## Bomb hoax call at DU

An anonymous caller over telephone threatened to destroy Arts Building of Dhaka University (DU) using bombs, prompting a frantic search inside the building, but finally proved to be a hoax.

DU Proctor Dr KM Saiful Islam Khan said, "After two threats at the university's telephone exchange, we immediately contacted police."

He said a bomb disposal unit of Dhaka Metropolitan Police rushed to DU campus and conducted a one-hour search in the building but did not find anything.

Dr Saiful said scheduled classes and examinations in the building were not hampered during the search.

## Press enjoying full freedom: FM

## Tk 9.50 lakh fined for flouting laws

Bangladesh Standard and Testing Institution (BSTI) yesterday fined Tk 9.50 lakh to two chemical factories and a fruit shop in Farmgate and Mohammadpur area for selling chemicals and chemical mixed fruits.

The team found selling ethophen giving false information on the bottle of the chemicals of National Agri Care Ltd in Concord Centre at Farmgate and Sark Bangladesh at Tajmahal Road in Mohammadpur.

The team fined Tk 2 lakh each to three managers of the National Agri Care Ltd Abdul Awal, Alfar Rahman, and Kamrul Ahsan. The team also fined Tk 1.50 lakh each to the owner of Sark Bangladesh Abdur Rob and manager Toslimur Rahman.

The team also fined Tk 50,000 to Bismillah Fal Bhandar at Tajmahal Road in Mohammadpur for preserving and selling mangoes mixed with chemicals.

## Woman beaten to death

Police sent body of Halima Begum, 35, to Sir Salimullah Medical College morgue for autopsy. Halima was wife of Nazrul Islam of Shyampur Dhaka Match Factory area.

The victim's brother Alamgir Hossain said Nazrul beat up his sister in closed-door and went absconding leaving her dead.

## 13 houses for hajj pilgrims

The government has rented 13 houses in the holy city of Makkah to accommodate Bangladesh's hajj pilgrims during hajj season this year.

As many as 7,000 pilgrims will be accommodated in those houses. The houses are located near the Har'am Sharif. The rate of rent for each house is minimum 3,700 Saudi Real (SR) and minimum 5,000 SR.

Kamal Uddin Ahmed, joint secretary to the Religious Affairs Ministry, informed this at a press conference at Secretariat yesterday afternoon.

## 10,000 people to get food security help

## First community radio on air

## Lokobetar's test run starts in Barguna

The country's first community radio named Lokobetar has begun test transmission in the district town of Barguna to build public opinion on development issues like democracy, good governance, human rights, anti-corruption, health and women empowerment.

Mass-Line Media Centre (MMC), a development organisation, with financial and technical support from Unesco, set up the radio station, which has been on trial since May 27 and is expected to go for full-fledged transmission by mid-June.

MMC officials will operate the radio while local community will staff the programmes.

Tarek Mahmud, acting head of Lokobetar, said the radio equipment costs stand at about Tk 10 lakh.

The radio now broadcasts programmes for an hour daily, which would be increased gradually, said MMC officials.

Musical programmes are being transmitted with some social messages on issues such as public health, education, women oppression, child marriage, and dowry. Weather and

has been set up on the rooftop of a house.

"So the targeted group will not receive the signal at the moment. The studio is also yet to be built," said Mahmud.

Nyma Nargis, project officer (communication and information) of Unesco, said, "We believe community radio will play a successful role in creating mass awareness on issues such as democracy, good governance, human rights, anti-corruption movement, health, environment, women empowerment, gender, youth and child rights, and non-formal education."

She said communities would be better prepared to accept the radio station and interested to engage in the activities related to community radio programming.

Unesco Dhaka office initially provided two community radio stations. The Centre for Communication and Development (CCD), a Rajshahi-based media organisation, will operate the other radio station that would come into transmission soon.

The government has a plan to establish a community radio on agriculture information services in Barguna.

agriculture news are also on the list.

In 1998 MMC applied to the information ministry asking for licence for community radio. The government provided 14 licen-

ces in April last year.


About 17 kilometers circle of Barguna town will get the FM 99.2 radio frequency of Lokobetar while 12 lakh people have been targeted. The

## Anniversary of Zia's death observed

Leaders and workers of BNP and its front and associated organisations across the country observed the 30th death anniversary of late president Ziaur Rahman, the founder of Bangladesh Nationalist Party, yesterday.

President Ziaur Rahman was assassinated by a group of disgruntled army officers at Chittagong Circuit House on May 30 in 1981.

Party chairperson Khaleda Zia along with party leaders, activists and supporters placed wreaths at the grave of the slain president and offered special prayers. Then she attended a milad mahfil organised by Jatiyatabadi Ulema Dal on the mazar premises.

Later, she inaugurated a voluntary blood donation programme organised by Doctors' Association of Bangladesh (DAB) accompanied by acting Secretary General of BNP Mirza Fakhrul Islam, Alamgir, Khandaker Mosharraf Hossain, MK Anwar, Nazrul Islam Khan and Mirza Abbas among others.

She also inaugurated a three-day-programme for food distribution among the destitute at the capital's Mohammadpur.

Meanwhile, milad mahfils were also held at Khaleda's residence and office in Gulshan after Maghrub prayers attended by party bigwigs.

## RAJUK HOUSING PROJECT IN KERANIGANJ

## Jhilmil form distribution

## starts tomorrow

Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) tomorrow will start distributing application forms for some 1,200 plots under Jhilmil Residential Area project in Keraniganj.

For the first time, arrangements have been made so the applicants, who would not get a plot, will get their money refunded directly to their bank accounts within seven days of the declaration of the plot winners, said Rajuk Chairman Nurul Huda.

Previously, the applicants had to appeal to Rajuk for getting their deposit money back and it would take many years.

The chairman added August 25 is the last day for application submission and since then Rajuk will take three months' time to announce the names of plot winners. Plot winners will be picked through lotteries.

People can collect application forms from Rajuk branch of Sonali, Janata, and Agrani banks and Janata Bank Ltd in Mohakhali, Uttra and Ramna in exchange for Tk 1,000 or download the form and prospectus from Rajuk website www.rajukdhaka.gov.bd. In case of downloaded forms, the applicants have to deposit the money to any bank and submit the form with the payslip.

The plots will be allotted in three categories-- 5 katha, 3 katha and 2.5 katha, said a Rajuk official. Rajuk is

offering 2.5 katha plots to those who lost their land to the land acquisition for the project.

Applicants have to deposit Tk 1.50 lakh for a 3 katha plot, Tk 2.50 lakh for a 5 katha plot and Tk 1 lakh for a 2.5 katha plot.

Non-resident Bangladeshis will have to deposit \$2,100 for a 3 katha plot and \$3,500 for a 5 katha plot. The affected people who fall under this category have to deposit \$1,400 for a 2.5 katha plot.

As per the guideline, any person, who has a plot or house or flat in his/her name or spouse's name or his/her dependents' names, is not allowed to submit the application. If they submit applications, they will be disqualified.

People under 18 categories can apply for the plots.

The categories are freedom fighters 3 percent, journalists 2 percent (print media 1 and electronic 1), government job holders 28 percent, officials and employees of autonomous bodies 12 percent, armed forces 2 percent, businessmen and industrialists 8 percent, private job holders 10 percent, personalities of art/literature and sports 2 percent, remittance earners 10 percent, officials/employees of different ministries 0.05 percent, officials and employees
