

## Bagai quits captaincy

Ashish Bagai has stepped down as captain of Canada ahead of the Intercontinental Cup which begins in June. The 29-year-old wicketkeeper-batsman Bagai, who made his debut in 2003 and has had two stints as captain, will still be available for selection as a player. Bagai led Canada in the 2011 World Cup in which they beat higher-ranked Kenya in the group stages. He made two half-centuries during the tournament.

Spain's Alberto Contador of the Saxo Bank team secured his second Tour of Italy title on Sunday, after Scot David Millar of Garmin won the final stage time trial in Milan. Contador, who came into the race in the shadow of a doping controversy regarding last year's Tour de France, has dominated the event, spending the bulk of the 94th edition in the leader's pink jersey. Although Millar took the plaudits with his swashbuckling showing in the 26km final stage, the headlines will belong to Contador, who will now seek to add a fourth Tour de France to his glittering record.

# Rafael rolls on, Novak gets semi pass

Five-time champion Rafael Nadal reached the French Open last eight on Monday as title rival Novak Djokovic enjoyed a major psychological boost when he was handed a free pass into the semifinals.

Top seed Nadal enjoyed a 7-5, 6-3, 6-3 win over Croatian veteran Ivan Ljubicic and could next face Roland Garros bogeyman Robin Soderling, the only player to have beaten the great Spaniard in Paris in 43 matches.

Djokovic, meanwhile, was excused quarterfinal duty when scheduled opponent Fabio Fognini of Italy withdrew with a torn left thigh muscle.

Nadal, bidding for a sixth French Open title to take him level with Bjorn Borg, has looked a shadow of his usual self in Paris, shaken by the super-charged form of Djokovic, who could take his title and number one spot before the week is out.

On Monday, he was a break to the good to lead 2-1 in the opening set before Ljubucic, a 2006 semi-finalist, hit back for 3-3.

Nadal stepped up the pressure on the Croatian's serve, however, and snatched the set when Ljubucic sent his single-handed backhand wide.

Two breaks in the seventh and ninth games of the second set helped Nadal stretch

his lead, the set secured with a smart, down-the-line whipped forehand.

A break for 3-1 in the third set seemed to be the foundation that the 24-year-old required, but Ljubicic, at 32 the oldest man left in the draw, hit back for 2-3.

But an immediate break to love gave Nadal a 4-2 lead and he claimed the tie in the ninth game when Ljubicic again went long with a loose backhand.

Fognini, who had been due to play his first career Grand Slam quarter-final, suffered a tournament-ending injury in his marathon five-set fourth-round win over Albert Montanes on Sunday.

Djokovic said he felt sympathy for Fognini, a player he has defeated in both of their career meetings.

French ninth seed Gael Monfils, a 2008 semi-finalist, set-up a last eight clash with third seed Roger Federer after defeating Spain's David Ferrer, the seventh seed, 6-4, 2-6, 7-5, 1-6, 8-6.

Monfils had led by two sets to one when the tie was suspended on Sunday night and despite squandering three match points in the ninth and 11th games of the decider on Monday, the 24-year-old eventually held his nerve.

Argentina's Juan Ignacio Chela shattered Alejandro Falla's dreams of becoming the first Colombian man to reach a Grand Slam quarter-final with a 4-6, 6-2, 1-6, 7-6 (7/5), 6-2 win.

## Sania-Elena in doubles semis

Sania Mirza and and her partner Elena Vesnina shocked top seeds Gisela Dulko and Flavia Pennetta 6-0, 7-5 to reach the women's doubles semifinals in the French Open here on Monday.

The seventh seed Indo-Russian pair wrapped up the quarterfinal clash in one hour and six minutes after blanking the Argentine-Italian duo in the first set.

This is for the first time that Sania has reached the women's doubles semifinals in a Grand Slam event.

The quarterfinal appearances in the 2007 US Open and 2008 Wimbledon were her best performances so far at the big stage.

They will take on the winner of the Liezel Huber/Lisa Raymond vs Victoria Azarenka/Maria Kirilenko clash in the semifinals.

So, the problem is not with the ideas but in its implementation.

# England pull off a miracle

A magnificent bowling effort from England, particularly four-wicket heroes Chris Tremlett and Graeme Swann after the tea break on the final day, gave England an unexpected innings and 14-run victory in the first Test against Sri Lanka at Sophia Gardens last evening.

Sri Lanka, in their second innings were shot to bits -- bowled out for 82 -- after England's first innings 496 for five declared. The hosts now have a 1-0 lead in the three-Test series.

Tremlett took two wickets for four runs in three balls to remove both Sri Lanka's openers and reduce the tourists to 10 for two right after tea. He struck with his sixth ball to have Tharanga Paranavitana well caught low down at first slip by England captain Andrew Strauss. But it was all the 6ft 7in Surrey pacer's own work when he caught and bowled Sri Lanka skipper Tillakaratne Dilshan after a review confirmed the batsman had gloved a lifting delivery back to the bowler.

Apart from the openers, Tremlett took the wickets of Mahela Jayawardene and his namesake and first innings centurion

# Gayle left out

## WI name squads for T20 & ODIs against India

Former skipper Chris Gayle has been left out of the West Indies squad to face India in the Twenty 20 clash and two opening one-dayers in a continuing stand-off with selectors.

Gayle remains out of favour with the West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) after he was dropped for the recent home series against Pakistan, a decision which left him free to play in the entire IPL with Bangalore.

Despite Gayle finishing the tournament as the leading run-getter, the WICB said in a statement that the big-hitting batsman will not be recalled until he explains comments he gave in a radio interview in which he lambasted selectors.

All-rounder Kieron Pollard has been recalled for the first two ODIs, while fast bowler Kemar Roach has been rested.

Uncapped Jamaican left-arm seamer Krishmar Santokie is the only change in the T20 squad which defeated Pakistan in St Lucia in April.

# Tharanga fails dope test

Opening batsman Upul Tharanga has become the first Sri Lankan international to fail a dope test after a random check during the cricket World Cup, the country's sports ministry said Monday.

The left-handed player was informed by the International Cricket Council (ICC) that he tested positive for a banned steroid, ministry spokesman Harsha Abeykoon told AFP, adding that a national inquiry would also be held.

"The sports minister (Mahindananda Aluthgamage) named a three-member panel to launch a domestic investigation and as a first step they will record a statement from Tharanga at the earliest," Abeykoon said.

He said Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC), the country's governing body for the sport, had not yet been formally informed by the ICC.

He was tested in Colombo during Sri Lanka's World Cup match against New Zealand, a cricket source told AFP, adding that the ICC had taken a urine sample from him although other players had been subjected to blood tests.

Sri Lanka won the match against New Zealand by five wickets, with Tharanga scoring 30 runs off 30 balls. If confirmed guilty of violating ICC's anti-doping code, the 26-year-old faces a minimum two-year suspension.

Under ICC rules, Tharanga can seek a test of his "B" sample.

Two medical doctors with extensive experience of sports medicine were included in

the panel headed by sports ministry secretary Udaya Seneviratne to probe Tharanga's case, Abeykoon said.

Cricket officials in Colombo said no Sri Lankan player had ever failed a dope test before, but current skipper and Tharanga's opening partner, Tillakaratne Dilshan, has been subject to allegations in the media.

Dilshan said in a statement in March that unidentified sources were trying to distract him from his game with allegations of doping.

The embarrassing development of Tharanga failing the dope test comes amid allegations by a former skipper that Sri Lankan players have been responsible for match fixing since 1992.

Sri Lanka says the allegations of match-fixing are still under investigation.

A press report on Sunday said Tharanga had already retained a lawyer to defend himself at an upcoming ICC inquiry into his doping results.

It said Tharanga has claimed that he was given a steroid by a faith healer in Colombo who also treated other international players.

There was no immediate comment Monday from the ICC's anti-doping committee, but ICC spokesman James Fitzgerald told AFP on Sunday that he had "nothing to say."

There was also no comment from Tharanga. He is not part of the Sri Lankan side currently on tour in England, but opened against England in their World Cup semi-final and went onto score an unbeaten century.

Sri Lanka won the match by 10 wickets, but lost the final to India.
