He passed away at LabAid Hospital due to old-age complications on Tuesday at the age of 82.

Relatives, students, political leaders, cultural figures and academicians paid tribute with flowers when his coffin was brought in an ambulance around 10:00am.

Many fans burst into tears as they stood by the man who was one of the pioneers in modern art movement in Bangladesh.

# poll violence

Two seperate incidents of violence over upazila parishad elections in Rajshahi left around 45 people injured yesterday.

Supporters of two chairmen candidates clashed over holding procession at Chaipara of Sreepur union leaving 15 people injured. Seven of the injured were admitted to local health complex.

Meanwhile, supporters of BNP-backed chairman candidate Nasir Uddin Babu clashed with police at Godagari in Deopara union after they barricaded Rajshahi-Chapainawabganj road at Rajabari point, leaving 30 people injured.

They alleged that Babu's polling agent was driven out from the recount at Nimtala voting centre, when the count came 1,170 from a previous 1,270.

At Dharampur vote centre, Babu's opponent Akhtaruzzaman of Awami League won by 17 votes in a similar recount, they alleged.

# 45 hurt in UP | PM seeks US help to send Rohingyas

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina requested the US government to take initiative after discussion with the Myanmar government to bring back the Rohingya refugees staying in Bangladesh through the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).

The premier made call when the visiting US Assistant Secretary of State for the Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration Eric P Schwartz called on her at Gono Bhaban in the city on Thursday.

During the meeting, they discussed wide range of bilateral issues and matters concerning the Rohingya refugee problems in Bangladesh, said PM's Deputy Press Secretary Md Nazrul Islam after the meet-

the Prime Minister Prof Gawher Rizvi, Ambassador At Large M Ziauddin and US Ambassador to Bangladesh James F Moriarty were present on the occasion.

The US assistant secretary of state arrived here on Tuesday on a three-day visit to meet with government officials and international and nongovernmental organisations to discuss humanitarian protection and assistance issues for the registered Rohingya refugees and undocumented Rohingya in Bangladesh.

There are over 29,000 registered Rohingya refugees living in two official camps in Cox's Bazar district of Bangladesh since 1992. The government of Bangladesh estimates 200,000-500,000 undocumented Rohingya refugees are residing in various villages and towns outside the refugee PRACTICING DEMOCRACY

# Student council elections today

After successful completion of piloting at 100 primary schools, elections of Student Council, a new concept of practicing democratic norms from childhood, will be held at 600 schools across the country today.

Student Council in the form of a shadow parliamentary system of governance was first launched in the country last year in 100 schools as pilot basis aiming at creating quality leadership, practicing democratic norms and values and exhibiting tolerance to others' opinions in the minds from early childhood.

"After witnessing huge enthusiasm about the Student Council among students, teachers and even the guardians at those 100 schools, we have decided to form councils at 600 primary schools this year," Deputy Director of Directorate of Primary Education M Fasiullah told the news agency yesterday.

Students of class three to five will elect council members

for one year by casting their votes. After the election, one will be selected or elected as prime minister by voice vote from among the members of the council.

#### 105 shops burnt to ashes

A devastating fire gutted 105 shops in Gobindaganj Upazila market early yesterday damaging goods and properties worth over Tk 7 crore.

Gaibandha fire fighting sources said the fire originated from an electric shot circuit of a clothes shop at 5:00am and soon engulfed adjacent shops.

The blaze burnt to ashes the cash and goods of 105 shops and damaged partially of 41 other shops. The losses from the fire might be over Tk 10 crore, said Mohammed Hossain Faku, vice-chairman of the upazila.

Fire fighting units from Gaibandha, Bogra and Jaipurhat districts rushed in and brought the fire under control after fighting for two hours.
