Realtor fined, made to fill the area

The Department of Environment yesterday fined an owner of a private housing company Tk10.68 lakh for cutting a hill and destroying local ecology in Khadimpara area of Sylhet Sadar.

An enforcement team led by Muhammad Munir Chowdhury, director (enforcement) of DoE, penalised the Managing Director of Shalimar Housing Ltd, Md Alamgir Hossain and allowed him five days to fill the pond-like ditch he dug on top of the hill, noted a DoE release.

The team also made the company start filling up the ditch and plant 100 saplings of valuable timber trees around it within an hour.

Alamgir was kept handcuffed at the site for two hours during the drive, adds our Sylhet correspondent.

He made an undertaking to fill the ditch up by next Saturday and plant 100 more saplings and also committed not to cut hills in future.

The work of Padma Multipurpose Bridge is getting late as its lead financier World Bank has yet to give the nod on two key components of the project -- the main bridge construction and river training.

For WB approval, evaluation report on river training project was sent in December 2010 while the one on main bridge construction was placed in January this year.

Against the backdrop, the

Communications ministry yesterday sought Finance Minister AMA Muhith's cooperation to get the goahead.

In a letter, Communications Minister Syed Abul Hossain requested Muhith to talk with WB officials so that the bank makes no further delay.

The letter reads the WB did not approve the first report on prequalified bidders for the main bridge construction and river training although it was prepared following

the bank's guidelines.

Also, further delaying the project, the bank pressed for a Chinese firm, which was ultimately rejected by the government.

However, activities like land acquisition, compensating and rehabilitating the affected persons and socio-economic infrastructure development in the project areas are going on in full swing, it says.

Many students of Jhalakathi Government Boys' High School are skipping classes to stroll through the 80-stall handloom, textiles and cottage industry fair in Jhalakathi town.

Why not? The fair is being held on the premises of their own school under their noses.

The school authorities have let the organisers hold the fair despite a government ban on using school premises or playgrounds for exhibitions or commercial activities.

The education ministry imposed the restrictions a year ago after media reports that fairs held on school premises hamper academic activity.

The Jhalakathi fair has been organised by Meghalaya Tanti Samity of Dhaka in collaboration with Jhalakathi district administration and Jhalakathi Chamber of Commerce and Industries in spite of the ban. Local lawmaker and

CID seeks more time to complete probe

Even though the courts so far gave 22 months for the CID to finish further investigation into the August 21, 2004 grenade attack cases, the investigators yesterday asked for 10 more days.

Time for probe ends today.

On that day in 2004, grenades were hurled at an Awami League rally on Bangabandhu Avenue where now Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was present. The attack left 23 dead including Ivy Rahman, Awami League leader and wife of President Zillur Rahman. Two hundred

others including Hasina was injured.

Two cases were filed following the attack, one for killing 23 people and the other under Explosive Substances Act.

The Criminal Investigation

Department yesterday told two Dhaka courts that further investigations into the two cases were now at the final stages. CID's Special Superintendent of Police

Abdul Kahar Akhand, also the investigation officer (IO) of the cases, submitted two petitions yesterday seeking time extension. Judge Mohammad Zohurul Hoque of

SAHR worried at govt support for Rab action

The South Asians for Human Rights (SAHR) has expressed concern over government's continued statements defending the Rab shooting of college student Limon Hossain into disability.

"We believe such statements of advisers and ministers of the government only serve to provide continuing patronage and protection to Rab from the legal consequences of its extrajudicial and indiscriminate shooting at ordinary people of the country," a SAHR press release said yesterday.

It also mentioned people in the government repeatedly termed Limon a criminal without giving any evidence extracted through any "acceptable and credible" **SEE PAGE 6 COL 4**
