DEATH IN DB CUSTODY Victim's family calls it a murder

Family members of a former Bangladesh Livestock Research Institute scientific officer who died while in custody of the Detective Branch (DB) of police yesterday claimed that the DB police had killed him 'intentionally'. Abdullah Al Mamun was brought dead to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) on Thursday night by the DB police as an unidentified body. His family identified him on Friday. Family members of the victim alleged yesterday that the family of Mamun's ex-wife has conspired with the DB police to have him 'killed' in custody. The ex-wife's family has a long going dispute with Mamun. Assistant Commissioner of DB Rounok Jahan told the Daily Star that Mamun had been arrested for possession of drugs following information gathered by the DB branch. He died after he swallowed a large quantity of heroin when arrested. Mamun's brother-in-law Zahirul Islam from Bogram however claimed that Mamun had no drug related problems. In fact he had been a nonsmoker all his life, he said. He refuted the DB police's statement and said he had seen injury marks on Mamun's dead body at the DMCH morgue. The victim, Abdullah Al Mamun, a former scientific officer of Bangladesh Livestock Research Institute at Savar, was arrested with his driver from Taher Automobiles near Film Development Corporation gate on Thursday night.

Boy dies in rooftop fall

A madrasa student named Mahmudul Islam, 13, died after falling from the rooftop of a five-storey building at Nurpur of the city's Kadamtoli last evening. Mahmudul, a class VIII student at Talimul Millat Cadet Madrasa, fell as he was running to the railing to catch a ball while playing cricket on the roof. He was declared dead at Dhaka Medical College and Hospital. Mahmudul's father Shahidul Islam Fakir works at Islami Bank Central Hospital.

2,500-ACRE LAND GRABBING Railway beefs up eviction drive

Bangladesh Railway has strengthened its eviction drive to recover about 2,500 acres of its land illegally occupied by influential people in the country. The railway authorities recently wrote to its four divisional estate offices in Rajshahi, Pakshi, Lalmonirhat and Chittagong to launch the drives simultaneously. "To start with we will recover the land that has no legal complications," Railway Director General TA Chowdhury told The Daily Star yesterday. He said the railway authority would

take legal steps to repossess the remaining land which face court injunction or other legal complications. Meanwhile Chief Estate Officer Kamal Uddin of the West Zone said they are expediting the drive on receiving the instruction from higher authorities. "The main difficulty estate offices face in doing it is the shortage of magistrates and police force," he added. Bangladesh Railway authority owns about 63,312 acres of land, a large part of which has been lost to encroachers. The authority has been carrying out drives against land grabbers but most of the efforts remain futile largely because of

pressure and interception from influential quarters backed by politicians including ruling party leaders. Some of the land recovered in the past was lost again to these influential people. The encroachers run unauthorised businesses on the grabbed land by constructing markets or slums there. Some have even built religious structures like mosques and shrines. Various government bodies also occupy around about 804 acres of railway land without railway approval. They do not pay the railway for the use of land either, sources in the railway said.
