DU to create Prof Hai fund

Seven killed in road crashes

Seven people were killed and 41 others injured in road accidents in Tangail, Savar, Dinajpur and Gazipur yesterday.

Our Tangail correspondent: Three people were killed and four others injured in a head-on collision between a microbus and an improvised three-wheeler at Charpara in Mirzapur, Tangail yesterday.

Deceased are Sabuj, 20, Shompa Akhter, 23, and Alamgir, 55. They were aboard the three-wheeler. The injured were taken to Kumudini Hospital in Mirzapur.

UNB from Savar reports: Two motorcyclists died on the spot after being knocked down by a bus at Baliarpur in front of Modhumoti Model Town in Savar, outskirts of the city, yesterday.

One of the deceased was identified as Anis Chowdhury, 40, a trader and resident of Mirpur in the city. Identity of the other could not be known.

Our Dinajpur correspondent adds: At least 37 people were wounded in a bus-truck collision near Motiara Bridge in Nawabganj upazila of Dinajpur yesterday.

Five of the injured were taken to Dinajpur Medical College Hospital in critical condition, 11 to Birampur Heath Complex, and 21 to Nawabganj Upazila Health Complex.

The critically hurt are the truck driver Md Arshad Ali 38, helper Jadu Mia 22, Abdur Rahim 18, Md Shafiqul Islam, 30, and Zia Mia, 22.

UNB from Gazipur adds: Two motorcyclists were killed when their motorbike was hit by a covered van at Sutrapur in Kaliakoir upazila on Saturday night.

The deceased were identified as Saiful Islam, 30, resident of Bharanda village in Sadar upazila and Jahirul Islam, 32, assistant store keeper of a garments in Kashimpur.

Local sources said two people died on the spot as a covered van hit their motorcycle on Dhaka-Tangail Highway at

about 8:00pm. Police later seized the covered van, but its driver and

helper managed to escape.

Saiful and Jahirul, both are friends, met the accident while they were going to Tangail from the district.

He was captured by locals on his way to India with victim Rashida Begum, 20, wife of Zinnat Sardar, a resident of Baruikhali Asrayan Kendra (shelter home) at 10:00am on Friday.

Locals handed him over to Dakop police later.

Police said Kishore seduced Rashida and was taking her to India with fake promise of lucrative job there.



Road links in CHT now easier

Road communication has become easier in Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT), as the majority of the Tk 105 croreinfrastructure development project to construct about 100 kilometre (km) of roads with small bridges and culverts is now complete.

Waterlogging in front of Ruposhi Bangla Hotel at Shahbagh in the city resulted from just a brief spell of rain last evening.

Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) is implementing the project in the three hill districts of Khagrachhari, Bandarban and Rangamati, to be complete by next year.

While visiting different areas in Matiranga and Panchhari upazilas of Khagrachhari district and sadar upazila of Rangamati district, people of the hill districts, especially in remote areas, were seen to be able to communicate with the mainland and also market with their produce easily.

Talking to this correspondent, local people said earlier they led a miserable life for lack of road communication in absence of development activities in

the hill districts under the previous governments. They said formerly people of the

region had to walk a long distance to go to the markets located at inaccessible areas, often with agricultural products which were damaged on the way. In Khagrachhari, several thousand

tribal people came under the communication network with the construction of a 13 km road from Matiranga Sadar to Gomoti Union. Champalika Tripura, 35, a tribal schoolteacher of Gomoti village, said people earlier had to walk to the

But now, they can go there by transport within 15 to 20 minutes as the distance came down to 13 km. "Local people can take their fruits, vegetables and other agricultural crops by transport to the market in the upazila headquarters. They now get


