War tribunal to get more clout

Bill on cards to plug loopholes

A process is underway to bring a significant change to the country's constitution so the legality of trials of war crime suspects, who were not part of any armed force or auxiliary force in 1971, cannot be challenged in any court.

The law ministry is drafting a constitutional amendment bill, including this

change, to be placed in the House in line with recommendations made by the parliamentary special committee, Law Minister Shafique Ahmed told The Daily Star on Saturday.

"If the specific change is brought to the constitution, the individuals who are now facing trials on charges of war crimes cannot challenge the legality of the trials.

Trial starts next month with two

The International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) is finally going to start next month the trial of detained Jamaat-e-Islami leader Delawar Hossain Sayeede and BNP leader Salauddin Quader Chowdhury who are facing charges of crimes against humanity, sources said.

The trial of four other detained Jamaat leaders will begin in phases from August on charges of committing similar crimes during the Liberation War in 1971, Law Minister Shafique Ahmed told journalists yesterday.

Acquitted in 14, 3 more to go

Ershad says it proves cases against him politically motivated

A Dhaka court yesterday acquitted former president and Jatiya Party Chairman HM Ershad in a money laundering case filed during the tenure of the BNP government in 1995.

With the latest verdict, Ershad, who stepped down as president on December 6, 1990, has been cleared in 14 of the 17 law suits against him.

He was acquitted of corruption charges in four cases in


More rice, urea import okayed

3 EU, German UK ministers due today

Tk 1 lakh cr gobbled up

Pro-BNP professionals want govt to apologise formally to small investors in stock market

Houses looted in broad daylight



Armed robbers looted around 255 tolas of gold ornaments, a licensed loaded revolver, six rounds of bullet and Tk 5 lakh in broad daylight from a flat in the city's New Eskaton yesterday.

Police said the robbers stormed a flat on the fifth floor of building-2 of Eastern Tower on New Eskaton Road around 1:10pm. Ekramul Kodor Bablu, owner of the flat, was not at home during the robbery.

A domestic help left the door open while going out to shop for groceries, Salma Sayed Polly, an assistant commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police Ramna zone, told The Daily Star.

A gang of five robbers stormed into the flat and held five family members at gunpoint, she said.
