**Manchester United boss Sir Alex Ferguson** and skipper Nemanja Vidic landed the Premier League manager and player of the season awards on Friday. Ferguson led United to their 12th Premier League title, and 19th English league success overall, plus the Champions League final while centreback Vidic has been key in United's defence.

Ferguson, 69, lands the top manager award from the Premier League sponsors for a ninth time, while 29-year-old Vidic has now been named player of the season twice in his United career.
