Biman in severe cash crunch

Borrows Tk 20cr from bank to pay staff salaries

Biman Bangladesh Airlines faces a severe financial crisis that compelled it to borrow Tk 20 crore from a local bank to pay salaries to its 2,600 staff in April.

The national carrier owes more than Tk 20 crore to Padma Oil while its London office is in debt of over Tk 49 crore to different airports and organisations, said Biman officials.

It also owes over Tk 125 crore to the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh, said Biman Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer Muhammad Zakiul



Islam.

Biman has remained in the red for the last three and a half years after it had accumulated Tk 510 crore in cash reserves in February 2008.

The airline is now in a "near bankrupt situation," a top Biman official told The Daily Star, preferring anonymity.

Biman's earnings from ticket sales fell by more than Tk 100 crore between January 17 and April 30 this year. The drop in sales resulted mainly from a hike in airfares on international routes effected from January 17 without any market

190 FAKE STAFF OF MUJIBNAGAR GOVT JS body stops probe into 2 ministries' role

A parliamentary body has decided not to move further with the issue of appointing 190 fake employees of Mujibnagar government as sub-registrars under the law ministry in 2009.

The parliamentary standing committee on law, justice and parliamentary affairs ministry on Thursday backtracked from its decision to examine the role of public administration and law ministries as some "bigwigs" of the ministries were involved with the scam, sources in the committee claimed.

"The committee has limitations. So, we asked the law ministry to settle the matter by ensuring justice to all in a realistic way,"

Suranjit Sengupta, chief of the parliamentary committee, told The Daily Star yesterday without explaining the "limitations".

He also said if the beneficiaries of the scam are guilty then those who provided the benefit are also guilty.

Meanwhile, on condition of anonymity a member of the committee said, "The fate of the appointment issue is now uncertain."

Earlier, on a recommendation of the parliamentary watchdog, the law ministry formed a committee on June 19 last year to look into the matter.

The enquiry revealed massive anomalies in the process of appointing 190 employees of the Mujibnagar

Mamata sworn in as W Bengal CM

Mamata Banerjee was yesterday sworn in as the first woman chief minister of Indian eastern state of West Bengal, heading a 38-member Trinamool Congress-Congress coalition government.

It marked a historic change of guard in the state ending a 34-year unremitting rule by CPI (M)-led Left Front.

West Bengal Governor MK Narayanan administered the oath to 55-year-old Mamata on the lawns of Raj Bhawan at 1:01pm.

The Trinamool chief chose the time as auspicious. Clad in her trademark white cotton saree, she took oath

58,000 Yaba tablets seized

Gas compressors in limbo

Petrobangla stalls 6-year-old compressor bid to push Russia in the deal; govt may fail to improve gas distribution system in its tenure

The third tender for installing gas compressors under an Asian Development Bank (ADB) loan is once again facing uncertainty as the authorities are refraining from okaying the bidder selection since February apparently to weigh an alternative deal with Russia.

Sources said by shelving the bidder selection at its matured stage, Petrobangla is pursuing a government-to-government deal

with Russia to award it the job of installing two compressors in Ashuganj and Elenga.

The third tender for this project was floated in August last year with \$110 ADB funding. The project's consultant evaluated technical bids of three companies and found just one company -- Hyundai of Korea -- qualified for the job. The consultant report was submitted in February but till now it was not placed before the board of the Gas Transmission Company

Ltd (GTCL) that is spearheading the project. The chairman of this board is also the chairman of Petrobangla.

Back in May 2009, the then Petrobangla chairman cancelled the second tender for three compressors by going against the opinion of the project consultant, and he led the government to award US oil company Chevron the deal for installing one such compressor on the gas pipeline system owned by the GTCL. Interestingly, Korean

company Hyundai had also won that tender.

If the contract was awarded back then, all the three compressors would have been nearly ready to improve drastically the country's unreliable gas transmission system.

Sources said ever since Hyundai emerged as the lowest bidder in the third tender, the authorities started going slow with the project. Instead, Petrobangla,
