More low-cost flats for the middle class

Cabinet purchase body okays project to construct 168 flats in Dohar

The government is going to construct 168 residential flats for the middle income earners in Dohar upazila on the outskirts of the capital.

A meeting of the cabinet committee on purchase, yesterday chaired by Finance Minister AMA Muhith, also approved a proposal for procuring two choppers for Rab and extended the tenure of Pre-Shipment Inspection (PSI) companies.

The three 15-storey buildings will have 56 flats each with a floor area of 1,298 square feet.

The housing and public works ministry will pay Tk 53 crore to Navana Constructions Ltd, which got the job as the lowest bidder. Each flat will be built at a cost ofTk32 lakh.

The committee has also approved a proposal for building 360 flats, each measuring 1,336 square feet, for government officials in the capital's Mirpur.

Kushali Nirmata Ltd will also construct a 6-storey community centre for the residential project on payment of Tk 4.32 crore.

The committee has also nodded to the procurement of two choppers at a cost of Tk 90 crore to equip Rab for carrying out anticrime operations more efficiently.

Bell Helicopter Asia (Pte) Ltd will supply the copters to be purchased from the US. Moreover, the committee also extended

the tenure of four PSI companies till December next year. The companies are: SGS Societe Generale

de Surveillance SA, Bureau Veritas International SA, OMIC Overseas Merchandise Inspection Co Ltd, and Intertek International Ltd.

The committee meeting also okayed a proposal for constructing a 770m long bridge on the Titas River at Brahmanbaria at a cost of Tk 84 crore.

Call for coordinated efforts to manage water resources

Bangladesh Environmental Lawyers Association (Bela) held the workshop on "Integrated Floodplain Management in Bangladesh" at Brac Centre Inn in the city.

AKM Mozzamel Haque, chairman of parliamentarian standing committee on Ministry of Land, speaking as the chief guest, said the policy for water bodies is faulty, as the cabinet prepared it.

It is not possible to manage all kinds of water bodies using the policy as it mentions only some big water bodies. As the policy is faulty there is a scope for corruption in it, he said.

Integrated Floodplain Management is undertaken by Bela, Middlesex University Flood Hazard Research Centre, Banchte Shekha, Centre for Natural Resources Studies and MRAG, with the support from the UK department for international development's Research Into Use programme.

Dr Parvin Sultana and Dr Paul Thompson, senior research fellows of Middlesex University, said the project helped community-based organisations cultivate some sunflower, maize, wheat and garlic as an alternative of rice, costing less money and water.



80 new BRTC buses to hit city roads May 13

Eighty new buses will hit the city roads on Thursday amid an acute crisis for transport and a chaotic situation in transport sector since price of compressed natural gas was raised on May 13.

Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation (BRTC) imported the buses from South Korea while 85 more will arrive in June and 90 in August. The government plans to import 950 different types of buses from different countries by end of this year, said communications ministry officials.

These Korean buses costing Tk 70 lakh each excluding import tax are better than those from China which cost Tk 33 lakh. South Korean company Daewoo will assemble those, they added.

Communications Minister Syed Abul Hossain hoped that the increasing demand for transport in the city would greatly be eased after the new additions.

He said many of these buses would ply between the capital and various districts.

The government is also going to import a large number of Indian buses with loan from India. Among those are 300 doubledeckers, 100 single-deckers and 50 articulated buses, popularly known as bendy bus, the officials said.
