to book, police are yet to take any steps to nab them, locals further alleged.

Contacted, Officer-in-Charge of Dinajpur Kotwali Police Station Hasan Shamim Iqbal said drive is on to arrest the criminals.

16 sued on charge of Pabna JCD leader murder

Sixteen people were sued yesterday on charge of killing JCD leader Shafikul Islam Shafique.

Bera police recovered the decomposed body of Shafique from Kazirhat bailey bridge point of the Jamuna River in Bera upazila on Saturday evening.

"The body was sent to Pabna Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy. On completion of autopsy, it was handed to the victim's family yesterday," Sub-Inspector Johir Uddin, in

charge of Aminpur police camp under Bera upazila said.

Meanwhile, the officer in-charge (OC) of Santhia police station SM Bazlur Rashid said that the victim's family filed a case yesterday accusing 16 people of the village.

Victim's mother Sufia Khatun filed the case at noon, the OC said.

"In the case, the complainant claimed that a clash took place on May 10 over setting up an electric pole in the village. At that time a few people threatened to kill

Shafique. Later he was abducted from Bera CNB bus stand on May 11", Santhia OC said.

Police is investigating the matter and the drive is on to nab the criminals, he added.

Criminals hacked to death Shafikul Islam Shafique, 32, son of Hossain Biswas of Nandanpur village in Santhia upazila, also organising secratery of Santhia upazila unit Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) and dumped the body into Jamuna river.

Police recovered the body from the river at Kazirhat point in Bera upazila on Saturday evening.
