## New CJ takes oath today

Newly appointed Chief Justice Md Muzammel Hossain will be sworn in today.

President Zillur Rahman will administer the oath at Bangabhaban in the morning, said Anisur Rahman, an assistant registrar of Supreme Court, yesterday.

Justice Muzammel Hossain, a senior judge of the Appellate Division, will be the 20th chief justice of the country. He will retire on January 16, 2015.

The new chief justice succeeded Justice ABM Khairul Haque who went into retirement yesterday.

## Factory evicted for pollution in Gazipur

The Department of Environment (DoE) yesterday evicted a factory and instantly realised Tk 7 lakh as compensation for polluting the environment at Kewa West Kanda village in Sreepur upazila, Gazipur.

DoE Director (enforcement) Munir Chowdhury led a drive and seized eight tonnes of different pollutant materials from "Imam Metal" and arrested the factory's owner Imam Ali.

Rab-2 members accompanied the team

during the drive, which was conducted following news reports telecast in an electronic media on Monday, says a DoE release.

Imam Metal was set up over one acre of farmland surrounding fruit gardens without permission of the DoE.

Since its inception, the factory has been discharging toxic gas into the air, polluting an adjacent area of some 1,600 acres.

The inhabitants alleged that their crop production become halved due to the toxic gas release. It also causes different diseases including breathing complications.

## Children seek helpline connection

Children at a human chain programme yesterday demanded of the government to connect the child helpline number 1098 with all mobile phone operators.

They demanded the facility so that underprivileged children and children from well-off families can receive help from this toll-free child helpline if they face oppression.

Aparajeyo-Bangladesh, a non-government organisation working for the disadvantaged children, organised the programme in front of the Jatiya Press club in the city marking World Telecommunication and Helpline Day, says a press release.

Speakers at the event said government and Aparajeyo-Bangladesh jointly inaugurated the helpline, which is now operating in eight upazilas in the country, but the service is only available from BTCL phones.



## WTO chief lauds Sheikh Hasina

World Trade Organisation (WTO) Director-General Pascal Lamy yesterday appreciated Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's leadership to give Bangladesh a strong base for economic development.

He termed Sheikh Hasina a great leader under whose leadership Bangladesh would be able to achieve sustainable growth in all aspects.

Pascal Lamy made the comments while having a meeting with Hasina at her hotel suit.

Prime Minister's Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad briefed on the meeting.

Hasina told the WTO chief that Bangladesh has failed to achieve its expected development in the last 40 years in the absence of uninterrupted democracy.

She said the present government is working relentlessly for the overall development of the country.

The economic condition of the country at present is better than ever although Bangladesh has faced the adverse situation during the recent economic recession, said Hasina.

Also discussed were issues of climate change, education, healthcare, food security, regional peace, regional cooperation, regional connectivity, vaccination, good governance, and information technology.

Foreign Minister Dr Dipu Moni, Ambassador-at-Large M Ziauddin, and Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister MA Karim were present during the meeting.

Later, the prime minister had a meeting with the executive director of Global Fund and discussed AIDS, Malaria, Immunisation, and related issues.

Health Minister AFM Ruhal Haque and Prime Minister's Health Adviser Prof Dr Syed Modassar Ali were present during the meeting.

## Drug peddlers active at 374 city points

More than 400 drug peddlers are running the illegal business at about 374 spots across Dhaka city, according to intelligence sources.

A number of godfathers, including two incumbent ward commissioners of Dhaka City Corporation and one listed absconding "top terror", control the whole chain of drug trade.

Drug addicts, mostly youngsters including both male and female gather at different drug sale points from afternoon till mid-night.

Despite law enforcers' routine and special raids, the drug trade situation virtually keeps unchanged as most of the arrested drug dealers resume their businesses after securing bails from courts.

According to court sources, the arrested drug peddlers came out of jail due to loopholes in police reports

produced in connection with the cases.

Department of Narcotics Control sources said the drugs seized amounts to only 10 percent of the total drugs being smuggled into the country.

Some one-lakh people are engaged in this illegal drug trade and 30 percent of those arrested on charges of drug peddling are women and children, added the sources.

Intelligence sources said most of the drugs, being sold in the drug dens, include heroin, cannabis, and phensidyl since addicts prefer those while Yaba is a "fashion drug".

Intelligence sources said the highest number of illegal drug spots have been identified in Jatrabari, Demra, Shyampur and Kadamtoli where 93 drug dens have been spotted.

Another 72 drug dens have been found in Dhanmondi, Hazaribagh, and New Market while 49 others are being run in Pallabi.

Sources said seven points have been spotted in Ramna, 14 in Motijheel and Paltan, 12 in Lalbagh and Kamrangichar, 10 in Kotwali, seven in Sutrapur, 11 in Sabujbagh and Khilgaon, 20 in Gulshan, Badda, Khilkhet and Cantonment, six in Mohammadpur and Adabor, 10 in Mirpur, Shah Ali and Darus Salam, 22 in Uttara, Torag, Uttar Khan and Dakhin Khan, 15 in Biman Bandar and 20 drug points in Shahbagh.

One of most wanted "top terror" Trimoti Suvrata Bain, who is believed to be hiding in India, controls the drug den in Ramna.

Over 17 drug peddlers have been identified in Tejgaon who run the illegal trade at Kawran Bazar Road, Rail Line slums and others areas. Most of the drugs, especially phensidyl and cannabis, are being ferried there by trains.
