Govt blamed for terming Limon 'criminal'

Leaders of different political parties yesterday expressed deep concern over statements from high government officials bracketing Limon and his family as criminals while the incident is under investigation.

In a joint statement, the leaders specifically pointed at the statement from the defence advisor of the prime minister, terming it beyond his jurisdiction.

Although the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) director general termed Limon, after being shot in the leg by Rab, as a "victim of circumstance", he later denied saying so and identified the victims as criminals.

Drawing the prime minister's attention, the leaders said these senseless statements are creating frustration and anger among general people and is spoiling the image of Bangladesh abroad.

"We expect the prime minister's personal intervention to put a stop to these senseless comments from government officials and an end to the sufferings faced by Limon and his family members.

"She should start a judicial investigation on extra judicial killings and tortures and ensure proper treatment for Limon," read the statement.

Lawmaker Fazle Hossain Badshah; Shirin Akhter; Dr Mushtaq Hossain; Noor Ahmed Bakul; Ragib Ahsan Munna; Ruhin Hossain Prince; Aslam Khan; and Mokhlesur Rahman Muktadir, among others, signed the statement.

Gonotantrik Bam Morcha, in a seperate statement, also condemned the statements from top government officials.

Alleges victim's father in court

Alhaj Hashem Chowdhury, father of the slain Humayun Kabir Sabbir, yesterday told a Dhaka court that his son was killed allegedly by Shafiat Sobhan Sanvir, son of the Bashundhara Group chairman, and his accomplices for evading his (Sabbir) Tk 21 crore.

Hashem said this while he was giving deposition before the Speedy Trial Tribunal-4 of Dhaka. Later, he was cross-examined by lawyers of the accused Shamsuddin Ahmed and Kahirul Hassan Uzzal, now on bail.

Judge Mohammad Rezaul Islam recorded statement of the witness and then fixed May 31 for the next hearing. On that day, Hashem will be crossexamined again on behalf of Shamsuddin and Uzzal.

The witness identified Shamsuddin and Uzzal on the dock who were also allegedly involved in the killing. The two were accomplices of Sanvir, the prime accused in the case.

Hashem said after getting job to the post of computer engineer of Telecommunications Unit, Bashundhara Group sent his son Sabbir to London for running securities business where he earned a amount of Tk 400 crore.

As per the deal with Bashundhara, Tk 20 crore (5percent of the total profit of Tk 400cr) was payable to Sabbir from the securities business profits, said Hashem in his statement. Another Tk 1crore was refundable to Sabbir as he deposited the money to the company as security, he said.

Hashem came to know from his son-in-law ASM Asif that Sanvir, son of Bashundhara Chief Ahmed Akbar Sobhan Shah Alam, called his son Sabbir out of Asif's residence at the night of the incident.

Later, his son was killed by Sanvir and his accomplices at their Dream Apartment in Gulshan as Sabbir pressed the company for paying his total Tk 21 crore, Hashem continued.

Sanvir and the two and his two security guards --Nure Alam and Humayun Kabir--are on the run since the case was filed.

Sabbir, a director of Bashundhara Telecommunications Network Ltd, was brutally killed on July 5, 2006. His body was found outside a building in Gulshan in the city.

Victim's brother-in-law Asif filed a murder case with Gulshan police on July without mentioning any suspects.

Mohammad Arman Ali, assistant superintendent of police of Crimina Investigation Department, pressed charges against Sanvir and four others on May 12, 2008.

prepare a people-friendly budget and urged not to impose tax burden on businesses that are contributing immensely to the country's economy. The government can survive a

five-year tenure but cannot hang on to power for a longer period unless it increases the civic facilities, he said. Some of the stakeholders came

down heavily on Bangladesh **Environment Lawyers Association** (Bela) and urged the government not to listen to this organisation for their "controversial observation".

"Stop Bela. They're our enemy. Bela will use court and stop shipbreaking in the country," said FBCCI

RE-CHECKING SSC ANSWER SHEETS

Record number of applications this year

A record number of applications for re-checking the answer sheets of Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations were received in the country's education boards this year thanks to technology.

The 10 education boards recorded around 75,000 applications sent by Short Messaging Service (SMS) using the service providing telecommunication company Teletalk with a charge of Tk 125 for each subject.

Dhaka Education Board alone received 21,800 applications, said

the board officials. Each year, the boards receive only around 15,000 to 20,000 applications in total for rechecking.

Formerly, students who either failed to pass or did not achieve desired results had to apply for the rechecking by going to the respective board, filling up an application form and depositing the desired money in a

"Now the hassle is over as all the students needed to do is send an SMS from their mobile phones," said Syed Sadik Jahidul Islam, controller of Dhaka Education Board and chief of Inter-Education Board Exam

Controller Sub Committee.

The controller and the board officials believe the huge number of applications was due to the easy application process ensured by the use of mobile phones.

Around 13.07 lakh students from 26,225 institutions appeared in this year's SSC and equivalent examinations and of them, 10.75 lakh passed. A total of 2,31,269 examinees under 10 education boards failed to pass. The date of applying for the re-

checking ended on May 21.

Rajshahi Education Board received 7,039 applications while the number was 16,000 in Jessore; 8,084


in Chittagong, 4,879 in Comilla; 1,200 in Sylhet; 1,000 in Barisal; 7,303 in Dinajpur; 6,000 under Madrasa Education Board; and 1,200 under Technical Education Board, says

The boards already asked all head examiners and other examiners concerned to start re-checking the answer sheets from next week, said an official of Dhaka Board.

The re-checking result would be published before admission begins in colleges, he said, adding that the students have to collect their results from their respective boards.
