



## Groenjaer calls time

Former Danish international striker Jesper Groenjaer announced Thursday he will retire from football at the end of this season. The 33-year-old will play his final game for champions FC Copenhagen on Sunday. "I'm retiring after mature reflection. I've decided to end my top level career even if the desire and joy to play remains intact," he said. FC Copenhagen reached the Champions League last 16 this season, a unique achievement in Danish football. Capped 80 times, Groenjaer retired from international football after the 2010 World Cup in South Africa.

## Title race stays close after goalless day

Title aspirants Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club missed a good opportunity to take a lead in the Grameenphone Bangladesh League when the star-studded outfit were held to a goalless draw by Feni Soccer Club at the Shaheed Salam Stadium in Feni yesterday.

In the day's other fixture, Farashganj SC also played out a goalless draw against visitors Chittagong Mohammedan at the Bangabandhu National Stadium.

A win against Feni Soccer, whom they beat 1-0 in their home fixture, could have taken Sheikh Jamal to the top of the 12-team points table, but they had to be content with their current second position with 38 points from 17 matches, one less than leaders Muktijoddha Sangsads.

The outcome between Feni Soccer and Sheikh Jamal broke the title race wide open as three teams are very close; Sheikh Russel KC are in the third position with 35 points from 17 matches while Abahani have the same amount of points, having played one match less than others.

"To be truthful, the opponents played well and we could not open their defense," said Sheikh Jamal manager Anwarul Karim Helal over the phone.

Feni Soccer coach Abu Yousuf expressed his frustration at not getting the full three points but was happy to earn one point.

"We played with on the basis of counter-attack and often broke their backline but luck was not with us as two efforts hit the crosspiece either half of the break. We could even have won the game had Nayan not missed an open net in the dying minutes," said the veteran coach.

Sohel first hit the crosspiece in the first half while Dominic rattled the bar from a free-kick outside the box much to the relief of the country's number one goalkeeper Aminul Haque.

Feni Soccer are still in the red zone having stayed on ninth position with 14 points from 17 matches as Farashganj with 14 points and Chittagong Mohammedan with 13 points are breathing down their neck.

"Getting one point from Sheikh Jamal is a bonus and we

## China, Thailand champions

China and Thailand won the boy's and girl's doubles titles after thrashing their respective rivals in the finals of the Bangabandhu Invitational International Youth Table Tennis Championship at the Wooden Floor Stadium yesterday.

The Chinese paddlers defied the challenge of the counterparts from India after recording straight 3-0 win

over in the boy's final while the Thailand girls denied their Chinese opponents to win the girl's title with a fierce 3-2 win.

In the boy's final, Zhang Di took on Vivek Bhargav in the first game to beat him 11-5, 11-13, 11-3 and 11-8 (3-1 sets) to put China ahead.

In the second game, Zhang Jia Rui faced a strong resistance from Arnab Adhikari, who bounced back to level the margin 2-2 after going down in the

first two games. But it was Jai Rui who beat Arnab in the final game 13-11 to make the margin 2-0 for China.

Wang Yuanzhe thrashed Rajiv Sarker straight 3-1 (12-10, 11-7, 9-11 and 11-5) to confirm the title.

In the girls event, the Thailand team comprising Pannak Piyaporn, Sangpao Areya and Rattanavongshha Rattanaporn fought valiantly to overcome the challenges of Liu Xin, Sung

The all-rounder has impressed many with his left-arm spin in his first appearance in the meet for the Kolkata Knight Riders, who were eliminated from the competition after losing against Mumbai Indians on Wednesday.

Shakib bagged 11 wickets in seven matches with the economy rate of 6.86 but got the opportunity to bat only in three innings. The Tigers skipper however had no complaint about his position in the batting order rather he was excited with the overall experience he gained from the competition.

"I was a little bit nervous in the first game but from the second match onwards I enjoyed every moment. It was really an enjoyable trip for me. I think my bowling performance was not bad and it would have been better if I got more chance to bat. I have no complaints because I think the team planning was right. Main thing is that you have to take the opportunity when it comes to your way," said Shakib while talking to The Daily Star Sport over phone yesterday.

"We had hardly got any time for training due to continuous traveling from one city to another but it was a great experience for me to spend time with players from different countries in the dressing room. There was a lot of fun, entertainment and of course the game itself in the middle. It was really an interesting experience for me," he added.

Shakib also enjoyed the company of his former national team coach Dav Whatmore and former great Pakistani fast bowler Wasim Akram.

"I have discussed my performances with them and they also advised how I can improve my performance and they also emphasized on the necessity for hard-work," informed Shakib.

## Murshedy throws his name in the pot

Former booter Abdul Salam Murshedy has appeared in the scene and bought a nomination paper to declare himself as a presidential candidate in the much talked about Mohammmedan SC Limited poll which is changing colour everyday.

On the last day of the nomination papers' selling, a total of 71 nomination papers against 17 posts (16 directors and one president) were sold with 51 people buying nominations.

There are five presidential candidates and they are former president Mosaddeq Ali Falu, Abdus Salam Murshedy, Lokman Hossain Bhuiyan, Obaidul Karim and Mostafa Kamal.

Intiaz Sultan Jonny, Badal Roy, Sayed Hasan Kanon, Rummon Bin Wali Sabir, Sajed AA Adel, Enayet Hossain Siraj, Anwarul Haq Helel, Dr Nizamuddin, Lutuf Rahman

Badal, Hanif Bhuiyan, Mahbub Anam, Barkatullah Bulu, Janial Abedin Faruque, Protap Sankar Hazra, Khalid Hossain and MA Salam and Lokman Hossain Bhuiyan are competing for various other posts.

The submissions of the nomination papers have been fixed on Saturday while the withdrawal is set for Tuesday. The final candidatures will be published on May 1 before 213 members cast their votes on May 5 at the Bangabandhu International Conference Centre.

There are apparently two panels in the scene with Falu leading one side and former general secretary Lokman the other panel that has already divided the existing 17-member directors' board into two groups.

And, the latest move saw some familiar organizers, who had been backing up Falu till Tuesday, backtrack to join the Lokman panel
