Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club moved to within a point of leaders Muktijodhha Sangsad with a 2-1 win over Farashganj Sporting Club in the Bangladesh League encounter at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

The star cast of Dhanmondi moved to 37 points from 16 matches, one behind Muktijoddha and two ahead of Abahani. It was the 1-0 reversal for the All Reds the previous day against Sheikh Russel that blew the title race wide open with six rounds of matches to go, and Sheikh Jamal pounced on the opportunity to cut the lead by winning this crucial encounter.

These two sides had met three times this season with Sheikh Jamal winning two of those encounters, but Farashganj won the most important one -- the semifinal of the Independence Cup in their last meeting. So

Sheikh Jamal, who were looking for a measure of revenge, came strongly out of the blocks and found the back of the net early in the ninth minute.

Winger Shakil Ahmed, who has arguably been the most eye-catching and consistent performer for the Dhanmondi club this season, scored the opener with a simple tap in from six yards after collecting a cross from Nasirul Islam from the left flank. This was Shakil's third goal against the Old Town club this season and interestingly all those three goals have come in three winning cause.

Farashganj, who have been a bit of a disappointment despite their heroic Independence Cup triumph, upped the ante and came within whiskers of an equaliser soon. Indeed, it was some brilliant goalkeeping from national goalkeeper Aminul Haque and some ill fortune that kept Farashganj at bay.

Tanvir Ahmed scored a maiden 50 and then took a wicket in his first over as Pakistan wrested back the initiative from West Indies on the second day of the second Test on Saturday.

Resuming on their overnight first innings total of 180 for six, Pakistan were eventually bowled out for 272 with tailender Tanvir hammering 10 fours in a 96-ball 57.

The 32-year-old then struck with the second delivery of the West Indies reply when Lendl Simmons, on the drive, was caught at second slip by Taufeeq Umar for no score.

Although Marlon Samuels, batting at number five, compiled a patient 57, the home side lost wickets at regular inter-

There will be no respite for Bangladesh captain Shakib Al Hasan, who will be joining his English county side early next month.

After his stint with Kolkata Knight Riders in the Indian Premier League (IPL) ends later this month, he will fly off to join Worcestershire, possibly in time for their Friends Life Twenty20 competition.

Shakib is most likely to be available for the Royals in the Twenty20 tournament which begins on June 1. Worcestershire open their campaign from June 3 with an away match against Lancashire.

The first round ends on July 15.

A source at the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) said that Shakib has sought the British visa from Kolkata. If he gets it from India, he'll be off immediately after Kolkata's campaign is over.

The source also confirmed that if Shakib doesn't get the visa from India, he will return to Bangladesh and leave for

the Midlands club immediately. The county stint would mean Shakib hasn't taken a noteworthy break from cricket since October last year.
