# BCL to choose new leadership

## Age limit creeps up as council date announced

Bangladesh Chhatra League will hold its national council next month to elect a new leadership, its central leaders announced yesterday as the pro-Awami League student organisation struggles to overcome crippling infighting and factionalism.

The two-day national council will begin on July 10 after a gap of five years, BCL President Mahmud Hasan Ripon and General Secretary Mahfuzul Haider Chowdhury Rotan told a press conference yesterday at Dhaka University's Madhur Canteen.

The present BCL central committee was elected for a two-year term at the national council held in 2006.

Also yesterday, the Dhaka University unit of the country's oldest student body announced its council will be held on June 30. BCL was formed in 1948.

Since the Awami League-led alliance came to power two years ago, BCL has come under fire for tender-related violence and factional infighting leading to the murders of at least four activists of the student body.

The central committee had to suspend dozens of lower level committees after violence erupted between

## Jamaat leader 'tells' war crimes investigators

Jamaat-e-Islami leader Abdul Quader Molla told the war crimes investigators yesterday that it was another Quader Molla, and not him, who committed the war crimes in 1971.

A member the investigation agency, however, said they have "enough evidence" to prove the Jamaat leader's involvement in the crimes against humanity and genocide during the Liberation War in capital's Mirpur.

"He [Quader] admitted that several heinous crimes
