

## UN chief to name Myanmar envoy

UN leader Ban Ki-moon will soon name a full time special envoy to Myanmar to encourage the government on the reform path, a UN spokesman said yesterday.

The envoy will be named "in due time," UN deputy spokesman Farhan Haq told AFP. The decision has been taken "now that the new government has committed to working more closely with the United Nations."

Ban announced he would name the envoy to diplomats at a meeting on Myanmar last week.

"The country's human rights, political, social, economic and humanitarian problems are serious and long-standing," said UN spokesman Martin Nesirky.

## UN urges end to Asian preference for male heirs

UN agencies yesterday urged an end to Asia's preference for sons, saying it perpetuates discrimination and violation of women's rights.

"Gender-biased sex selection reflects and fuels a culture of discrimination and violence, and must be addressed urgently by all segments of government and society as a matter of women's human rights," said five UN agencies in a joint statement.

The agencies noted that there is a "huge pressure on women to produce sons... which not only directly affects women's reproductive decisions... but also puts women in a position where they must perpetuate the lower status of girls through son preference."

Women can be divorced if they fail to produce boys and the discovery of female

foetus can lead to its abortion, they noted.

"States have an obligation to ensure that these injustices are addressed without exposing women to the risk of death or serious injury by denying them access to needed services such as safe abortion to the full extent of the law, and other healthcare services," said the UN agencies.

The five agencies, including Unicef, the World Health Organisation, UN Women, the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights and the UN Population Fund, had released the statement after studying the evidence behind this preference for sons in many parts of Asia.

The latest census in China found 118.06 males were born to every 100 baby girls over the last decade, an imbalance often attributed to the Chinese preference for male heirs.

## 19 killed in Venezuela prison clashes

At least 19 inmates have been killed since Sunday in armed clashes among prisoners in Venezuela's El Rodeo prison, an official said yesterday.

There was "a regrettable situation that occurred Sunday in El Rodeo where 19 inmates lost their lives," Interior Minister Tareck El Aissami told reporters.

It would be the deadliest prison uprising in Venezuela since 1999.

Gunfire and explosions could be heard into the night on Monday at the prison in the northern state of Miranda, but El Aissami did not say whether the situation had been brought under control.

## India not alarmed by China dam

India yesterday said an ongoing Chinese project to dam the Brahmaputra river in Tibet would not affect downstream supplies in the country's north-eastern regions.

Foreign Minister S.M. Krishna confirmed China was going ahead with the controversial construction of the dam on Yarlung Tsangpo river, as the Brahmaputra is called in Tibet.

"We have ascertained from our own sources that this is a run of the river hydro-electric project which does not store water and will not adversely impact downstream areas in India," Krishna told reporters in New Delhi.

"I believe there is no cause for immediate alarm," he added. "It is important that states of Arunachal Pradesh and Assam harness

and utilise the waters of Brahmaputra. This is a really a very important issue."

The Brahmaputra is a lifeline to some of India's remote, farm-dependent northeastern states.

Some Indian experts have warned the cross-border dam could drain water from the river, which sustains the livelihood of millions of in Assam.

China after launching its construction in November 2010 assured that it took "full consideration of the potential impact on the downstream area".

Media reports have previously suggested the dam would feature six 85-megawatt power-generating units aimed at curbing power shortages in Tibet.

The project -- one of a number to meet soaring demand for water and electricity -- is expected to cost nearly 7.9 billion yuan (\$1.2 billion), the reports said.



## Gandhi's spectacles missing

A pair of round-framed spectacles belonging to India's independence icon Mahatma Gandhi have gone missing from a museum in western India, officials said.

Staff at the Sevagram Ashram, a religious retreat some 75 kilometres (47 miles) from the city of Nagpur, noticed that the glasses had disappeared as they made preparations to mark the anniversary of its founding.

Gandhi first arrived at the ashram near the town of Wardha, in northeast Maharashtra state, in the mid-1930s. The Quit India resolution calling for independence from the British was passed there in July 1942.

The spectacles were among a number of personal items, including a pen stand and a bathroom brush, on display in a locked show cabinet.

About 300,000 people visit the ashram every year, PTI said.

## Iran backing Syria crackdown

Says Hillary Clinton

US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton yesterday accused Iran of backing Syrian President Bashar al-Assad's "vicious assaults" on pro-democracy protesters after crushing its own 2009 uprising.

"Iran is supporting the Assad regime's vicious assaults on peaceful protesters and military actions against its own cities," Clinton said, comparing its response to Iran's crackdown on pro-reform demonstrations.

"Two years ago this week, Iranian citizens went to the polls in the hopes of expressing their democratic rights," she said.

"When the people reached for their aspirations, the government responded with

brutal repression. Two years later, that repression continues."

Syria's uprising was triggered in mid-March by the arrest and torture of 15 children and adolescents accused of spraying anti-regime graffiti in the southern town of Daraa, which then became the epicenter of the revolt.

The UN children's agency UNICEF has since said that at least 30 children have been shot dead in the revolt against the Assad family's 40-year rule.

The revolt gained new strength last month with the release of gruesome pictures of the body of 13-year-old Hamza al-Khatib, whom activists say was severely tortured, a charge denied by authorities.
