Kolo Toure gets 6-month ban

Manchester City centre-back Kolo Toure was on Thursday banned for six months for testing positive for a banned substance earlier this season. The ban was backdated to March 2, the date of his provisional suspension, meaning the Ivory Coast international will be available to play for his club in September. Toure will also be target-tested for a period of two years, starting on Thursday, following an independent regulatory commission hearing convened at Wembley by the Football Association. Toure admitted the offence - his first - contrary to Regulation 3 of the FA Doping Regulations 2010-11.



Mashrafe to start rehab soon

Pace spearhead Mashrafe Bin Mortaza will return home tonight from Australia with renewed hope to make a return to international cricket this year.

"I'm now fine. Dr. David Young checked me this morning and he was really happy with the improvement and what he told me is that he will be surprised if I miss the Pakistan series in December this year," said an excited Mashrafe while talking to The Daily Star Sport over phone from Melbourne yesterday.

The "Narail Express" underwent another operation on his right knee in Melbourne on May 11 under the guidance of Australian orthopedic surgeon Dr David Young. He had injured his right knee in December last year during a Premier Division Cricket League match at BKSP.

"It is too early to say anything about when I will get back my full fitness as only two weeks have gone after the operation but right at this moment I am feeling good. There is no swelling on the operated knee and I can walk with the support of a crutch," informed Mashrafe adding that he is very much confident about prolonging his international career.

Mashrafe said that the doctor has advised him to slowly start cycling and swimming now and after two months the rehabilitation program will start.

"Generally it needs four weeks from the operation to start the

It will be all Chinese finals in both boys' and girls' singles of the Bangabandhu International Invitational Youth Table Tennis Championship at the Wooden Floor Stadium today.

In the girls' group, Liu Gang of China routed Indian peddler Sutirtha Mukherjee 11-02, 15-13, 11-09 and 11-08 to set up the final clash against compatriot Meng En, who however faced a tough challenge before beating Thailand's Sangpao Areeya in 4-2 sets to confirm the final berth.

Meng beat Areeya 11-2 in the first game but suffered two successive defeats (8-11 and 4-11) before hitting back to crush her opponent in the last three sets 11-08, 11-07 and 17-15.

In the boys' group, Zhang Di of China came from behind to thrash S Tanapol of Thailand in 4-1 sets. Zhang lost the first set 7-11 before winning four sets straight in 11-08, 11-01, 11-06 and 11-08.

It's Bangalore vs Chennai

Chris Gayle hammered 89 off just 47 balls as Royal Challengers Bangalore thrashed Mumbai Indians by 43 runs to storm into their second Indian Premier League final.

The hard-hitting West Indies opener hit nine fours and five sixes to help Bangalore pile up an imposing 185-4 before Daniel Vettori grabbed three wickets to restrict Mumbai to 142-8 in 20 overs at the Chidambaram Stadium.

Gayle, the highest run-getter of the tournament with 608 runs from 11 innings, also shared 113 runs with his young opening partner Mayank Agarwal who made a fine 41 off 31 balls.

Stage set for grand finale

Barcelona will seek to seal their status as the finest team of their generation here Saturday when they face Manchester United at Wembley in the most eagerly-anticipated Champions League final in years.

A second triumph in three years -- and their third since 2006 -- will provide irrefutable proof that Pep Guardiola's team deserve to be bracketed alongside legendary teams like Real Madrid's 1950s vintage, Johan Cruyff's Ajax or the Dutch-influenced AC Milan of the 1990s.

Blocking the route to immortality, however, are United, the newly crowned English champions who are desperate to avenge their bitterly disappointing defeat to the Spanish giants in the Rome final two years ago.

United manager Sir Alex Ferguson has never spoken in detail about what he believes went wrong in 2009, when his team were taken for a dizzying ride on Barcelona's famous midfield "carousel" in a 2-0 defeat.

The obvious temptation for Ferguson as United attempt to avoid a repeat of that chastening experience, is to bolster his midfield with an extra man.

Yet to do so would mean having to sacrifice the burgeoning partnership between Wayne Rooney, back to something close to his best, and Javier Hernandez, the young Mexican striker who has been the find of United's season.

The bolder option would be to keep faith with the midfield formation which served United so well en route to the final: a central pairing of Ryan Giggs and Michael Carrick flanked by Antonio Valencia and Park Ji-Sung, with Rooney dropping deep when Barcelona are in possession.

Ferguson has hinted that he is leaning towards a tactical approach

Argentinian's appeal, Messi says he is not interested in personal milestones.

"Goals are only important if they win you games," Messi said. "If I don't score and Barcelona win the Champions League, it's unimportant whether I find the net or not. My interest is in the collective success of the team."

Ferguson is confident however that Messi can be dealt with.

"We have played against Barcelona three times with Messi in the team," Ferguson said. "But there is always a solution to every good player. Hopefully we can find one on Saturday."

United will take encouragement from the fact that other teams have already demonstrated that Barcelona can be vulnerable against opponents who counter-attack at speed.

Arsenal scored a 2-1 victory over the Catalans in the last 16 first leg in
