Azam Khan not out of danger

The country's Pop Guru and freedom fighter Azam Khan, who is on life support in the city's Square Hospital, can move his limbs slightly but he is not out of danger.

Dr Quamaruzzaman Chowdhury of the hospital told The Daily Star that last evening that they could not take him out of life support as his lung remained non functional though his blood pressure was under control without medicine.

He said now it is impossible to shift Azam abroad for better treatment if his condition does not improve.

Inform custodial deaths within 24 hours

HR body chief asks law enforcers

Law enforcement agencies are to inform National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) about deaths in custody, crossfire and encounter.

NHRC Chairman Dr Mizanur Rahman yesterday said his organisation will send letters to all law enforcement agencies asking them to submit the report of all unnatural deaths with all consistent documents within 24 hours of the incidents.

Dr Mizan said this while he was speaking at a seminar on "Role of media in promoting transparency for human rights in Bangladesh" at Nawab Ali Chowdhury Senate Bhaban at Dhaka University.

Relief International in collaboration with European Commission organised the seminar.

Dr Imtiaz Ahmed of Dhaka University and Nazmul Islam, country director of Relief International Bangladesh, also spoke at the seminar

while senior journalist Jaglul Ahmed Chowdhury presented the keynote paper.

Talking to reporters after the seminar Dr Mizan expressed deep concern over statements of high government officials bracketing Limon and his family members as criminals while the incident is under investigation.

Drawing the prime minister's attention, he said "Prime minister has received biased information due to the speech by the high government officials."

'25pc people in city face eye problem'

Around 25 percent people in Dhaka city are facing eye problems, says a baseline survey.

This was revealed at the Bangladesh Community Ophthalmological Society's annual conference at BICC in the city yesterday, said a press release.

Syed Modasser Ali, prime minister's health affairs adviser was the chief guest, while Prof Deen Mohd Noorul Huq, president of the society, was in the chair.

M Nurun Nabi, project coordinator of Dhaka Urban Comprehensive Eye Care Project, in his presentation based on the last year's baseline survey said 72 percent of the surveyed people were not aware about necessary eye care services.

\$30m US help for school feeding scheme

World Food Programme (WFP) has received a contribution of US\$30 million from United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for operating its flagship school feeding programme.

The USDA donations would help WFP-run school feeding programme in 1,800 schools for a year benefiting over 350,000 pre-primary and primary school children in poverty-prone areas in Bangladesh, said a WFP press release yesterday.

The school feeding programme provides fortified biscuits to reduce micro-nutrient deficiencies among school children.

Parents, teachers and other family members will also be benefited from community mobilisation and educational activities under WFP's school feeding programme. WFP will also provide training to government officials and NGO service providers on gender issues, community mobilisation, hygiene, health and de-worming.

The WFP-supported School Feeding programme, covering more than 1.2 million children, is being implemented jointly by the primary and mass education ministry and the directorate of primary education. NGO partners will also assist the implementation at the local level.

Between 2001 and 2010, USDA contributed more than US\$40 million to WFP-assisted primary school children in the most food-insecure areas of the country, said the release.
