Health scare for Barrios

Paraguay striker Lucas Barrios was taken to hospital for emergency treatment for a gastro-intestinal problem Tuesday, national team doctor Aldo Martinez said after he had suffered from vomiting

overnight. "Barrios is under supervision but is not in any danger and in a private facility undergoing a series of tests. They have ruled out appendicitis - it is probably a virus," Martinez told reporters. He later indicated Barrios had been discharged after being checked over as a precaution. "He is fine. It was a normal bout of indigestion and nothing serious."

A new league champion was crowned Grameenphone yesterday as debutants Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club wrapped up the coveted title of professional champions in the last game of the season with a 2-2 draw against Brothers Union in their Grameenphone Bangladesh League

Stadium yesterday. The result meant that the star-studded Sheikh Jamal went out of reach with 51 points from their stipulated 22 matches,

four points clear of Muktijoddha Sangsad who have a match in hand against Farashganj MFS. Although they have no chance of an overhaul, the Reds are guaranteed to finish second after three-time champions Abahani lost to Sheikh Russel

It also meant that a new name will be etched in the history of professional football after Abahani had won all the previous editions of the Bangladesh League.

In the match yesterday, Nigerian Kingsley Chigozie put Brothers ahead in the 12th minute only to see his effort cancelled by Mohammad Sujan through a spot-kick in the 62nd minute. Cameroonian Sergio Fils Chico gave Sheikh Jamal a lead three minutes later through a header but yet again Brazilian Everton leveled the margin in the 74th minute through a spot kick.

And although the match ended on a draw it could not stop Sheikh Jamal from celebrating their maiden triumph in their first appearance in the professional football league, despite the fact that the Dhanmondi-based outfit has the displeasure of match-fixing allegations

hanging over them. From the off, Sheikh Jamal was under huge pressure of earning at least a single point against Brothers after they beat them 2-1 in the first leg and the pressure was evident when Sheikh Jamal went down in the 12th minute.

For the last three years it had been the case that Abahani would win the country's lone professional football competition -- the Bangladesh League. Let alone a debutant, a superpower like Mohammedan could not lift the coveted title in four years now. But this time around Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club, playing for the first time in the event, did the unthinkable, pushing the two most established clubs to sidelines.

Before the start of this fourth edition of the league, the renamed Dhanmondi Club made their arrival noticed by signing up 16 national players and roping in Serbian coaches Zoran Kraljedic and Berber Dabor, who guided them to the final of the season's curtainraising tournament Federation Cup before suffering a 5-3 defeat to Abahani despite taking the lead twice in the entertaining final.

But the club management sacked the Serbian coaches for their Federation Cup failure and a row over selection of the playing eleven before the start of the league.

Without a coach, Sheikh Jamal paid a high price, drawing twice and losing to Arambagh KS in their first four matches before Sri Lankan Packeer Ali was given the reins.

Packeer Ali, a familiar face in Dhaka football who played for the popular Abahani for a long time in the eighties, proved the right choice to handle the national stars and the man from Sri Lanka slowly but steadily took Sheikh Jamal to the top of the table; thanks to some slip ups by title contenders Muktijoddha Sangsad mid-way through the second leg.

First-class competitions in England and Australia are age-old, a part of the social calendar. For generations, the County Championship begins on the first week of April, come rain or shine (and sometimes snow).

It is hardly different in places like New Zealand, West Indies, South Africa and Zimbabwe while in the sub-continent, India's Ranji Trophy begins in November after the Quaid-e-Azam Trophy in Pakistan begins in October. And in rainy Sri Lanka, first-class cricket started in February last

season. Across the cricketing spectrum, first-class competitions get top priority in domestic cricket with their scheduling immaculate. Hardly would there be a change to the traditional October start to the Sheffield Shield but it is usually split

into two so that other competitions -- oneday and Twenty20 -- can be accommodated. But the heart of the domestic season is the first-class tournament.

The National Cricket League's scheduling over the past eleven years could best be described as a dog's breakfast.

The competition has began on October (2007-08, 2008-09, 2010-11), November (2000-01, 2005-06, 2006-07), December (2003-04, 2002-03, 2001-02), January (2009-10) and February (2004-05). On average, the league has taken up three months with large breaks in the middle to fit in the Premier

League or the NCL one-day competition. It shows that there has never been any consistency, hardly a tradition in place and worse, it is given the least priority.

The irregular schedules are popularly blamed on international cricket being played during that time and also on the lack of grounds. The latter issue is purely infrastructural and has not been solved by any of the previous cricket boards.

Domestic cricket is run smoothly in other Test-playing nations during international series there, but in Bangladesh, the practice has been quite unreasonable: when a foreign team tours, most of the domestic tournaments are shut off, depriving 95% of cricketers in the country.

Usually, the international matches are played in two venues (Dhaka and

Chittagong) while the others remain idle.

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) has tirelessly repeated, for the past decade, that due to unavailability of the national cricketers, the tournaments have little appeal and so they should only be held when the popular boys

are free. Simply put, when the national team plays, the ones who are supposed to form the second string are asked to sit and wait.

Interestingly, the current crop of national players has had little time for the NCL in the past three seasons. Shakib Al Hasan, Mahmudullah Riyad, Rokibul Hasan, Shafiul Islam and Rubel Hossain hasn't played a NCL longer version game since December 2008 while Tamim Iqbal's last NCL outing was on November 10, 2007.

Mushfiqur Rahim, Shafiul Islam, Junaed Siddiqui, Mahmudullah Riyad, Naeem Islam and Mohammad Ashraful turned up for this year's final after having played none of the

Tigers' safari stopover

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) is planning to send the national team to South Africa to play a four-day practice match as part of their preparation for the Zimbabwe tour in July-August.

BCB's technical committee in its meeting yesterday recommended the stopover in South Africa for a four-day practice match as they believed that it would help the Tigers get reacquainted with the longer form.

During the month-long tour, Shakib Al Hasan's men will play one Test and five one-day internationals against Zimbabwe, who will end their self-imposed Test exile with the match against the Tigers.

"The Bangladesh team is likely to go to South Africa on July 19 to play a four-day match against South Africa's High Performance unit players. The committee recommended the match as we believe it will be helpful for our players who will return to Test cricket after a long gap," said BCB's director and chairman of the technical committee Enayet Hossain Siraj after the meeting.

Siraj also informed that they are planning to arrange one four-day and three limited-over practice matches at home.

"The practice matches will be held between the national team and the Bangladesh A team. We will announce the 15member final squad for the Zimbabwe tour by the first week of the next month," said Siraj.

The national players are now doing their fitness training under the guidance of trainer Grant Luden, and they will go to Cox's Bazar on June 26 where the conditioning camp will finish on June 30. When asked who they have in mind to conduct the skill

training after the conditioning camp, Siraj said that they have decided to give Imran Sarwar the responsibility until the head coach is appointed. "Imran will do the job and we will also involve the other

coach and other supporting staffs in time," hoped Siraj. BCB is now waiting for confirmation from Australian Stuart Law, who is all set to become the Tigers new head coach if everything goes smoothly.
