Call to prepare people's participatory budget

Speakers underlined the need for preparing people's participatory national budget for reflecting the hopes and aspirations of the people in general.

They said making the budgeting process decentralised could be the effective means of attaining the goal of a democratic budget.

They were addressing a regional workshop titled "Budget decentralisation" jointly organised by Democratic Budget Movement (DBM) and ActionAid Bangladesh at the conference hall of Rajshahi Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

DBM member Foyzullah Chowdhury gave an overview of the workshop highlighting various aspects of the democratic budget while DBM activist Monwar Mostofa presented a concept paper on the budgeting process and its implementation.

Lawmaker Omar Faruque Chowdhury addressing the programme as the chief guest emphasised the need for identifying the local needs through proper assessment everywhere in the region and brings those under budgetary allocation for the sake of reducing its disparity.

He said some vital sectors of the region like setting up an agro-based export processing zone, the proposed North Rajshahi Irrigation Project and natural gas supply should be brought under the budgetary allocation.

Besides, he called for giving top priority to

infrastructure development, creation of investment-friendly atmosphere and availability of business related support in the forthcoming national budget to support different industries in the region.

In this regard, he said the budget should be pro-people and welfare-oriented to bring economic solvency of the people.

Faruque said enhanced priority to trade and industrial sector could be the effective way toward accelerating the region's economic growth.

Prof Noman of Economics Department of Rajshahi University, Additional Chief Medical Officer of RU Dr FMA Zahid, political leaders Abul Kalam Azad, Shafiqur Rahman and Mosaddeque Hossain and businessman Sekendar Ali spoke as panel discussants.

Country Director of ActionAid Bangladesh Farah Kabir moderated the discussion.

Taking part in the open discussion most of the speakers underscored the need for strengthening the local government institutions for the sake of bringing the grassroots people under all the nation-building process.

They also stressed ensuring transparency and accountability in the budget implementation sector so that the people could derive total benefits of the development budget.

Road crashes kill 7, injure 58

Seven people were killed and 58 others injured in road accidents in Dhaka, Dinaipur, Sirajganj, and Narayanganj yesterday and Monday night.

Our staff correspondent reports: An activist of Hawkers' League, wing of ruling Awami League (AL), was killed after being run over by a bus at Kakrail in the city last evening.

Dead is Lat Mia, 30, publicity secretary of 18 No. Ward Hawkers' League of Shahjadpur, Gulshan.

Lat Mia was returning home after participating in a rally held in celebration of Sheikh Hasina's Homecoming Day yesterday.

At the city's Manda, a teenage boy was killed after a truck knocked him down last night. Deceased is Md Sohel, 14, of Manda. He was declared dead at Dhaka Medical College Hospital. The boy used to serve an office in Motijheel.

At the city's Mohammadpur, a man was killed and a woman and her child injured as a truck ran over the man and hit a rickshaw on Monday night.

Deceased is Saidul Mondal, 30, a private car driver and a resident of Basila, Mohammadpur.

Our Dinaipur correspondent adds:

A motorcyclist was killed and another man injured as the motorcycle collided head-on with a truck on Birampur-Ketra road at Chakdurgapur of Birampur upazila on Monday night.

Dead is Umar Ali, 40, of Polashbari village of Birampur upazila. The injured was admitted to Birampur Upazila Health Complex in critical condition.

Subhash Chandra Roy, 52, the deceased, was a deputy assistant agriculture officer of Daulatpur upazila.

War history to be destroyed if AL not in power

Says state minister

State Minister for Liberation War Affairs Captain (Retd) Tajul Islam yesterday said if Awami League does not come to power, the history of Liberation War would be destroyed.

"Every government after killing of Bangabandhu distorted the history of the War of Liberation," he said, adding "The nation is now enjoying the benefit of the War of Liberation after 40 years of independence as Awami League is in power".

Tajul said this while addressing a discussion organised by Bangladesh Enterprise for Development and Security Studies (BEDSS) on the occasion of Awami League President and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's Homecoming Day at Dhaka Reporter's Unity (DRU) in the city. Bangladesh Muktiyoddha Central

Command Council Chairman Major General (Retd) Helal Morshed Khan Bir Bikram and Awami League Organising Secretary Ahmed Hossain spoke at the function with Dr Quamrul Islam in the chair.

Reiterating the present government's commitment to preserve the history and spirit of the Liberation War, Tajul said the government would take all measures to protect the country's history.

He said the government is working for changing the lots of toiling masses. But, BNP has started hatching conspiracy to create anarchy in the country when people are living in peace.

He urged the people to remain careful about the conspiracy of the opposition and said "The freedom fighters will resist every conspiracy against the country".
