Jozy Altidore scored the lone goal in a 1-0 victory over Guadeloupe on Tuesday as the United States seized the last quarterfinal berth on offer in the CONCACAF Gold Cup.

The United States advance as the runners-up in Group C behind Panama, who sealed their group win with a 1-1 draw over Canada.

That result also insured that Group A's El Salvador would advance as one of the top two third-placed teams.

The Americans, whose shock loss to Panama had put them in a precarious position, gained some breathing room when Altidore buried a driving shot from 25 meters in the ninth minute.

The defeat was the third in a row for Guadeloupe, surprising semi-finalists four years ago.

Earlier at Sporting Park, Luis Tejada scored in a goalmouth scramble in the first minute of injury time to give Panama their 1-1 draw.

After Anibal Godoy's attempt was blocked, Canadian keeper Milan Borjan couldn't get the ball cleared from in front of the goal and Tejada was able to nudge it across the line. Canada's Dwayne De Rosario had converted his second

penalty in as many games in the 62nd minute to give Canada the lead. The Canadians, knowing they needed a victory to guaran-

tee a quarter-finals berth, pressed hard from the start. They failed to convert several chances but got an oppor-

tunity from the spot when De Rosario was fouled in the penalty area by Eybir Bonaga.

DeRosario induced Panamanian keeper Luis Mejia to go the wrong way and powered a low shot into the left corner of the net.

The quarterfinals of the tournament, which is the regional championship for North and Central America and the Caribbean, will be held next weekend.

On Saturday at New Meadowlands Stadium in East Rutherford, New Jersey, defending champions and Group A winners Mexico will take on Guatemala and Costa Rica face Honduras.

Mexico are trying to repeat despite a squad reduced to 17 after the national federation withdrew five players who tested positive for the banned substance clenbuterol during a pre-tournament training camp in May.

### Football turns into mass riot

At least 12 people were injured when Tajik football fans clashed and wreaked havoc in the southeast of the country following a match, Tajikistan's interior ministry saidWednesday.

"Twelve people were wounded, and 20 more of the most active hooligans have been detained," ministry spokesman Makhmadullo Asadulloyev told AFP after the disturbances in the town of Kulyab following a match Tuesday evening between local team Ravshan and Istiklol, a team from capital Dushanbe.

Fans of the two clubs "clashed in fist fights" after the local team lost 1-0 to Istiklol, where Rustami Emomali, the eldest son of Tajik President Emomali Rahmon, plays as a striker. It was not clear if he was involved in this game.

Dutch legend Ruud Gullit was returning home on Wednesday after his "adventure" as manager of the top Chechnya club came to a dramatic end amid humiliating defeat and accusations of a playboy lifestyle.

Terek Grozny offered Gullit the paltry consolation of coaching their youth side after he was ruthlessly sacked as manager following an ignominious 1-0 defeat with a 90thminute goal against unfancied Urals minnows Perm in the Russian Premier League.

The sacking was personally ordered by Chechnya's leader Ramzan Kadyrov, a former rebel turned Kremlin loyalist and strict Muslim, who had rebuked Gullit for showing too much interest in nightclubs and drinking.

Kadyrov, who keeps a private zoo of wild cats and personally takes part in operations to eliminate Islamic militants, had issued Gullit with an astonishing ultimatum to either win the match or be sacked immediately.

Looking resigned to his fate, Gullit said in his televised post-match news conference that he had "already said goodbye to the team before the match as I knew I would be fired even if we won".

Terek midfielder Andrei Kobenko declined to give his views on Gullit's sacking but expressed sympathy for the manager, whom he described as a "good and decent person who understood everyone".

Chechnya Sports Minister Haidar Alkhanov told the Sovietsky Sport daily that Gullit would now be offered "work with the youth team". But Gullit showed no interest in taking up the offer. Asked about Gullit's severance package,

Alkhanov said: "We are going to discuss all these questions. Don't worry about Gullit's finances. We always behave decently in such situations."

Gullit himself made clear he had no intention of staying with Grozny to coach Chechen youths, quoted in the Dutch daily De Telegraaf as saying he was "so tired that now I just want to relax".

With mild understatement he added: "Obviously this was not good for my CV. But on the other hand it has been an adventure."

In comments to Russian television overnight Kadyrov again lashed out at Gullit's apparent discomfort with Chechnya's Islamic customs, saying that "some people don't like that we have no discotheques, bars and drunkenness".

Argentine football icon Diego Maradona is suing popular Chinese web portal Sina and an Internet company for using his name and image to promote an online game, state media saidWednesday. Maradona is seeking 20 million yuan (\$3 million) in com-

pensation from Sina and The9 Limited which designed the game "Winning Goal", the Global Times quoted an official from the Beijing No. 1 Intermediate Court as saying.
