A. Did you know?

Rabindranath Tagore was a writer, educator, composer, editor, artist, and social reformer.

Rabindranath Tagore first wrote poetry at the age of eight.

His first poem was published in 1875 when he was just thirteen.

His first book, a collection of poems, appeared when he was seventeen. Tagore's friend published this book to surprise him.

Rabindranath Tagore moved to Shilaiddah which is situated at Kumarkhali Upazila of Kushtia in 1880 to look after his Jamindari. During his stay there, he wrote many of his famous poems and songs.

In 1883, Tagore married Mrinalini Devi Raichaudhuri. They had two sons and three daughters.

In 1901, Tagore founded a school outside Calcutta called Visva-Bharati. This school became a university in 1921.

Tagore was awarded knighthood by the ruling British Government in 1915, but he returned it four years later when British troops killed some 400 Indian people.

Tagore began to paint when he was seventy years old.

In 1961, India's famed director Satyajit Ray wrote and directed a documentary on the life and works of Rabindranath Tagore. It was made on the anniversary of Tagore's hundredth birthday.

Tagore dictated his last poem only hours before he died on August 7 in 1941.

His father heard him singing from another room and was very **impressed**. He asked his servants to go and bring the little boy to him. Then the father said to his youngest son, "Can you sing the song for me again?"

Little Tagore felt happy as his father wanted to listen to his song, but he also felt very **scared**. His father encouraged him and he sang. His father liked the song very much. He was so impressed that he wrote the boy a cheque for 500 rupees. In those days, 500 rupees was really a big amount. When he gave it to Rabi, he said, "In the past, the Mughal emperors honoured talented people with gifts. The Mughal emperors are no more, but your talent is so remarkable that you deserve that kind of honour."

Young Rabindranath Tagore was **excited** and **delighted**. He ran and showed the cheque to his servants. The servants were very **proud** that their little hero had become such a great poet. This incident inspired him to write more.




