# Office-goers turn to trains

Trains between the capital and its adjoining districts see a rise in passengers, as chaos over fares continues to trouble the bus service.

There has been an increase in commuters by nearly 10 to 15 percent in train services on Narayanganj-Kamalapur and Joydevpur-Kamalapur routes in the last

two weeks, said a railway official asking not to be named. He said 24 trips, each with 450 passengers are operated on Dhaka-Narayanganj route, and eight more, each with 700 passengers, on Dhaka-Joydevpur route every day.

Despite a huge demand for the service, the train running on Narayanganj-Kamalapur route has only seven compartments, said the railway official.

"I have been travelling to my workplace in Motijheel by train for the last 15 days to save time and money," said Mozammel Haque, a private job holder.

It takes Tk 50 to go to Motijheel by a rickshaw from Satish Sarkar Road at Gendaria and Tk 10, upped recently from Tk 8, by bus, he said.

"It is easy for me to go to my office by train that takes 15 minutes to reach Kamalapur. Then I go the distance on foot," Mozammel said. Mehedi Hasan, a staff of Almas Super Market in

Gulshan, said he can save at least an hour by travelling to Gulshan from Gendaria. "It takes about 15 minutes to go to Kamalapur. Then I

# Flaws in Biman annual report

'Wrong posting' inflates its Tk 25cr loss to Tk 80cr

Biman incurred a loss of Tk 25.72 crore in the 2009-10 financial year, and not Tk 80 crore as shown in its annual statement, authorities now say. Biman sources said the financial report showed a Tk 56-

crore debt to jet fuel supplier Padma Oil Company on June 30 last year although the actual amount was Tk 1.72 crore. This "wrong posting" in the account book of the

national flag carrier triggered widespread criticism. "We've detected the flaw. A committee is investigating whether the debt of Tk 56 crore to Padma oil was posted mistakenly or intentionally," said Biman Board

Chairman Air Marshal (retd) Jamal Uddin Ahmed. He warned of punitive actions on the basis of report of the three-member enquiry committee headed by Maj Gen Hameed-Al-Hasan, a Biman board member.

Two chartered accountant firms audited the report before it was submitted to the government but they failed

to point it out, sources said. ATM Kamal Uddin of MJ Abedin and Co, one of the two
